## Course Descriptions:

### THEA 204-01A: The Theatrical Experience

*Instructor: Mark Hennigs*

The Theatrical Experience is a two credit option similar to Theater Audience. The class is designed to acquaint the general student with live theater as a meaningful and enjoyable event. The students will learn by lecture, group discussions and attendance at live theatrical performances. A student will not be allowed to repeat this course for credit nor will the student be allowed to have credit for both THEA 200 and THEA 204.
