CLASSICAL LANGUAGES MAJOR CHECKLIST

CLASSICS MAJOR (30 credits beyond elementary sequence)

At least half of the credits required for your major, excluding supporting courses, must be in CSB/SJU course work.

Required courses:

_____ Seven upper-division courses in:
Greek (for a Greek concentration) or
Latin (for a Latin concentration) or
A combination of the two (for a Classics concentration)

_____ LATN or GREK 399 (2)

The senior honors thesis 398 can be taken in place of 399 and may be one of the seven required courses. Of the seven courses, one may be in classical literature or civilization in translation or (with permission of department chair) in a related field.

Students are strongly encouraged to take two courses in a related field (such courses should be chosen to fulfill common curriculum requirements).

MAJOR IN CLASSICAL STUDIES (46 credits)

(See European Studies)

This major combines the study of language and literature, history, philosophy, and the fine arts for an interdisciplinary approach to classical antiquity. Ten courses plus a 4th semester of language plus the 2-credit capstone.

MINOR in LATIN or GREEK (12 credits beyond elementary sequence)

Required courses:

After completing the language proficiency sequence, three additional upper-division courses in the appropriate language.
