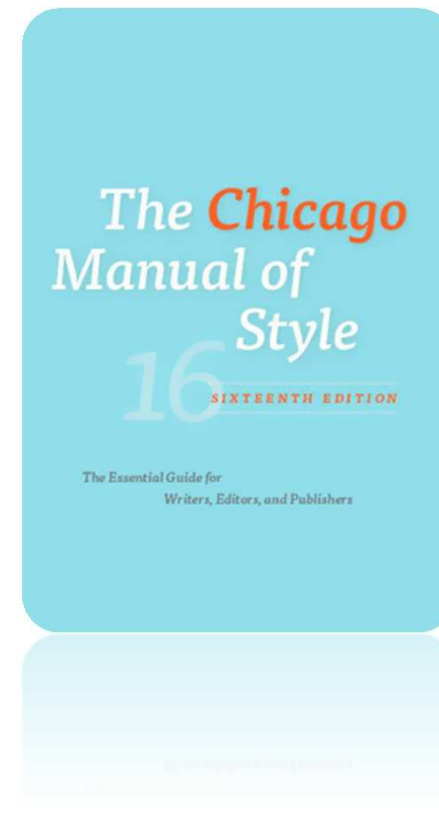
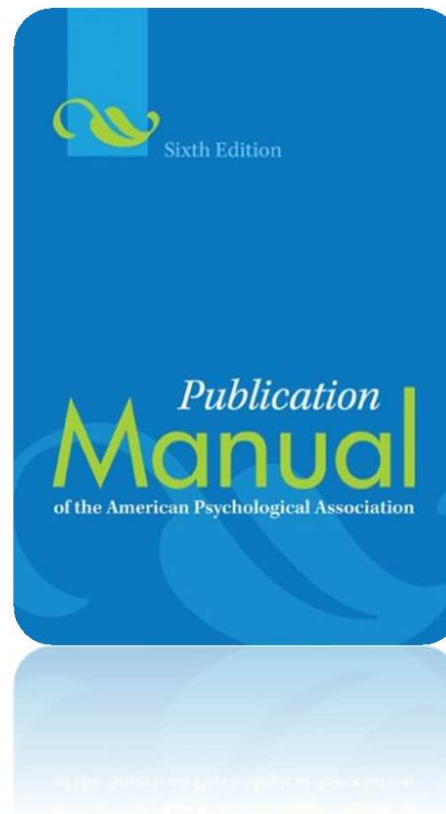

FORMATION OF CITATIONS WILL VARY DEPENDING ON YOUR DISCIPLINE:



ALL PROPER CITATIONS WILL INCLUDE THE SAME ELEMENTS:

Books will include:

- Author(s') Name
- Title of Book
- Place of Publication
- Publisher
- Date of Publication

Gienapp, W. E. (2002). *Abraham Lincoln and Civil War America: A biography*. New York: Oxford University Press.

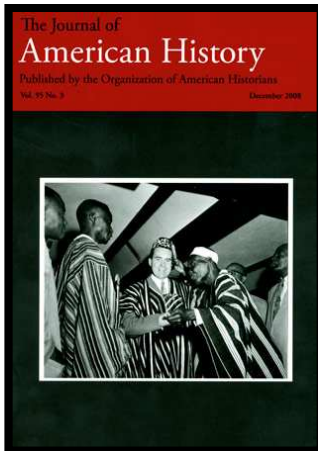
Example of MLA:

Gienapp, William E. *Abraham Lincoln and Civil War America: A Biography*. New York: Oxford University Press, 2002. Print.

ALL PROPER CITATIONS WILL INCLUDE THE SAME ELEMENTS (CONT.):

Articles will include:

- Author(s') Name
- Title of Article
- Publication Title
- Page Numbers
- Date of Publication
- Database Retrieval Info.

