

Core Curriculum Requirements

Cross-Disciplinary Requirements

- **First-Year Symposium:** (2 courses) sequential courses designed to help students develop skills in thinking, speaking and writing.
- **Senior Seminar:** (1 course) junior/senior level course designed to develop the ability make good moral judgments.

Disciplinary Requirements

- **Fine Arts (FA):** (4 credits) Art, Music, Theater
- **First-Year Fine Arts Experience:** (no credit) attendance at a total of 8 designated Fine Arts events.
- **Humanities:** (5 courses total)
 - 3 courses in lower-division:**
 - **Theology 180 (TH)** (1 course)
 - **HML** (2 courses) Communication, History, Philosophy or Literature – in any language or in translation. No more than one course from any one discipline
 - 2 courses in upper-division:**
 - **HMU** (1 course) Communication, History, Philosophy, Theology or Literature--in any language or in translation. Must be from the same discipline as one of the courses selected in lower division (TH or HML)
 - **Judeo-Christian Heritage (JC)** (1 course)
(Prerequisite: 1 HML and 1 TH course as listed above.)
- **Mathematics (MT)** (1 course)
(Prerequisite: Math proficiency-see below)
- **Natural Sciences (NS):** (2 courses) Astronomy, Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Environmental Studies, Geology, Nutrition, Physics. (Courses may not be taken from same discipline. Exception - Courses designated “interdisciplinary”, i.e. COLG, ENVR or GEOL)
- **Social Sciences:** (2 courses) Communication, Courses of the College, Economics, Education, Management, Peace Studies, Political Science, Psychology, Social Work, Sociology
 - Lower-division (SSL)** (1 course)
 - Upper-division (SSU)** (1 course) (Prerequisite: 1 SSL course--any department)

Proficiency Based Requirements

- **Foreign Language Proficiency:** successful completion of a FL 211 course or higher
- **Mathematics Proficiency:** Math proficiency is determined by the results of the ACT/SAT Math scores or the CSB/SJU Math Proficiency Exam. Math Proficiency is a prerequisite to registering for any course which will fulfill the math disciplinary requirement and for any course bearing the quantitative reasoning flag.

Flagged Courses

- **Gender Perspectives** (1 flag)
- **Global Perspectives** (1 flag)
- **Quantitative Reasoning** (1 flag) (Prerequisite: Math proficiency)

- 40 Upper-Division Credits
- Minimum 2.0 Cumulative GPA*
- Minimum 2.0 Major and Supporting Courses GPA*
*Unless major requires higher GPA
