Discussion:

Senator Kohout: You [SBS] had a meeting after our meeting so you are probably updated. I will be glad to answer any questions at this time.

VP Bina: When was it decided to have your meetings every other week?

Senator Kohout: We decided during a meeting at the retreat, and changed our standing rules. The SJS President retains the right to add meetings on the 'off weeks' if important issues arise.

Trustee McKinney: What was the rationale behind doing that?

Senator Kohout: Advisor Connelly is in favor of our decision. By doing this we have more time to go back to our boards and committees in between meetings.

Senator Stoll: One of the goals is to get more accomplished in meeting. When we had meetings weekly, they tended to be inefficient. We tried the biweekly schedule last year and it worked very well. At times, we did schedule extra meetings, so we still have Monday nights reserved if needed.

PR Rep Hoeschen: If a meeting is called on the 'off week,' when will students be informed of that meeting?

Senator Kohout: An extra meeting must be called 48 hours in advance.

Senator Stoll: Is there a general displeasure with this decision we could address?

Trustee McKinney: Yes, we have had trouble in the past with collaborative activities such as the co-funding board. We assumed at the end of the year that the biweekly schedule would be discontinued. We were shocked that you are doing this again. It became an inconvenience for us last year when your meeting schedule conflicted with our schedule. I would encourage you to communicate so this does not occur again.

Senator Kohout: (to Senator Stoll) Isn't the Activities and Allocations Board (AAB) the only one who votes on these issues?

Senator Stoll: I assume you are referring to the Record appeals last year. These are special situations that we address. Situations that require dual funding are difficult because only the SJS AAB votes whereas all of you [SBS] vote. This year, all senators will keep their schedules open on Monday nights if extra meetings are necessary. I will speak for myself in saying that I was also frustrated about not being on the same page about funding last year. We understand your concern.

Trustee McKinney: Thank you – I just want to encourage communication on these issues. Since you have changed your bylaws, please make sure that the SBS has been thoroughly communicated to in these issues.

S. Comments or Questions

Discussion:

Senator Heim: I have been in contact with Mike from transportation. The multicultural bus stop shelter is here but not assembled. I didn't get a timeline of when it would be put together, just "hopefully before it gets real cold out." This is not in my board report because I just found out a couple hours ago.

Trustee McKinney: Thank you for being so dedicated to this issue after months of hard work.

VP Bina: Coming from purely a Parliamentary Procedural standpoint, in the future we must limit questions to two for the SJS. More questions can be addressed during the Comments/Questions discussion.

IV. Standing Committee Updates

A. Collegiate Readership Committee (Christenson)

Discussion:

Treasurer Christenson: I met on Monday night with Senators Andreasen, Arndt, and three SJS Senators to formulate survey questions. We are working on getting that survey out on Thursday...? (looks to Senator Arndt)

Senator Arndt: We actually don't have a date set right now, as we are looking for feedback from professors to make sure questions are not biased. We are holding a meeting after this to discuss details.

Senator Gresback: What will be done with these questions?

Treasurer Christenson: We will send the survey through email with an incentive of a bookstore gift card to complete it. Through this, we will find out what the general attitude is – for example, how much of their [CSB students] activity fees do they want to spend?

PR Rep Hoeschen: Do you have an idea of the timeline when this would start, or not start?

Treasurer Christenson: We have no specific date at this time.

Senator Andreasen: We definitely want to get this going as soon as possible. Someone from the St. Cloud times may be coming in tonight to discuss the program with us. Questions on the survey include preferences about what types of newspapers they would like. Thank you to Senator Arndt for your hard work as well.

Advisor Arthur: Have you thought about surveying faculty to see how many of them require newspapers to be available in their classes? There might be faculty support for the program.

VP Bina: I encourage you to get a timeline going, and I would like the Senate to be able to see the survey once it is formulated.

Senator Andreasen: In response to Advisor Arthur's question, we did talk about that. My professor requires the NY Times, for example. We will definitely talk about that more tonight.

E. Discussion on Bennie Day Budget (Gresback)

Senator Gresback: In front of you is a comparison between what was spent on Bennie Day last year and tentative spending for this year. We will still do the pancake breakfast. As far as prizes, we are thinking about having a larger amount of smaller prizes instead of last year's smaller number of big prizes. We are also discussing the snocone and cotton candy machines. I am looking for feedback – should we reuse the glow in dark cups left over from a first-year event for the snocone machine? We have enough leftover to supply our needs. Would it be wise to have both cotton candy and snocones? We would be providing them during the Heritage Day

lunch on the Mall. The snocone is more 'iffy' depending on the weather. I am welcome to feedback on any of these things.

Senator Heim: Do we still need to supply kool-aid this year?

Senator Gresback: I talked to Marcia Hilbert about using their machine this year.

Senator Andreasen: What is the Michelle Kendrick gift card?

Senator Gresback: It is for a spa/salon in St. Joseph.

Senator McEachrane: I am looking at North Face fleece prize. I feel that it is a bit expensive and promoting a certain brand. Could we consider something that promotes Bennie pride, such as a customized one with St. Ben's references?

Senator Gresback: I see where you are coming from. If you would be interested in taking on that project, you are welcome to do so.

Senator McEachrane: I would like to.

Senator Wang: I think it would be a good idea to put Senate stickers on all the prizes we give away. I think that smaller prizes would allow for more even distribution, but a couple of large items may attract more people to the events.

Senator Gresback: Yes, this is the reason for the discussion. We wanted to make the prizes more unique, because many organizations on campus give away the typical large prizes like iPods.

Senator Andreasen: I think this would be great for senate buzz and visibility. If we have smaller prizes, we will reach more students.

Advisor Terhaar: I think it would be great to incorporate elements of CSB, for example – a fleece from the bookstore as a prize. Also, Heritage Day is very intentionally planned. Have you discussed these lunch activities with those who are planning the day's schedule?

Senator Gresback: Yes, I met with Exec. Chef Paul and Carmen Welinski about what they are planning for lunch. They will have Special K bars for dessert and we can have our table next to that. I am also meeting tomorrow with Jodie Peschl to settle that out.

Senator Andreasen: Thank you for your hard work.

VP Bina: To summarize, it seems as though we like the smaller prizes and wider reach toward students. Thank you.

Senator Gresback: Next week I will be bringing the budget to our meeting for approval. I will have sign-up sheets for helping with our Heritage Day activities, as we will need everyone to be involved. Also, if you have digital cameras you would be willing to take pictures with during Bennie Day, please let me know.

F. Motion to fund \$50 for a gift card for the Collegiate Readership Committee (Christenson)

Motion (Christenson) Second (Arndt)

Treasurer Christenson: We are requesting a bookstore gift card for students as an incentive for completed the Collegiate Readership survey. SJS is funding \$50 as well. We haven't decided if there will be one \$100 prize or two \$50 prizes.

Senator Grimes: How will the winner be decided – randomly?

Senator Arndt: I can get a summary of the information collected. We could take their banner numbers or names and randomly pick one for the gift card.
