

# ANOKA-RAMSEY COMMUNITY COLLEGE

**T**he College of Saint Benedict (CSB) and Saint John's University (SJU) welcome Anoka-Ramsey Community College transfer students. All courses from an official transcript will be evaluated to determine which of our Core Curriculum requirements they will fulfill.

Transferable courses are defined as *courses that are similar to a course offered at CSB/SJU, in which a grade of "C" or better was received, and that have a course number 1000 or above*. Note: A minimum of three semester credits is required to complete a CSB/SJU core curriculum requirement, with the exception of fine arts.

At least 45 of the 124 semester credits required for a degree must be earned from CSB/SJU. At least half of the credits required for the major, excluding supporting courses, must be earned from CSB/SJU.

Finally, it should be noted that this guide is designed as one tool to aid in your course selections for transferring to CSB/SJU. Listed below each of the CSB/SJU Core Curriculum requirements (bolded) are the **Anoka-Ramsey Community College** courses that fulfill that specific requirement.

## **FIRST YEAR SYMPOSIUM**

Transfer credits need to be discussed with Academic Advising.

## **HUMANITIES**

A course from two different disciplines with a minimum of three semester credits per course.

ENGL: All courses except 1102, 1104, 1121, 2241, 2261, 2299  
HIST: 1101—2262  
HUM: 1141, 1151, 1161, 2231, 2232, 2233, 2234, 2241, 2251, 2261, 2271  
PHIL: 1101, 1105, 1110  
SPAN: 2221  
WOST: 2242

## **MATH (one course)**

MATH: 1100, 1110, 1111, 1300, 1310, 1400, 1401, 2100, 2200, 2201, 2210, 2220, 2230 (1200, 1201, 1210 will fulfill proficiency requirement but not the math course requirement)  
(1120 will fulfill requirement for elementary education majors)

## **NATURAL SCIENCES**

A course from two different science disciplines with a minimum of three semester credits—all courses must have labs.

BIOL: All courses except 1100, 1108, 1110, 1140, 1171, 2299, (BIOL 1103 must be taken with the lab, BIOL 2202 must be taken with 2203)  
CHEM: All courses except 2299  
NATS: 1003, 1005, 1007  
PHYS: All courses except 2299 w/appropriate labs

**SOCIAL SCIENCES**

A minimum of three semester credits is necessary to fulfill requirement.

ECON: 2205, 2206

GEOG: 1101

POLS: 1111, 1121, 1131, 2202, 2245

PSYC: 1110, 2215, 2225, 2260, 2270

**FINE ARTS**

A minimum of four semester credits is necessary to fulfill the requirement.

ART: All courses except 2299

HUM: 1103

MUSC: All courses except 2299

THEA: All courses

**FOREIGN LANGUAGES**

A student will have fulfilled the foreign language requirement if he/she has documented proficiency through the intermediate level or has taken courses through the Intermediate 2201.

**ADDITIONAL COURSES ACCEPTED FOR ELECTIVE CREDIT**

These courses may or may not fulfill major requirements. Major departments will determine what requirements may be fulfilled by transfer work.
