COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

GWST 270-02A Course Description, Fall 2008

Ozzie Mayers & Jean Keller

The Gender and Women's Studies (GWST) program and the Professor of Gender Education and Development are pleased to announce the Readings in Gender and Women's Studies course (GWST 270-02A) for fall 2008. Participants will discuss *Does Feminism Discriminate Against Men?*, the new book by Professor Jim Sterba (University of Notre Dame, Philosophy) and Warren Farrell (Researcher and International Speaker on Men's Issues) in conjunction with Sterba and Farrell's Gender Conversation at CSB on October 22, 2008 at 7:00 p.m. (Alumnae Hall, HCC).

The Readings course is open to all CSB|SJU students who are interested in the topic and will be facilitated by Professor Jean Keller (Philosophy) and Ozzie Mayers (English and Professor of Gender Education and Development). Students may take the course for 0 or 1 credit, and enrollment is on a first come, first serve basis. Copies of the book will be provided for participants.

The course will involve the following:

- reading the Sterba and Farrell book;
- attending the three book discussions listed below;
- attending the Gender Conversation on October 22;
- participating in a discussion with Professors Sterba and Farrell.

Sterba and Farrell's October 22nd conversation will focus not only on several topics addressed in the book, but also on how to engage in controversial conversations. Specifically, they will address how this project changed their own thinking about feminism and gender issues and what they learned from the dialog with each other. As Farrell states in his introduction, "The real job of this 'debate' book, then, is not to teach debate, but to teach listening. Debate training is divorce training. Training to listen is training to love, especially if that listening is with empathy" (5). The authors will also offer suggestions for raising gender awareness and working for gender equality.

If you are interested in participating in the course, please register for GWST 270 section 02A for the desired number of credits (0 or 1). To earn one credit, you must attend 1-2 additional meetings with one of the facilitators and complete a cumulative project (e.g., paper) as determined by the facilitators.

A performing ensemble open to men and women which sings Gregorian Chant (and some English chant) at liturgies of St. John's Abbey and other liturgies on the two campuses. Spring 2009 the schola will have longer rehearsals (90 min and 60 min per week) in preparation for the appearance at a chant festival in Belgium. This trip to Paris, Bruges, and Watou, May 17-25, 2009, will cost **\$1,000** including travel, room, and board. Preference for acceptance in Fall semester will be given to singers who are able to participate the entire year including the Paris-Belgium trip. If there are enough strong women's voices, it will be a mixed schola (which is the goal); if not, it will be for men's voices only. THEA 218-01A: Culture & Dramatic Literature: Latino & Hispanic Plays

In this course students will read and discuss classic, modern or contemporary plays from a specific culture or genre. The topics will vary from semester to semester. Class size is limited to 12 students. Fall 2008 we will read and discuss plays included in two anthologies: *Shattering the Myth: Plays by Hispanic Women* and *Necessary Theater: Six Plays About the Chicano Experience*. Note: some Spanglish is used by these playwrights.)

Written permission of the instructor is required.
