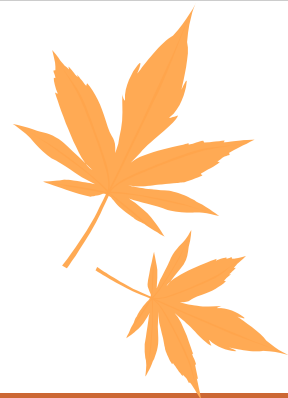

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Registration Instructions

FALL 2004

All currently registered students who expect to return to CSB/SJU this Fall must complete advance registration by April 15th. Please follow these instructions carefully—proper registration is your responsibility. If you have any questions about registration, call the Registrar's Office at 5260 (CSB) or 3396 (SJU).

STUDENTS ARE ELIGIBLE TO REGISTER ONLY IF THEY HAVE:

- Met with their advisor to obtain their Label with Registration PIN #
- Settled all current charges with the Student Accounts Office
- Been accepted by a department (unless they are a first-year student)
- Complied with Minnesota immunization regulations
- Have an active Network account

We strongly urge you to meet with your advisor early and enter your registration on WEBSTER on the date listed on your PIN Label. **Registration is on-line—delaying your registration will affect course selection.**

Students who are ineligible to register for any of these reasons may register on WEBSTER after they have cleared all registration holds.

Please note that registration for ILPs (Individualized Learning Projects) and for special programs (Tri-College Exchange, Internships, etc.) requires your submission of special forms available from the Registrar's Office. Registration for Internships (8 credits or more) are due the first day of classes.

REGISTRATION ADJUSTMENTS

Registration adjustments (Drop/Add) can be done on WEBSTER through August 30th. **You will need your Registration PIN# that you received from your Advisor.** To drop a course after this date, students can come to the Registrar's Office at SJU, Quad 161 or at CSB, Academic Services Building, 208.

Listings of canceled or closed courses will be electronically updated on the Class Schedule Information on WEBSTER. Students should use WEBSTER to check whether a space has become available in a course that was previously closed. Courses may be added through the first 4 class days of the semester.

If a course is closed, check whether there are any other sections of the same course that have spaces available in them and register for an alternate section. If this option is not available to you, consider alternate courses and register accordingly. Your advisor is a good resource to help determine an appropriate alternate. In some cases, it may be appropriate for the department chair or instructor to "override" a student beyond the course limit. Override registrations are completed by the student presenting a signed (department chair or instructor, as appropriate) Drop/Add card to the Registrar's Office.

We also ask that you use the "Request for Additional Course Spaces" menu item on WEBSTER registration to report a course that you wished to take but were unable to enroll in any section of. Your reporting this will help the colleges plan for possible limit changes or additional sections of the course—both for this semester and for future semesters. Please do not report a course if you were able to register for an alternate section of the same course. This request DOES NOT place you on a waiting list for the course.

REGISTRATION PRIORITY AND COURSE SELECTION

Registration priority is based first on class standing, then on the last four digits of your Social Security Number. Seniors are assigned courses first, then juniors, sophomores and first-year students. For Fall Semester registration, the lowest (0000) four digits have the highest priority. You are encouraged to keep these priorities in mind when you develop your course requests. **WEBSTER will immediately respond to your course selection by indicating Enrolled or Closed.**

Instructions for Using WEBSTER

AT ANY NETWORKED PC:

Log on to the PC (your username and password)
Click on the START button
Select NETWORK PROGRAMS
Select INTERNET BROWSERS
Click on INTERNET EXPLORER
Enter <http://www.csbsju.edu/>

FROM OTHER PC'S THAT HAVE ACCESS TO A WEB BROWSER:

Sign on as you normally would
Select Internet Explorer as your browser (AOL will not work)
Enter <http://www.csbsju.edu/>
The CSB/SJU HOMEPAGE displays

