SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, AND PEACE STUDIES

St. John's University, a liberal arts college for men, and the College of St. Benedict, a liberal arts college for women, are located four miles apart in Central Minnesota just outside metropolitan St. Cloud and 70 miles from Minneapolis. Both are Catholic colleges in the Benedictine tradition. The two institutions coordinate many of their programs. In the academic area, students of the two colleges attend classes on both campuses and select courses from a common curriculum. Academic departments are joint and the academic program is coordinated by the Provost for Academic Affairs, with the assistance of the undergraduate deans on each campus. This unique coordinate relationship allows each college to offer to its students a co-educational academic experience and expanded educational opportunities, while preserving the single sex character and distinct heritage of each institution.

The College of Saint Benedict/St. John's University seeks candidates for a full-time, tenure-track position in science and technology studies to begin Fall, 2000. The peace studies major, established here in 1987, is an interdisciplinary major which seeks to increase our common understanding of the causes of conflicts and their resolution, the relationship between peace and development, and the creation of a just world order. Although the position is broadly defined, preferred subfields include science and peace, gender and science, and technology and society. The annual teaching load will include two laboratory-based courses – *Technologies of Violence/Nonviolence* and *Science, Environment, and Society* -, a two-semester writing and discussion course for first-year students on a peace studies topic, a January-term course on any topic, and one additional course. This will alternate annually between *Gender, Science, and Technology* and an upper-division course in peace studies reflecting the instructor's particular expertise. Applicants must hold a Ph.D. (or be ABD with a successful defense of the dissertation within one year). As two of the courses have a natural science laboratory component, candidates should hold a graduate degree in one of the sciences.

All applicants must submit a letter of application, a statement of philosophy of education and learning, curriculum vitae, three letters of recommendation, copies of all transcripts required for application, official transcripts required for interview.
