

SAINT PAUL COLLEGE

The College of Saint Benedict (CSB) and Saint John's University (SJU) welcome Saint Paul College transfer students. All courses from an official transcript will be evaluated to determine which of our Common Curriculum requirements they will fulfill.

Transferable courses are defined as *courses that are similar to a course offered at CSB/SJU, in which a grade of "C" or better was received, and that have a course number 1000 or above*. Note: A minimum of three semester credits is required to complete a CSB/SJU common curriculum requirement, with the exception of fine arts.

At least 48 of the 124 semester credits required for a degree must be earned from CSB/SJU. At least half of the credits required for the major, excluding supporting courses, must be earned from CSB/SJU.

This guide is designed as one tool to aid in your course selections for transferring to CSB/SJU. It is not to be used as an official document in the transfer of courses. CSB/SJU reserve the right to make updates or changes to these guidelines at any time. NOTE: The College of Saint Benedict/Saint John's University are currently implementing an innovative new general education curriculum titled Integrations Curriculum. The new Integrations Curriculum will be in effect for students entering fall 2020 and after. The details of how transfer coursework will apply to specific requirements in the new curriculum is still under development. At this time, we will review transfer coursework in terms of fulfilling elective credits required to earn a bachelor's degree at CSB/SJU.

FIRST YEAR SEMINAR

All incoming first-year students will need to take FYS 100/101 at CSB/SJU.

Transfer students may complete this requirement with ENGL 1711 & 1712

HUMANITIES

A course from two different disciplines with a minimum of three semester credits per course.

NATURAL SCIENCES

One lab course with a minimum of three semester credits.

SOCIAL SCIENCES

A minimum of three semester credits is necessary to fulfill requirement. Students majoring in a social science cannot use an introductory course to satisfy this requirement.

FINE ARTS

A minimum of three semester credits is necessary to fulfill the requirement.

Foreign Language

A student will have fulfilled the foreign language requirement if he/she has documented proficiency through the intermediate level or has taken courses through the Intermediate level.
