

Living Classroom: Service Learning, Study Abroad and Sustainability Partner in Yambiro, Ecuador



16 students participated in this multi-faceted 3 week program that includes Nursing practicum, Sustainability Internships, and a Gender & Culture course. All students spend time working with the indigenous community of Yambiro. This June we taught English, Math, Art/Science, sports and Health to 60-75 kids, repaired playground equipment and desks, and worked with the community leaders to paint the medical clinic and plan for next year's projects. Nursing students provided care to 5 homebound elderly, assisted a local doc with health assessment for the kids and treated them for



Have Your Light Bulbs Been Changed?

20,000 32 watt lightbulbs have been replaced with 25 watt bulbs all over campus. With a return on investment of less than one year, this switch saves CSB over \$50,000 and reduce CO2 emissions by 425 tons annually. The project was funded through the CSB Revolving Loan Fund and a rebate from Xcel Energy. The 25W bulb is depicted on the right side of the picture.