- Click on **"Inside CSB/SJU"**. Then choose the **"A to Z Index"** and under the **"W"** click on **"WEBSTER"**
- Click on the **Fall term ONLINE Registration Icon**
- **At the Registration Login Screen**, Click on the box and **Enter your Student ID # (with no spaces or dashes) & Enter your PIN #** in the space labeled "PIN" (**PIN # is on the PIN Label you received from your advisor - Do not use your WSC**)
Click on the **Login** button **once**
- **At the Registration Login Verification Screen**
Click on the box and **Enter your PIN# again** & then click on the **Login** button **once**
- Click on **Fall Term Registration** – from the Main Registration Menu
Click on **Fall 2004** and then click on the **Select Term** button
- **To Enter your Fall Term Registration:**
Click on **ADD/DROP Courses**
Enter the 5 digit Call #'s for all of the courses you want to register for - call numbers are listed next to the course number in the Fall Class Schedule Booklet. Click on **Submit Registration** button - **you must click on this for your registration to be entered into the computer system.** If there is space in the courses you selected and if you meet the necessary prerequisites, the screen will display **"Registered Successfully"**. It will also display the Course ID, Credits and Title of the courses that you have registered for. If a class is closed or you do not meet the prerequisite the screen will display **"Class Registration failed with error" and a reason for the error.**
- **To change the credits on a Variable Credit Course:**
Click on **Change Course Credit**
Enter the number of credits in the box (select from the range displayed) & click on **Submit Changes**
- **To check course availability:**
Click on **Look-up Class to Add**
Click on the name of the **Subject** and Click on **Select Subject** button
Click on the **Department and Course Number** and Click on **Select Course** button
This will display all the sections of that course, and under "status" it will state "open" or "closed"
(Note: You may **not** be able to register for some courses that are "open" because you do not meet the prerequisite or quota restrictions for that course.)
- **To request a course that you were unable to enroll in any section of:**
Click on **Request for Additional Course Spaces** - from Student Registration Menu
Enter the **5 digit Call # of the course(s) you were not able to enroll in** (this request DOES NOT place you on a waiting list for the course).
Click on **Submit**
The screen will display "Courses Requested" or "Course Request Failed" and a reason
- **To change your Fall Registration:**
Click on **ADD/DROP Courses**
Click on the **down arrow in the Action Box** of the course you want to Drop
Click on **DROP**
Under **ADD Class fill in the Call #** of the new course you want to Add
Click on **Submit Registration Button - this will drop your course and add a new one at the same time. Keep your Registration PIN # - you may Drop/Add for Fall semester until August 30th.**
- **To send a copy of your Course Requests to the printer:**
Click on **File** from Menu Bar
Select **Print** & Click on **OK**
- **To sign off:**
Click on **Exit WEBSTER**

If you took a course at another college which is a required prerequisite of a CSB/SJU course, you MUST contact the Registrar's Office to be registered

PLEASE NOTE:

If you have trouble operating the computer terminal when attempting to enter your Fall Term registration, please (1) **ask for assistance from the Computer access student employee**, or (2) **contact the Office of the Registrar**. The students who staff the Access Areas have been trained on the use of WEBSTER and are ready to respond to questions you may have while entering your registration information.

DROP/ADD on WEBSTER

If you would like to drop and add courses for Fall Term 2004 you may do this through WEBSTER until August 30th. Please keep your Registration PIN #, you will need this to Drop/Add on WEBSTER. After this date you will need to drop and add courses in the Registrar's Office.

OBTAINING A NETWORK ACCOUNT

All students must have a NETWORK account to use WEBSTER from the Network PC's on campus. Most of you will already have an account, which you may use for many other functions besides course registration. If you do not have a Network account--or have forgotten your password or how to sign on--please follow these steps to obtain your Network account:

- Step #1:** Go the Computing Center at SJU, Quad 084, from 8:30 am - 4:30 pm
- Step #2:** Identify yourself as needing a Network account.
- Step #3:** Activate your account on one of the PC's in the computing center

PROBLEMS -- Discussed below are some common problems we expect some of you may encounter, and how you may solve them.

- **Your PIN # doesn't work.**
Solution: Re-check your label and carefully re-enter the PIN #. You may have to Exit WEBSTER completely and login again. **YOUR PIN# for registration is not the same as your WSC (Webster Security Code) that you use to access Student Information on WEBSTER**
Please note: the PIN # is not displayed (for security reasons) as you enter it on the computer.
- **You lost your PIN #.**
Solution: Contact your Advisor to get your Pin Number again, or bring your Advisor's signature to the Registrar's Office. (PIN #'s cannot be obtained in the Computer Access Areas)
- **You entered the wrong Call #.**
Solution: WEBSTER allows you to make changes to your registration. See the section on changing your fall registration in the "Instructions for using WEBSTER". You may make changes on WEBSTER through August 30th.
- **While using WEBSTER it displays: "This session for your Login has expired".**
Solution: WEBSTER is programmed to Log off of the Registration Screen if you **leave the screen idle for more than 2 minutes**. If this should this happen, simply sign on again. To do so, click on WEBSTER and then click on the Fall Registration icon and start over.

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

ACADEMIC ADVISING

After receiving this Class Schedule booklet, visit your academic advisor to arrange a program of classes for next term, and have your advisor place your PIN label on the Class Request Worksheet located on the back page of your Fall 2004 Class Schedule Booklet.

