Biography:

Michelle Garvey graduated from CSB/SJU in 2003, with a degree in Philosophy; she received her MA in Women's Studies from San Diego State University in 2008; she is currently pursuing a doctorate in Gender, Women's, and Sexuality Studies at the University of Minnesota.

Michelle describes her research as follows:

"Waters, backpacking the Appalachian Trail, restoring lands and streams in Seattle and Minneapolis, working as an organic farm intern, and educating hundreds of children and families in topics from water conservation to camping skills, wildlife biology, trail building, and native planting--my research pivots on a desire to restore human-nonhuman relationships. I am interested in various weedy entanglements related to feminist environmentalisms: climate, food, and environmental justice, human-animal relationships, post human theory, queer ecologies, bio colonial history, ecological restoration, and artistic expressions of these perspectives."
