



## Where to report a crime at Saint John's University

### To report a crime:

At Saint John's University, contact Life Safety Services at 363-2144. Any suspicious activity or person seen in the parking lots or loitering around vehicles, inside buildings, or around the residence halls should be reported to the Life Safety Services department. Victims of crime have the option to report incidents to any “campus security authority” including those individuals noted above. They may also report the incident to local law enforcement (Stearns County Sheriff's Department 320-251-4240 or St. Joseph Police 320-363-8250) who work cooperatively with Life Safety Services to investigate, affect arrests and move cases forward for prosecution. Campus security administrators attend regularly scheduled meetings with local law enforcement to exchange ideas and discuss problems that may be of concern to the campus communities.
