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Study abroad amidst mountains and Mozart on CSB/SJU's longest running program! Live and study in Salzburg, Austria, a city of 150,000 residents, surrounded by alpine mountains (nearby Untersberg is 6500 feet high), encompassing the winding Salzach River, and guarded by the fortress Hohensalzburg. Magnificent baroque architecture enhances this city of churches, palaces, cloisters, and courtyards.

Our faculty in Salzburg consist of distinguished professors from Austrian universities and a CSB/SJU director who accompanies the group for guidance, structure, and support. Your adventure in Salzburg will begin with two weeks of intensive German study to help you navigate your Austrian home away from home. Over the course of the semester you will study German language and also explore European history, culture, art, and politics through courses (taught in English), visits to local museums and historical sites, and program related excursions throughout Austria. Courses are taught at the Universität Salzburg, founded by Benedictine monks in 1622 and now a state institution.

Housing

Housing is arranged for program participants by the Center for Global Education (CGE). In Salzburg you will live in international student dormitories that provide kitchen facilities, common spaces, and internet connection. You will shop the local markets and prepare your own meals.

Things You Should Know

- There is **no language pre-requisite** for this program.
- Students study abroad in Austria during fall semester (early September to mid-December).
- This program can accommodate up to 30 qualified students.



Financial Considerations

During a semester abroad, CSB/SJU students pay the same tuition as if on campus. Instead of paying CSB/SJU Housing and Meal Plan, all students studying abroad pay an Education Abroad Fee. The Austria Education Abroad Fee for 2019-2020 was \$5,175. The fee will increase for 2020-2021 and is subject to change due to unanticipated increases in expenses and exchange rate fluctuations. Please note the items included/not included in the program fee. The figures in parenthesis below are estimates.

Included in the Program Fee:

1. Administrative costs & fees
2. Orientation program expenses
3. Housing while the program is in session

Not Included in the Program Fee:

1. Non-program travel or housing
2. Passport application fee (\$145)

5. Food expenses (\$1,050)
6. Personal & Miscellaneous (\$1,175)
7. Travel to Austrian Consulate in US for visa processing (most commonly Chicago)
8. Student visa fees and postage (approx. \$215)

AUSTRIA-SALZBURG ACADEMIC PROGRAM

In Austria, you must be enrolled in at least 16 onsite credits. Grades issued on all CSB/SJU sponsored programs are recorded on your transcript as letter grades. All grades are calculated into your cumulative GPA.

Austria-Salzburg Language Requirement
No prior German language is required. During your semester abroad you are required to take a 4-credit German language course, at your appropriate level.

REQUIRED COURSES	
COLG 385 IC EL	STUDY ABROAD SEMINAR (4 credits). The goal of the Study Abroad Seminar course is to expose students to the richness and diversity found on-site in their host culture and to more fully immerse the students into that culture. The course will include pre-departure, on-site, and re-entry activities. A course description will be provided by the program director after students are accepted for the program. This course will be designed to develop intercultural skills and awareness and will meet the requirements of the Intercultural and Experiential Learning components of the Common Curriculum. (Taught in English by CSB/SJU Faculty)
<i>LANGUAGE COURSE—CHOOSE ONE AT APPROPRIATE LEVEL:</i>	
GERM 115	BEGINNING GERMAN I ABROAD (4 credits). This course meets the requirement of GERM 111 on campus.
GERM 116	BEGINNING GERMAN II ABROAD (4 credits). This course meets the requirement of GERM 112 on campus.
GERM 215	INTERMEDIATE GERMAN I ABROAD (4 credits). This course meets the requirement of GERM 211 on campus.
GERM 216	INTERMEDIATE GERMAN II ABROAD (4 credits). This course meets the requirement of GERM 212 on campus.
GERM 360	ADVANCED GRAMMAR ABROAD (4 credits). <i>Prereq: GERM 312.</i>
ELECTIVE COURSES (Select 2)	
ART 350 FA	RENAISSANCE AND BAROQUE ART HISTORY (4 credits). Transition from Renaissance to Baroque as background; Venetian Mannerism, Italian and Spanish Counter Reformation. Aristocratic Baroque in France (Louis XIV), Bourgeois (domestic) Baroque in the Low Countries, Baroque and 18th Century in Austria. (Taught in English)
PHIL 327 ES / PHIL 341 HM	EXISTENTIAL ETHICS /20TH CENTURY CONTINENTAL PHILOSOPHY (4 credits). . European Existentialism. (Taught in English). Depending on registration, students will fulfill either HM or ES in the common curriculum.
POLS 341	EUROPEAN POLITICS (4 credits). Examines comparatively the political systems of Europe with particular emphasis on Western Europe in the context of Austria. In light of events at the end of the Cold War, the course includes the study of Eastern Europe and the Balkans. European integration through the European Union will be a major focus of the course. Issues of political and social change will be explored including a study of violence in Northern Ireland and the former Yugoslavia. (Taught in English)
