

ROCHESTER COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL COLLEGE

The College of Saint Benedict (CSB) and Saint John's University (SJU) welcome Rochester Community and Technical College transfer students. All courses from an official transcript will be evaluated to determine which of our Core Curriculum requirements they will fulfill.

Transferable courses are defined as *courses that are similar to a course offered at CSB/SJU, in which a grade of "C" or better was received, and that have a course number 1000 or above*. Note: A minimum of three semester credits is required to complete a CSB/SJU core curriculum requirement, with the exception of fine arts.

At least 45 of the 124 semester credits required for a degree must be earned from CSB/SJU. At least half of the credits required for the major, excluding supporting courses, must be earned from CSB/SJU.

Finally, it should be noted that this guide is designed as one tool to aid in your course selections for transferring to CSB/SJU. Listed below each of the CSB/SJU Core Curriculum requirements (bolded) are the **Rochester Community and Technical College** courses that fulfill that specific requirement.

FIRST YEAR SYMPOSIUM

Transfer credits need to be discussed with Academic Advising.

HUMANITIES

A course from two different disciplines with a minimum of three semester credits.

ENGL: 1121, 2273, 2274 or 2275, 2276, 2277 (if taken w/another course), 2297

HIST: 1611, 1612, 1613, 1614, 1615, 1622, 1624, 1625, 1628, 1631, 1640, 2621

HUM: 1111, 1112, 1114, 1131

PHIL: 1114, 1125, 1145, 2971, 2972

MATH (one course)

MATH: 1111, 1112, 1127, 1128, 2208, 2218, 2237, 2238

(1115, 1117, 1119 will fulfill proficiency requirement but not the math course requirement)

NATURAL SCIENCES

A course from two different science disciplines with a minimum of three semester credits—all courses must have labs.

BIOL: All courses except 1107, 1112

CHEM: 1100—1128, 2127, 2128

ESCI: 1101, 1114, 1124, 1134, 1144

PHYS: 1101, 1117, 1118, 1127, 1128, 2227

SOCIAL SCIENCES

A minimum of three semester credits is necessary to fulfill requirement.

ANTH: 1611, 1612
ECON: 1101, 1901, 2214, 2215
GEOG: 1614, 1615
POLS: 1617 and 1618 together
PSYC: 2611, 2618, 2626
SOC: 1612, 1614, 1914, 1616, 2612, 2625

FINE ARTS

A minimum of four semester credits is necessary to fulfill the requirement.

ART: All courses except 1124, 1130, 1131, 2224, 2230, 2292
HUM: 1103
JOUR: 1111, 2211
MUSC: All courses except 1601, 1602, 1621, 1622
SPCH: 1121, 1134, 1135

FOREIGN LANGUAGES

A student will have fulfilled the foreign language requirement if he/she has documented proficiency through the intermediate level or has taken courses through Intermediate 2101.

ADDITIONAL COURSES ACCEPTED FOR ELECTIVE CREDIT

These courses may or may not fulfill major requirements. Major departments will determine what requirements may be fulfilled by transfer work.