If you intend to register for more than 18 credits, you are incurring an overload. Overloads may be attempted only by students in good academic standing, and overloads of 20 or more credits require the student to see the Academic Advising Office.

AUDITING

Students intending to audit a course (earn no credit) should indicate their intent when registering for the course, or complete a Drop/Add card and file it with the Registrar's Office during the first week of class. Auditors are expected to attend all regular classes, but they are not required to take final exams. A student who first registers for credit may change to auditor status any time during the first month of class. A student who first enrolls for auditor status may change to credit status only during the first week of class. Courses audited are not included in determining the total credits earned; however, the credit value of any course audited is computed in the assessment of tuition.

ADDING A CLASS

Monday, August 30th is the last day you may ADD a full-term course to your program, unless the course's first meeting is scheduled after August 30th. No student may enroll for a full-term course after the second scheduled meeting without the instructor's consent.

WEBSTER will be available to add courses through the 4th day of classes. After the 4th day of classes, any additions, with the instructor's consent must be made by filling out a drop/add card & filing with the Registrar's Office.

AUDITING A CLASS

Students intending to audit a course (earn no credit) are required to complete a "drop-add" form and file it with the registrar during the first week of class. Auditors are expected to attend all regular classes. A student who first registers for credit may change to auditor status any time during the first four class weeks. A student who first enrolls for auditor status may change to credit status only during the first class week. Courses audited are not included in determining the total credits earned toward a major or degree or the cumulative grade point average. However, the credit value of any course audited is computed in the assessment of tuition.

CREDITS EARNED AT OTHER COLLEGES

Students may complete out-of-residence courses and transfer them to Saint Benedict's and Saint John's. The college at which the coursework is completed must be accredited by the appropriate regional accrediting agency at the time of enrollment. Courses to be transferred must be similar to courses offered for credit at Saint Benedicts and Saint John's. Courses to be transferred must receive a minimum grade of C. Credits received for these courses are translated into semester credits according to the appropriate translation formula. Grades earned for transferred coursework are not calculated into the student's cumulative GPA. Before credit may be transferred, the Registrar's Office must receive an official transcript directly from the college at which the courses were completed.

With advance approval, students may apply these courses towards core and/or major requirements. Work taken to complete core requirements requires prior consultation with and approval of the Registrar's Office or the Academic Advising Office. Work taken to complete major requirements requires prior consultation and approval of the department chair. The department chair needs to sign an Academic Exemption Form.

Students who intend to transfer coursework from a foreign college or university must consult the director of international studies before beginning such study. Consult the Center for International Education for further information.

DROPPING A CLASS

- **Aug. 30th** Last day to drop a course using WEBSTER. After this date students must fill out a drop/add card & obtain the instructor's signature to receive a permanent drop until September 20.
- **Sept. 20th** Last day to receive a permanent drop on your schedule
- **Nov. 15th** Last day to receive a "W" on your transcript. If you withdraw after this date, your instructor will assign you an "F" at the end of the semester.

For courses scheduled for less than a full term, withdrawal during the first third of the course will result in no record entry; during the second third, a W entry; during the final third, a failure.

Students who fail to properly drop or withdraw from a course are subject to a failing grade.

EXEMPTION/SUBSTITUTION

In exceptional circumstances students may petition for exemption/substitution from specific academic regulations. Forms for requesting an exemption/substitution are available from the Registrar's Office. Students should first consult with their academic advisor, whose signature on the exemption/substitution form represents a recommendation that the request be considered favorably by the approving official. Department chairs are the approving officials for exemptions/substitutions from requirements within majors and minors. Exemptions/substitutions from academic regulations beyond major and minor fields require the approval of the Assistant Academic Dean. Requests for these non-departmental exemptions/substitutions should be directed to the Aca-

demical Advising Offices. The guiding principle in considering requests for any exemption/substitution is fidelity to the academic standards of the colleges.

Classes that meet after Period V may use their last regularly scheduled class period for their final exam

The academic calendar concludes each semester with a one-day study and four-day test cycle. Faculty may administer final exams for their classes only during the exam periods officially scheduled by the Registrar's Office. Cumulative final examinations may not be given during the regularly scheduled class days of the semester. If there is to be a cumulative final exam in a course, all exams given during the semester must be returned for student review by the last scheduled day of class.

Instructors of each full-term course are expected to announce at the beginning of the course whether a written two-hour final examination will be given. Such an exam will be administered during the four-day test cycle according to the schedule above. Note that a class is assigned a test time and day in the schedule according to the cycle and time period it meets during the semester. Classes that meet after Period V may use their last regularly scheduled class period for a final exam.

One period has been reserved on each of the four test days for the administration of a common exam for multiple-section courses who so desire. A list of such courses, and their exam times, will be announced this fall. The legend, MS, in the accompanying chart signifies times set aside for these multi-section common exams.

