

# TRANSFER GUIDE

GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS WITH CREDITS FROM 2- OR 4-YEAR INSTITUTIONS WHO HAVE **NOT** COMPLETED:

- AN ASSOCIATES OF ARTS (AA) DEGREE AT A MINNESOTA INSTITUTION, OR
- THE 2-YEAR MN TRANSFER CURRICULUM (MNTC).

STUDENTS **MUST** EARN A GRADE OF “C” OR HIGHER FOR ANY COURSE TO TRANSFER TO CSB/SJU.

Integrations Curriculum Requirements	Transfer Coursework
Learning Foundations (INTG 100)	May be satisfied by a college level writing course  If Learning Foundations is satisfied by a college level writing course, Learning Explorations (INTG 200), a 2-credit course, becomes a required course to ensure the student completes content unique to the Learning Foundations course.
Theological Explorations (THEO 100)	May be satisfied by a college level introductory Theological Studies, Religious Studies or World Religions course
Cultural & Social Difference: Identity	Courses that include all three of these components: gender, race and ethnicity
<b>Sample subject areas that may satisfy the following requirements include, but are not limited to:</b>	
Quantitative Reasoning	Mathematics, Economics or Science lab
Way of Thinking - Abstract Structures	Mathematics, Computer Science or Logic
Way of Thinking - Artistic Expression	Art, Music or Theater
Way of Thinking - Human Experience	History, Communication, English, Philosophy or Languages
Way of Thinking - Natural World	Chemistry, Biology, Nutrition, Physics or Environmental Science
Way of Thinking - Social World	Economics, Peace Studies, Psychology, Political Science or Sociology

The following curriculum requirements are not typically satisfied with transfer coursework:

Integrations (INTG 300) & Integrated Portfolio	
Cultural & Social Difference: Systems (200- or 300-level)	
Theological Integrations (300-level)	
Language Requirement—may be satisfied by a college level intermediate I language course	
Thematic Encounter Course (100- or 200-level)	<b>NOTE:</b> Theme courses, Benedictine Raven and Engagements are often attached to other general education or major/minor coursework. These requirements do <b>NOT</b> often require individual courses to complete the requirement.

# MINNESOTA TRANSFER CURRICULUM

GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS WHO COMPLETE THE 2-YEAR MN TRANSFER CURRICULUM (MNTC) OR ASSOCIATES OF ARTS DEGREE (AA) FROM AN MN INSTITUTION. THEY RECEIVE THE FOLLOWING:

Integrations Curriculum Requirements	Transfer Coursework
Learning Foundations (INTG 100)	Completed via Communication/English/Writing course
Theological Explorations (THEO 100)	Successful completion of MNTC or AA Degree
Cultural & Social Difference: Identity (CSD 100)	Completed via Human Diversity course
Quantitative Reasoning	Completed via Science course with Lab
Way of Thinking - Abstract Structures	Completed via Math/Logic course
Way of Thinking - Artistic Expression	Completed via Fine Arts course(s)
Way of Thinking - Human Experience	Completed via Humanities course(s)
Way of Thinking - Natural World	Completed via Science course
Way of Thinking - Social World	Completed via History/Social Science course(s)
Thematic Encounter Course (100- or 200-level)	Successful completion of MNTC or AA Degree

Students **must** earn a grade of “C” or higher for course credits to transfer to CSB/SJU. If a lower, passing grade was earned for a course, the requirement will be satisfied, but no course credits will be awarded.

The following curriculum requirements are not typically satisfied through the MN transfer curriculum or an associates degree:
