## Preface

The *Institutional Profile* is the official fact book for the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University. It was created to provide a multi-year snapshot and briefing of key data and trends related to admission and enrollment, academic activity and productivity, and human and financial resources. The *Profile* is intended to address questions frequently asked about the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University and provides in one compendium macro-level data for planning, decision-making, fund-raising and communication.

Information in the *Institutional Profile* is presented in six chapters: admission and new entering student data, undergraduate student data, academic and instructional data, alumni data, financial and human resource data, and private college comparison data. In most cases, information is presented for multiple years, typically in five- or ten-year increments. ## **Admission and New Entering Student Profile Trend Summary**

### **Admission Activity**

Applications for admission hit a record high at both the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University in fall 2006. Still, the increase in applications was only 1% over fall 2005. In total, Minnesota's private colleges experienced a 4% increase in the number of applications between 2005 and 2006.

The combined acceptance rate for both the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University was 86% in fall 2006. This rate has varied little from year to year.

Yield rates measure the percentage of students accepted for admission who subsequently enroll. They are a key indicator of admission productivity. In fall 2006, 47% of all students accepted for admission at CSB/SJU enrolled as new entering students. Though yield rates have gradually declined at both the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University – largely a function of the colleges' increasing selectivity – they still significantly exceed the average for all of Minnesota's private colleges. The average yield rate at Minnesota's private colleges in 2006 was 37%.

### **New Entering Student Characteristics**

New entering students make up about one-quarter of all undergraduate students at the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University. In fall 2006, the colleges together enrolled 1,046 new students, the largest new entering class in the institutions' history. Saint Benedict enrolled 11% of young women entering Minnesota private colleges while Saint John's enrolled 13% of men entering Minnesota private colleges. Both CSB and SJU are among the top private colleges in the state in the number of new entering students enrolled.

The academic quality of new CSB/SJU students has improved significantly in the last decade. The typical new student in fall 2006 graduated from high school in the top 25% of his or her high school class, had a cumulative high school grade point average of at least 3.6, and had a composite ACT score of 25 – each significantly higher than ten years ago. The average ACT score places new Saint Benedict and Saint John's students among the top 20% of all test-takers nationally.

Though still predominantly Catholic, the percentage of new students who report being Roman Catholic has declined significantly over the last decade. In fall 2006, less than two-thirds of all new students identified themselves as Catholic, compared to three-quarters of students in fall 1996. A large percentage of students also report a prior family connection to one or both colleges. In fall 2006, about 45% of all new students indicated that another family member – most often a parent or sibling – attended either CSB or SJU, up from 35% in fall 1996.

Sixty-two new entering American students of color enrolled at CSB/SJU this fall, compared to 53 new students in fall 2005. Since fall 2001, enrollment of new entering students of color has increased by 55 percent.

The College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University enrolled new students from 32 states and 17 foreign countries this fall. Students from Minnesota make up 80% of all new first-year students – the lower proportion in history. Almost half of all Minnesota students came from the seven-county Twin Cities metropolitan area.

## **Undergraduate Student Profile Trend Summary**

### **Enrollment Trends**

The College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University together enrolled 3,913 first-year to senior students in fall 2006, the largest combined enrollment in the colleges' history. The mix of women and men generally has stayed within the range of 52%/48% in the last decade. Saint Benedict and Saint John's together have a closer gender balance than most private colleges in the state. In fall 2006, men made up just 40% of total undergraduate private college enrollment in Minnesota. The enrollment gap between men and women at private colleges has been growing for more than a decade.

Total undergraduate enrollment has risen by 9% at CSB/SJU since fall 1996. The colleges' combined private college market share – approximately 10% – has been stable for nearly a decade. In fall 2006, the College of Saint Benedict enrolled over 8% of all female private college students in the state, while Saint John's University enrolled nearly 12% of all private college men.

### **Enrollment Profile**

In fall 2006, the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University enrolled students from 42 states and 38 countries. International students made up 4.3% of all undergraduates – the highest percentage ever. In fall 2006, Saint Benedict and Saint John's enrolled fully 1 in 7 international private college students in the state.