GRADUATION INFORMATION

- An Application for Degree must be submitted to the Registrar's Office prior to the award of a degree from Saint John's University or the College of Saint Benedict.
- An Application for Degree is sent spring semester to all CSB/SJU Juniors.
- Submitted applications are then reviewed to ensure all Core and Major requirements are met prior to the award of a degree.
- Results of the Degree Audit are sent to students three times during their senior year: September and February..
- Degrees are issued May, August, December and January.
- Upon successful completion of all degree requirements, diplomas and transcripts are sent to all graduates at their permanent address.
- An Application for Degree allows students the privilege to participate in the May commencement ceremony.
- Students may participate in the May commencement ceremony if they are within 8 credits of all degree requirements.
- Students who leave CSB/SJU may transfer up to eight semester credits from another accredited institution of higher education to complete their degree requirements.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 124 credit hours. 45 of these must be taken at CSB/SJU
- 40 of the total credit hours must be upper division (300 level)
- 2.0 minimum cumulative GPA (unless a specific major requires a higher average)
- 2.0 minimum GPA major and/or supporting courses (unless a specific major requires a higher average)
- Completed Core curriculum requirements
- Acceptance to a major (usually at the completion of sophomore year)
- Requirements for a major (half of the courses for a major must be completed at CSB/SJU)

INCOMPLETE GRADE POLICY

The policy concerning the temporary grade Incomplete (I) includes the following points:

When circumstances warrant, instructors may allow some delay in the completion of course work. Such extensions shall not extend beyond the close of the following regular (fall or spring) semester, and earlier limits may be set at the discretion of the instructor.

The instructor must report on the official grade roster the grade "I" followed by the approximate grade the student will receive if the course work is not complete by the end of the following semester (e.g., IF, or IC, or IB). That grade will be used in the computation of grade point averages until the Incomplete is removed.

If by the end of the following semester the instructor reports a single final grade to the Registrar, that grade will replace the I/GRADE, the Incomplete will be removed, and averages recomputed accordingly. Otherwise the provisional grade that was assigned with the "I" will become a permanent part of the transcript.

Exceptions to the above may be granted only by the written permission of the appropriate Academic Dean. Such exceptions will ordinarily be granted only in cases of medical disability or problems of comparable seriousness.

Degree candidates are cautioned that failure to have all degree requirements satisfied (including removal of Incomplete grades in courses needed for graduation) by the reasonable dates set by the Registrar will necessarily result in postponement of their graduation.

INDIVIDUAL LEARNING PROJECTS

The guidelines and application forms for Individual Learning Projects, sometimes called Independent Study, are available in the Registrar's Office. If you are planning an ILP for Fall term, please consult these guidelines. Remember, only 4 credits of ILP per term are allowed. You may indicate your intent to register for an ILP by requesting DNA 271 01A **Call # 10378**, or DNA 371-01A, **Call # 10379** on WEBSTER. **First-year students are not eligible for ILPs.**

SUMMER 2004 INTERSHIPS FOR CREDIT

All CSB/SJU students who plan to do an Internship for academic credit during Summer of 2004 are required to attend a one-hour Final Pre-Internship Registration session offered in April of 2004. Check with the Internship Office (Academic Services Building, phone 5799) for exact dates. All internships which take place during the summer must be registered under the Summer term not under the preceding Spring semester or the following Fall semester.

You will not be registered for your internship until the Registrar receives your completed Registration for Internship-Preliminary Learning Contract form with all required signatures. This form and other required legal forms can be obtained from the Internship Office. Check the Internship Program website (www.csbsju.edu/internship) for information on other requirements. The last day to register for a Summer 2004 Internship is Friday, May 9th. Registration after this date requires approval of the Assistant Academic Dean.

You will not be registered for your internship until the Registrar receives your completed Registration for Internship-Preliminary Learning Contract form with all required signatures. This form and other required legal forms can be obtained from the Internship Office. Check the Internship Program website (www.csbsju.edu/internship) for information on other requirements. The last day to register for a Fall 2004 Internship is Friday, May 9th. Registration after this date requires approval of the Assistant Academic Dean.

SPRING AND SUMMER 2005 INTERSHIPS FOR CREDIT

All CSB/SJU students who plan to do an internship for academic credit during Spring or Summer of 2005 must enroll in the Fall 2004 Pre-Internship Seminar. This seminar meets during A mod, even days, 8:00 am at SJU, or 2:40 pm at CSB. The Pre-Internship Seminar is for no credit. To sign up for this seminar contact the Internship Office, Academic Services Building, phone 5799.

