

## Seed Scrapbook

### Objective

The students will identify, classify, and describe seeds.

### Activity Length

60  
minutes

### Individual

**Activity** – Indoor / Outdoor

Have students collect seeds from around the school, in their neighborhood, and at home. Glue each seed onto a piece of paper. On each page the students will label the seed, write a brief description, and include other parts of the plant such as leaves, stem, etc by drawing them on the paper as well. A picture of the fruit or plant could also be included.

The pages should then be grouped according to trees, flowers, fruits, etc. to reflect classifications of the seeds. Scrapbooks should have a cover and be bound.

#### Additions to Activity

- This activity can also be done in a small group.
- The class could have a “Seed Fair”. Students display and share their scrapbooks with parents and other classes. Decorate the room. Have refreshments that fit the theme. (Peanuts, sunflower seeds, etc.)

### Small Group

**Activity** – Indoor / Outdoor

Instead of scrapbooks, small groups could make seed collection posters and display the seeds and the information that goes with them on large posters. See above individual Seed Scrapbook activity.

#### Additions to Activity

As in the individual activity, the posters could piece together to form one large plant.

- Seeds

- Heavy paper
- glue