American students of color comprised 4.8% of all CSB and SJU undergraduates in fall 2006. The colleges enrolled 188 American students of color, the highest number ever. In the last two years, CSB has enrolled a larger percentage of American students of color than SJU.

First-year and second-year students at the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University are required to live on-campus. Each year, approximately three-quarters of all undergraduates live in college residence halls or apartments. An additional 5% to 7% live in campus-sponsored housing while studying abroad. In fall 2006, 98% of all available housing spaces on both campuses were fully occupied. The percentage of students living on-campus at CSB/SJU is significantly higher than the Minnesota private college average.

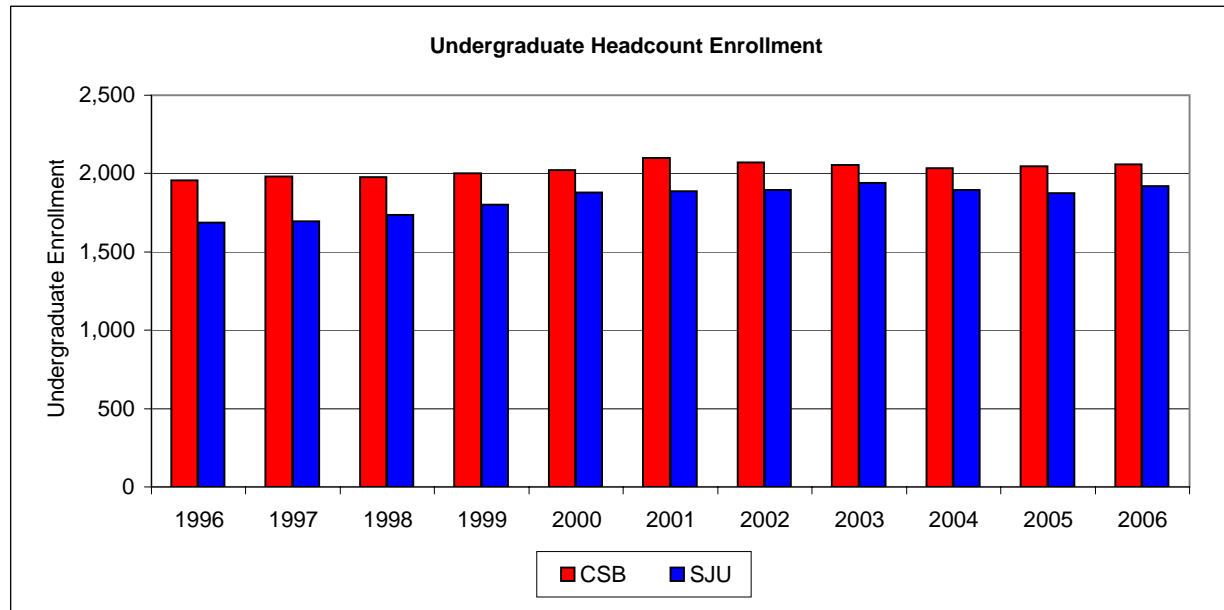

## Academic and Instructional Profile Trend Summary

### Student Academic Profile

The College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University together offer 37 major and 32 minor programs of study. The five largest major programs of study at CSB/SJU – which in fall 2006 were Management, Biology, Communication, Psychology and Nursing – represented over 43% of all majors at the institutions. The composition of the largest five majors has changed little since 1996, with only Communication and Elementary Education trading positions. There are, however, significant differences by gender. Saint John's students are fully three times as likely as Saint Benedict students to major in Management or Accounting and are more likely to major in a science or math field (excluding health sciences). CSB students are significantly more likely than SJU students to major in a health science discipline, Elementary Education, Psychology, or Communication. In general, women and men attending CSB and SJU make academic choices similar to their female and male peers at other private colleges in Minnesota.