MINNESOTA STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR THE MINNESOTA GRANT PROGRAM:

You must register for a minimum of 15 credits each semester to receive a Minnesota Grant at the full-time student rate. Students who register for 12-14 credits may still receive a Minnesota Grant but the award amount will be substantially reduced. Please direct any questions to the Financial Aid Office at CSB or SJU. (For all other aid programs, 12 credits is still considered full-time.)

ON TRACK

Advisors will have access to their advisees' On Track advising aid through WEB for Faculty Advising System. Please make an appointment to meet with your advisor early to review your academic progress and select your Fall coursework. Remember, all students **MUST** see their advisor to receive their WEBSTER Registration PIN # Label.

OVERLOAD

If you plan to register for more than 18 credits, you are incurring an overload. The overload tuition fee is estimated at \$590.00 per credit over 18. Students whose cumulative grade point average is below 2.00 may not register for an overload. Students in good academic standing (GPA above 2.00) may register for a maximum of 1 overload credit (19 credits overall) without permission. Credit totals of 20 or more require the student to see the Academic Advising Office. The WEBSTER registration system will not allow you to register for more than 19 credits.

REPEATING A COURSE

A course that has been failed may be repeated for credit. Courses that have been passed may not be repeated for credit. They may, however, be repeated for additional honor points. The original grade is not removed when the course is repeated and credit for a course can be earned only once. The higher grade is computed in the GPA. If you are registering for a course that you are repeating you **MUST** notify the Registrar's Office.

STUDENT TEACHING

Students registering for student teaching (EDUC 361, 362, 363) in their 9th (or greater) semester as a full-time student at CSB/SJU will be billed at ½ the regular tuition rate for that semester. These students will also not be charged the student activity fee, technology fee, and campus center fee for that semester. Institutional gift aid (scholarships/grants) will not be available to these students.

STUDY ABROAD

CSB and SJU offer a number of group overseas study programs. Students who plan to enroll in one of these programs should contact the International Studies Office, QUAD 128 at SJU. Students who are considering enrolling in coursework offered abroad by another institution (Consortium/External Study Abroad) should contact the International Education Office or the Registrar's Office, for information on transfer of credits. Students who register for SA 372, Consortium/External Study Abroad, will be billed a \$200.00 fee.

Seniors must ordinarily be in residence for the two semesters immediately preceding commencement (graduation). "In residence" is defined as enrollment as a full-time student at CSB/SJU for a minimum of 12 credits per semester. Any student wishing to register for an External Study Abroad Consortium during one of their two last semesters of their Senior year must receive approval from the Academic Advising Office. Seniors will **not** be allowed to register for a year long External Study Abroad Consortium.

S/U REGISTRATION

Arrangements for this non-honor point grading option should be made with your professor at the beginning of the course. Remember that undergraduates are limited in the number and types of courses they may take for the grade S (Satisfactory). See the Catalog for specific rules. First-year students may not take the S/U option except for a course with only S/U grades available. The grade S, once turned in by the instructor, is **NOT SUBJECT TO LATER CHANGE**.

Grading options are listed in the Class Schedule as either GRADING OPTION A-F REQUIRED or GRADING OPTION S-U REQUIRED. If neither of these is listed, the instructor will permit eligible students to choose either option by the date the instructor specifies at the beginning of the course. Once you have chosen, you may not request that the S/U be changed to an honor point grade.

If coursework grades average below a C under the S/U option, the grade U (Unsatisfactory) will be given with no credit earned.

TRI-COLLEGE EXCHANGE

The College of Saint Benedict, Saint John's University, and Saint Cloud State University have an agreement that encourages regular full-time undergraduate students to take courses on any of the three campuses. Registration is limited to fall and spring semesters. If you are interested in taking courses at Saint Cloud State, you can pick up a copy of their Class Schedule and a registration application at the Registrar's Office. If a course seems suitable for your program of studies, see your advisor for permission to register. To register, file the approved application with the Registrar's Office at the St. John's campus before August 21st. The course will be added to your Fall 2004 Student Detail Schedule, if space is available.

CSB/SJU students will be billed tuition, and other fees, at CSB/SJU rates. If a student is not registered for more than 18 total credits, there will ordinarily be no additional charge. For credits over 18, an additional tuition charge of \$590.00 (estimate), will be made for each additional semester credit hour.

If you have any questions about Tri-College Exchange and the suitability of SCSU courses toward your degree program, see Jane Simon in the Registrar's Office, QUAD 161.

TRANSCRIPT SERVICE

Current students may request an unofficial copy of their transcript at no charge from the Registrar's Office. Official transcript requests must be submitted in writing to the Registrar's Office and may be picked up at the Registrar's Office (or we can mail them for you) 2-3 working days after the request is made, except during the first and last week of each term.