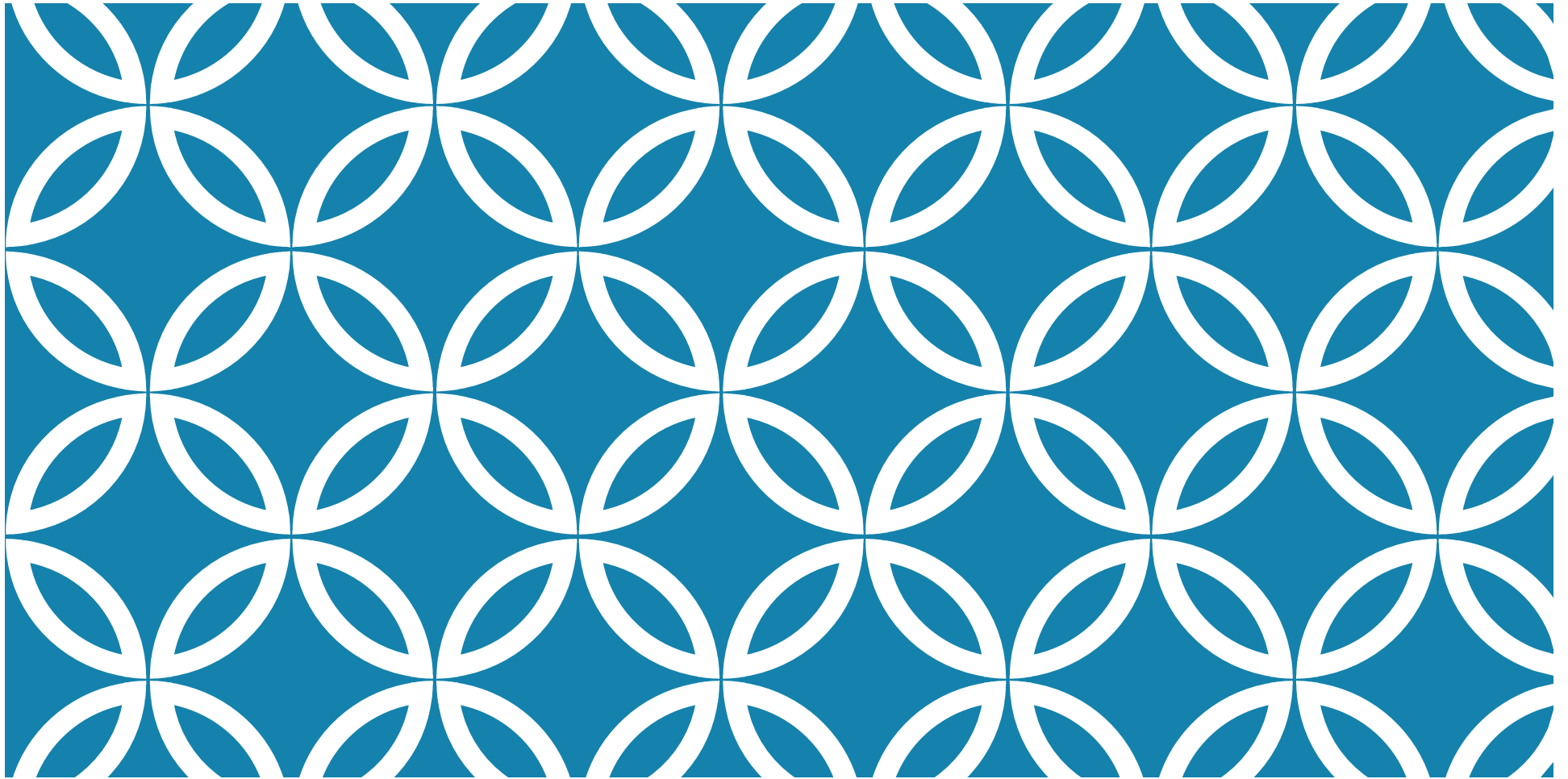
REMEMBER:

Looking at the citation page of an article or book is an excellent way to find sources for your OWN research (and save time!).

If you find a book from your list of citations, use the '**Looking for books**'* to see if we own the book. If we don't you can request it through Interlibrary Loan.

If you find an article from your list of citations, use '**Journal Finder**'* to see if we own the article. If we don't you can request it through Interlibrary Loan.