### Persistence and Completion

First to second year retention rates at both the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University consistently have approached or exceeded 90% since the mid-1990s. In fall 2006, 90% of the 2005 new entering class returned at both institutions. Retention rates at CSB and SJU significantly exceed both local and national averages for private and public colleges. Completion rates have risen as retention rates have improved. Four-year completion rates at CSB and SJU significantly exceed averages for private and public colleges regionally and nationally. The average four-year completion rate for College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University students is 71%; the average at liberal arts colleges nationally is 50%.

In 2005-2006, the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University awarded 836 baccalaureate degrees. Together, CSB and SJU conferred 10% of all baccalaureate degrees awarded by Minnesota's private colleges.

### Study Abroad

The College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University are ranked second in the nation for the number of students who study abroad. Over 350 students studied abroad on one of the 17 faculty-led semester-long trips last year. In all, sixty-two percent of the 2003 cohort at CSB and 59% of the 2003 cohort at SJU studied abroad.

### Instruction and Faculty Profile

Student-to-faculty ratios at CSB/SJU consistently have averaged between 12 to 1 and 13 to 1 for the past five years. In fall 2006, the median class size for all 2 and 4 credit courses was 22. Overall median class size has changed little in the last decade. More than 85% of all courses enroll 30 students or fewer. In fall 2006, about a quarter of all 2 and 4 credit courses at Saint Benedict and Saint John's enrolled 10 or fewer students or more than 30 students.

There are 358 faculty members teaching at the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University in fall 2006. Approximately 85% of all faculty are full-time, significantly higher than the average for all of Minnesota's private colleges (just 58% in fall 2005). The average faculty member at CSB/SJU has worked at the colleges for 15 years. The median age for the faculty in fall 2005 was 49. Approximately 37% were under age 45 and 8% were older than age 64. A rising percentage of full-time faculty at CSB/SJU hold the rank of professor. In fall 2006, 28% of all full-time faculty held the rank of professor, up from 25% in 2001-02. Professors and Associate Professors make up a larger share of full-time faculty at CSB/SJU than at Minnesota's private colleges as a group. Nearly 80% of all full-time faculty at the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University are tenured or in tenure-track positions.

## **Alumnae and Alumni Profile Summary**

The College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University together have nearly 42,000 alumni – 19,000 at CSB and 23,000 at SJU. Saint Benedict alumnae are comparatively young. Nearly three-quarters of all CSB alumnae have graduated since 1980, compared to less than two-thirds of all alumni at Saint John's.

Though more than 8 in 10 CSB and SJU students come from Minnesota, a large percentage pursue opportunities outside of the state after graduation. As of December 2006, 37% of all CSB alumnae and 40% of all SJU alumni lived outside of Minnesota. The highest alumni concentrations outside of Minnesota were in Wisconsin, California, and Illinois. About 2% of alumni live outside of the United States.

Twenty percent of CSB alumnae and nearly 30% of SJU alumni are known to have completed a graduate or professional degree. Master's degrees make up approximately 80% of all advanced degrees earned by CSB alumnae and 55% of all advanced degrees earned by SJU alumni. Almost 20% of all SJU graduates with an advanced degree hold a law degree. As student degree aspirations rise, and as the labor market continues to reward those who have pursued education beyond the baccalaureate degree, the number of graduates who report earning an advanced degree should rise. Approximately 80% of all 2006-07 seniors at the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University indicate that they expect to eventually earn a graduate or professional degree.

Occupational choices vary significantly among men and women. Nearly one-quarter of all CSB alumnae with known occupations work in education-related jobs, compared to just 12% of all SJU alumni. Women also are more likely than men to work in health-related professions. Fully one in four Saint John's graduates are employed in business-related fields, compared to about 18% of all Saint Benedict graduates. SJU graduates are four times more likely than CSB graduates to work in a legal occupation. In total, 55% of CSB and SJU graduates work in three broad occupational clusters: business (23%), education (17%) and healthcare (15%).