Former students may request a transcript copy for \$3.00 per transcript. The fee for faxing a transcript will be \$3.00 per transcript. If the transcript is faxed outside the U.S. the fee will be a minimum of \$5.00. All transcript requests must be submitted in writing via mail or fax and payment must accompany the order.

VERIFICATION OF ENROLLMENT

The Registrar's Office can provide verification of your enrollment at the College of Saint Benedict or Saint John's University, as well as other information, such as graduation date, majors, full-time status, etc.

Any request to release GPA information must be in writing with your signature authorizing the release of this information

WITHDRAWAL FROM COLLEGE

Complete withdrawal from all of your courses during the term must be initiated with your Residential Director at CSB, Mary Commons 221 or the Residential Life Office, Sexton 127 at SJU. If you withdraw by September 20th no official record of your registration for that term will be made. If you withdraw between September 21st and November 15th, the mark "W" will appear behind that term's courses on your transcript. If you withdraw after November 15th, all courses for that term will be followed by the grade of "F". If you decide to withdraw after the term ends, you **MUST** notify the office mentioned above.

FALL 2004 COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

ART

ART 208: Survey of Non-Western Art

Selected survey of great architecture, sculpture and painting of Asia and other non-Western cultures. A study of artworks in relation to religion, culture, philosophy and geography of the non-Western World.

ART 209: European Survey

An introductory survey of the most significant periods in European Art History from the Ancient World to the present. A study of artworks in relation to religion, culture, philosophy and geography of the European Cultures.

ART 233: Arts Appreciation

During this course students will be actively involved (hands-on) in individual and group work. The work that students will be doing will involve relief prints, colligraph (a type of printing), and mono-prints. Group work will involve presentations and research. Through observation the students will define the elements and principles of design as this relates to existing works of art as well as self-created works of art. Various media, including photocopy, will be explored throughout the course.

COMMUNICATION

COMM 253: Nonverbal Communication in Human Interaction

This course will examine the theoretical writings and critical studies in selected areas of nonverbal communication. The course prepares students to improve their understanding of, and responses to, a multitude of nonverbal messages used by persons in a variety of cultures and backgrounds in both personal and professional contexts. The course content focuses on the factors involved in nonverbal communication such as personal appearance, touch, space, eye contact, gestures, use of time, facial expressions, olfaction, vocal qualities, environmental factors, body adornment/alteration. Students will develop knowledge of, and ability to analyze the nonverbal signals of self and others through a synthesis of theoretical and field experience.

COMM 303: Social Movements

Using the African American struggle for civil rights as an instructive exemplar, this course explores how communities come together through language and symbols for particular political purposes. We will analyze speeches, essays, art, and popular culture about civil rights issues like the abolition of slavery, suffrage, and segregation. Ultimately, we will ask what this history and rhetoric can tell us about the formation of social movements, how language is used to establish and contest cultural assumptions and legal rights, and how race matters in the United States today.

Prerequisite: COMM 101 or permission of the instructor

COMM 345: Advanced Media Writing

This semester, Advanced Media Writing will take a strategic communications campaigns focus. Rather than dealing with specific forms of journalistic writing, this course will allow students to practically apply multiple areas of theory and ethics to public relations, marketing, advertising, health communication and political communication. Students in this course will become knowledgeable in the substance and sequencing of each essential step in strategic communication, as well as become more knowledgeable consumers of communication. This course will have a service learning component, and all students in the course will participate in a strategic communications campaign.

Prerequisite: COMM 245 or permission of instructor.

COMM 383: Special Topics: Making Connections: Media History and the 21st Century

This course takes an applied approach to media history through an examination of the social, political, and cultural circumstances that shaped the development of media technology, industry, and content; and how that, in turn, shaped society then and now. Students will learn the connection that media's historical development has to our contemporary society and the current media environment.

CORE - SENIOR SEMINARS

SENIOR SEMINAR - A Core Curriculum Requirement

"The traditions of the liberal arts and the Benedictine character of our two colleges emphasize the need to develop in our students an ability to lead responsible lives in a contemporary world. This concern has always been a central element in notions about striving for a 'good life,' leading a life of civic responsibility, a life of personal integration, a life of 'wholeness.' At the junior/senior level of the curriculum, this objective implies that explicit and focused attention be paid to developing the ability to make good moral judgments on issues that affect our lives. Developing this ability is, then, the goal of this program. By 'good moral judgments' we understand choices which are consciously elected and defensively maintained."

