STEPS TO ENROLL FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

STEPS TO ENROLL

To confirm your intention to enroll and to initiate the registration process, please follow the instructions below:

ADVANCE ENROLLMENT DEPOSIT

Once you have made your final decision to enroll, we require a non-refundable advance deposit of \$500 U.S. dollars and a completed housing application form. The deposit should be sent to Roger Young, Director of International Admission, College of Saint Benedict/Saint John's University, Box 7155, Collegeville, MN 56321. The following methods of payment are acceptable: International money order, cashier's check, bank draft, Visa or Mastercard, or personal check. **DO NOT SEND CASH.** Checks should be made out to the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University. The payment will be credited to your student account for tuition. You may also pay the advance deposit online at: <https://www.csbsju.edu/admission/apply/onlineDeposit.aspx>.

PRIORITY DEADLINE

The National Association for Admission College Counseling (NACAC) requires U.S. colleges to "permit first-year candidates for fall admission to choose, without penalty, among offers of admission and financial aid until May 1." Because of strong interest in our colleges, we are unable to guarantee space for students seeking to enroll after this date. Students who seek to enroll after May 1 should be in contact with the Admission Office to determine the availability of space. Please contact the Admission Office if you have any questions.

FIRST TUITION PAYMENT

All new international students are required to submit the first tuition payment of \$2,500 U.S. dollars by June 1, 2009. This amount will be credited to your student account for tuition. Please follow the same method of payment instructions as mentioned in the Advance Enrollment Deposit section. The remaining amount due for tuition, fees, room and meals for the first semester will be due before your classes begin in August. *This payment may be made in person after you arrive.* NOTE: The tuition payment will be refunded if you are unable to enroll (i.e. student visa denial, extraordinary family or personal circumstances).

ADDITIONAL STEPS

OBTAINING YOUR U.S. STUDENT VISA

Consular Officers consider four basic areas to determine whether an applicant qualifies for a student visa. The applicant must:

1. Present evidence that the student has been accepted as a full-time student by a U.S. school authorized to accept international students.
2. Present evidence that the student has sufficient academic preparation for the proposed field of study.
3. Present evidence that the student has sufficient knowledge of English to complete the proposed course of study.
4. Present evidence that the student has adequate financial support to pursue studies without having to work in the U.S.

Each applicant should bring the following documents to the American Consulate to help establish that they qualify for a student visa:

1. Have a receipt in hand that the student has paid the \$100 SEVIS (Student and Exchange Visitor Information System) fee. See attached instructions on how to pay this fee.
2. A SEVIS I-20, "Certificate of Eligibility," issued by the academic institution the applicant wants to attend.
3. A complete nonimmigrant visa application form (DF-156) that is available free of charge at the U.S. Consulate.
4. One recent photograph, 3 cm. by 3 cm.
5. A passport valid to travel in the U.S.
6. The original of the applicant's TOEFL test score.
7. Evidence of means of financial support for at least the first year of study in the U.S. The applicant should bring both the originals and photocopies of all relevant financial documents.
8. Transcripts of the student's high school (and university, if applicable) records and examination results.

PHYSICAL EXAM AND OTHER HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

All incoming students need to complete a physical examination. The medical history and examination forms are included. The forms need to be completed prior to the beginning of classes and may be brought with you in August. Pay particular attention to the required immunization forms and the fact that Minnesota law is more stringent than most U.S. states. There is a health education office at CSB and a health center and pharmacy on the SJU campus staffed by medical professionals including a medical doctor (MD), a physician's assistant (PA), registered nurses (RNs) and physical therapists. Students from CSB and SJU may use the SJU Health Center and pharmacy. A major regional hospital is located 10 miles from the campuses in St. Cloud.

RESIDENTIAL OPTIONS

Please review the enclosed housing application form. REMINDER: The housing application form is to be completed only if you have submitted the advance enrollment deposit of \$500. You may mail it to Roger Young or fax it to 320-363-3206. Residence hall assignments and roommates will be determined in June.

FINAL OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT