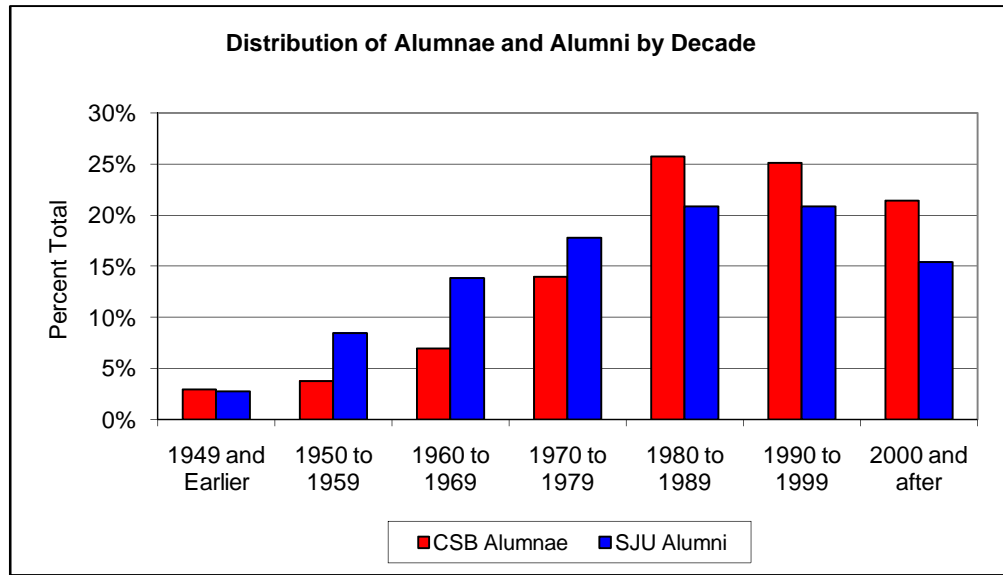

## **Financial Profile Trend Summary**

### **Cost of Attendance and Financial Aid**

Tuition and fees at CSB/SJU are nearly identical to the average for all of Minnesota's private colleges. Tuition at Saint Benedict and Saint John's has risen faster than the average for all of Minnesota's private colleges in the last ten years. Since 1996-97, tuition and fees (before financial aid) at CSB/SJU have risen by 78%, compared to a total private college average of 73%. Average annual room and board charges at Saint Benedict and Saint John's typically have exceeded the Minnesota private college average by between \$100 and \$500.

In 2006-07, nearly three-quarters of all CSB and SJU students applied for need-based financial aid. Fully one-third applied for merit-based scholarships. The number of students applying for need-based aid has declined at both CSB and SJU since the mid-1990s, a reflection of a rising family income profile. In the last decade, the number of students seeking merit-only scholarships has doubled, similar to the trend at private colleges regionally and nationally. The average ability-to-pay of those seeking need-based financial assistance has more than doubled at both the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University in the last ten years. Nonetheless, in 2006-07, the average student seeking need-based financial aid was able to pay only 41% of the total cost of attendance (inclusive of tuition, fees, room, board, and expenses) at CSB and 45% of the total cost of attendance at SJU.

In 2006-07, CSB/SJU students received nearly \$75 million in financial aid, including grants, loans, and work-study. Total financial aid awarded has more than doubled since 1996-97. Institutionally-awarded grant aid is the single largest source of assistance for Saint Benedict and Saint John's students, totaling \$41 million in 2006-07 and representing more than half of all financial aid awarded. Ten years earlier, institutional grants comprised only 39% of all aid received by Saint Benedict and Saint John's students. Together, institutional grants and student loans account for 85% of all financial aid awarded to CSB and SJU students.

### **Revenues and Expenditures**

In fiscal year 2006, combined E&G operating expenses at the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University (College of Arts and Sciences) totaled nearly \$80 million. Nearly two-thirds of all expenditures were for activities related to academic instruction. Similarly, compensation expenditures – inclusive of employee compensation and student wages – made up about two-thirds of all operating expenditures in FY 2006.

Like most other private colleges, Saint Benedict and Saint John's receive the majority of their operating income from student tuition. Tuition typically represents about 70% of budgeted operating income each year. Even though financial aid spending has increased significantly, both CSB and SJU have experienced substantial increases in net tuition revenue in the last decade. Between FY 1997 and FY 2006, total net tuition revenue per student at the colleges grew by 59%.