A second goal is to enhance, "the ability of students to think well about problems that resist easy solutions, problems that call for combining many separate resources and skills, both intellectual and personal." "The aim of the program is to develop these skills:

- An understanding of the role that empirical information plays in justifying moral judgment
- An ability to sort relevant from irrelevant data
- An understanding of relationships
- An ability to assess the cogency of arguments
- An appreciation of the implications of claims
- An ability to analyze concepts
- An appreciation of and ability to use contextual thinking
- An ability to imagine vividly the impact of events and decisions upon the needs, perceptions, and desires of others
- An appreciation of emotions in the decision making process
- An ability to identify and assess normative components of issues
- An ability to clarify the relationship between an issue and one's own values"

"Issues and concerns around and through which these abilities are developed must be pertinent and persistent in the lives of both students and professors. They should be issues which broaden and deepen the scope of our concern, that increase our consciousness of connections between our lives and the rest of the world." *Taken from Exploring the Human Condition.*

CORE 390-01A: How Do We Know Who We Are?

Nathanael Hauser 2-4-6 / 9:40-10:50 / SJU

So many of the questions that define us as a culture have been raised through and by the art of recent decades, that without coming to terms with our art, we can scarcely understand ourselves." --Arthur C. Danto, Columbia University.

In an increasingly visual culture, the ability to communicate through the visual arts is imperative. Students, in this class, will engage artists of the past and present in asking what constitutes a good and moral society. The class emphasis will be on discussion and "conversation" with art works that often raise difficult questions concerning the values of a culture. Students will have the opportunity to research questions of interest, present individual or small group projects and open their analysis to various media including gallery, film, television, and performance arts.

CORE 390-02A: Current Issues in Society

James Makepeace

2-4-6 / 9:40-10:50 / CSB

This senior seminar will be a synthetic examination of four social issues which have recently come to the forefront of public and scholarly attention: terrorism, globalization, treatment of animals, and the environment.

Greatest attention will be given to the environmental issue. Each issue will be examined in a two-fold manner: *objective assessment* utiliz-

ing scientific evidence and theory and *normative assessment* utilizing tools of ethical theory. Aspects of these social issues to be considered will include: conditions of emergence, theories, applicable social movements and counter-movements, cross-cultural aspects, and social change.

CORE 390-03A: Thinking about Race

Martha Tomhave Blauvelt 1-3-5 / 9:40-10:50 / CSB

What is race? How do we know what it is anyway? How has this concept influenced our thoughts and feelings? How has it and how should it influence public policy, if at all? This course looks at the invention of whiteness, color and race, as Americans decided that immigrant groups such as the Irish were white rather than separate races, and 20th c. popular culture, especially film, conveyed racial meaning through imagery. We will also examine how different conceptions of the meaning of race led to different civil rights strategies; can and should race be taken into consideration? Cultivated? Overcome? What does this mean in practice? We will go on to debate the meaning of race today, from controversies over affirmative action and restitution to racial separation in everyday life. The literature on this subject is provocative, passionate and challenging. Readings may include:

The Autobiography of Malcolm X

Matthew Frye Jacobson, Whiteness of a Different Color: European Immigrants and the Alchemy of Race

Beverly Daniel Tatum, Why Are All the Black Kids Sitting Together in the Cafeteria? And Other Conversations About Race

Leonard Steinhorn and Barbara Diggs-Brown, By the Color of Our Skin

CORE 390-04A: Justice in the 21st Century

Daniel Finn 1-3-5 / 9:40-10:50 / SJU

Few issues are as fundamental to human life as justice: everyone is in favor of it. Yet few issues are as controversial: justice has different meanings for different people. This course will examine in detail six rival understandings of justice prevalent in debates today. Students will read two novels and six philosophical or theological treatments of the notion of justice in our joint efforts to come to grips with what justice means in our lives: personally and on a national and global scale. Like all Senior Seminars, the goal of this course is to improve each student's ability to make good moral judgments.

CORE 390-05A: Origins of Ethical Concepts

Martin Andrews 2-4-6 / 11:20-12:30 / SJU

This course focuses primarily on the question of the origins of our ethical ideas. Are they the product of evolution, social class, early childhood experience, or cultural institutions? Or are they arrived at by pure reason? To study this issue, we will read such works as Axelrod, Evolution of Cooperation; Nietzsche, Genealogy of Morals; Freud, Civilization and Its Discontents, and the Tao Te Ching.

