Course Descriptions: (Additions & corrections)

ART 208-01A: Non-Western Art Survey (FA): Art of India

Instructor: Marsh Olson

This course examines the art of India from the Indus Valley Civilization to the present day. Through a variety of media, including sculpture, architecture, and painting, the class will gain an understanding of the broad themes and concepts that run throughout Indian art. Part of this includes an understanding of the role that religion plays. Thus, a basic comprehension of Buddhism, Hinduism, and Islam, will be attained. The structure of the class will include slide lectures and discussion.

COMM 383-01A: Special Topic: A Survey of Documentary Film: TRUTH IS STRANGER THAN FICTION

Instructor: Lu Lippold

What's the difference between fiction films and non-fiction films? Do documentaries represent "reality?" What choices do documentarists make when they approach a topic? What narrative and stylistic strategies do they use? What social, cultural, and political functions have documentaries served over time? Through the examination of different types of documentary films, this course will introduce students to the history and the theory of documentary film practice. We'll watch some of the most widely acclaimed documentaries of all time, as well as some that are obscure and eccentric. **Note that this course is not a course on documentary film production. The work done by students will involve analyses of different documentaries as opposed to actual film production.**
