

MINNEAPOLIS COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL COL-

The College of Saint Benedict (CSB) and Saint John's University (SJU) welcome Minneapolis Community and Technical College transfer students. All courses from an official transcript will be evaluated to determine which of our Core Curriculum requirements they will fulfill.

Transferable courses are defined as *courses that are similar to a course offered at CSB/SJU, in which a grade of "C" or better was received, and that have a course number 1000 or above*. Note: A minimum of three semester credits is required to complete a CSB/SJU core curriculum requirement, with the exception of fine arts.

At least 45 of the 124 semester credits required for a degree must be earned from CSB/SJU. At least half of the credits required for the major, excluding supporting courses, must be earned from CSB/SJU.

Finally, it should be noted that this guide is designed as one tool to aid in your course selections for transferring to CSB/SJU. Listed below each of the CSB/SJU Core Curriculum requirements (bolded) are the **Minneapolis Community and Technical College** courses that fulfill that specific requirement.

FIRST YEAR SYMPOSIUM

Transfer credits need to be discussed with Academic Advising.

HUMANITIES

A course from two different disciplines with a minimum of three semester credits.

NATURAL SCIENCES

A course from two different science disciplines with a minimum of three semester credits—all courses must have labs.

A minimum of three semester credits is necessary to fulfill requirement.

A minimum of four semester credits is necessary to fulfill the requirement.

FOREIGN LANGUAGES

A student will have fulfilled the foreign language requirement if he/she has documented proficiency through the intermediate level or has taken courses through Intermediate 2000.

These courses may or may not fulfill major requirements. Major departments will determine what requirements may be fulfilled by transfer work.