CORE 390-06A: Ethics and the Jewish Tradition

Barry Cytron 1-3-5 / 11:20-12:30 / SJU

An introduction to Jewish ethics, which begins by looking at the sources of Jewish moral principles [as presented in the narrative and legal portions of the Bible and rabbinic literature] and the relationship of those principles to other Jewish religious concepts. We then examine how the classical sources can be applied to practical moral problems, including medical decisions, social and business dilemmas, and interpersonal relationships. In this section of the course, students will be asked to develop a major paper on one of these practical moral problems, and how the Jewish view relates to that of another faith tradition. The course will conclude by examining the unique ethical challenges presented by the events of the Holocaust.

CORE 390-07A: Social Issues and the Law

Tim Robinson 1-3-5 / 11:20-12:30 / SJU

What role should moral values play in our thinking about legal and public policy issues? The answer depends in part on whether we can justify our moral judgments to each other. How can that be done? What exactly are moral judgments, anyway? We approach these questions by looking at the process of judicial reasoning in criminal law, both as a potential model for moral reasoning, and as a point of intersection between moral and legal considerations. We examine particular cases and issues, as well as more theoretical questions about the foundations of ethics and law.

CORE 390-08A: Poverty, Hunger and Moral Issues

Diane Veale Jones 2-4-6 / 1:00-2:10 / CSB

Why is there poverty and hunger in the 21st Century? Who are the poor and hungry? Why are they poor and hungry? What is the impact of poverty and hunger on individuals, households, and nations?

Answers to these questions require us to examine the role of social, economic, political, and agricultural factors as causes of poverty and hunger, and to explore the ethical questions and dilemmas associated with poverty and hunger. What approaches to ending hunger have been successful? Why? Is it possible for an individual or small group to have an impact on ending hunger and poverty? If not, do we still have a moral obligation to try?

A small group service learning project is a requirement of the course.

CORE 390-09A: Race and Justice in American Legal History

Eugene Garver 2-4-6 / 2:40-3:50 / SJU

This course will look at the history of racial equality as treated by the U. S. Supreme Court. Primary focus will be the three crucial cases of Dred Scott v. Sanford, Plessy v. Ferguson, and Brown v. Board of Education, but we will also extend the history a bit on both ends, looking at arguments about slavery at the founding of the Constitution, and at cases from the 50 years since Brown. We will try to put the legal history in a wider social context, and look at changing meanings equality over the last 200 years.

CORE 390-10A: Ethics and Economics of Sustainable Societies

Joe Desjardins Monday / 6:00-9:00 pm / CSB

The goal of the Senior Seminar program is to develop the student's ability to make moral decisions. In this course, we analyze the ethical and economic underpinnings of current industrial societies, critique them and suggest a different foundation for sustainable societies. The topics covered include the economic and philosophical underpinnings of current market systems, a critique of these underpinnings including the flaws in neoclassical economics (epistemology, methodology, and ethics), and an evaluation of how a new paradigm might be constructed.

The purpose of this course is to decide if societies such as ours are sustainable (after we understand this idea) and suggest what a sustainable society could be. In effect, we will try the very challenging task of understanding everything about how we live and then reorganizing or rechanneling social evolution into a new pattern.

This class will be conducted with a heavy emphasis on discussion with students assuming the responsibility for getting the class started on the readings and by grappling with a topic or question (based on the readings or a previous speaker). Core 390-11A: Ethics and Economics of Sustainable Societies

Ernie Diedrich Monday / 6:00-9:00 pm / CSB

CORE 390-12A: Being Good and Being Happy

David Cloutier Wednesday / 6:30-9:30 pm / CSB

At the heart of the American conception of freedom is the right to pursue happiness. But what exactly are we pursuing? Why do we want to pursue it? And what does our happiness have to do with our goodness? Are happiness and morality enemies? In the philosophical tradition, "happiness" has not simply meant "good feelings", but rather some sort of satisfactory fullness of life, our ultimate goals that give our lives meaning.

This seminar will explore three topics: 1) How has contemporary (late modern western) culture constructed our conceptions of the pursuit of happiness? 2) What are alternative narratives of happiness? 3) How do competing narratives of happiness affect the way we approach particular moral dilemmas?

CORE 390-12A: To Be Announced

Kari-Shane Davis Wednesday / 6:30-9:30 pm / CSB

COMPUTER SCIENCE

CSCI-317: Ethical and Religious Issues in Computer Science

Should robots be baptized? Will artificially intelligent computers eventually replace human beings? Should scientists stop researching in fields such as artificial intelligence or nanotechnology in order to safeguard future lives? When a computer malfunctions, who is responsible? Do humans have a right to individual privacy? How will cyberspace change our relationships to each other or to God? This course will examine a variety of questions that arise within the field of computer science from the perspectives of scientific, religious, and ethical thought. Students will become familiar with methodologies in each of these areas and will apply these approaches to questions in several areas of computer science, including artificial intelligence, nanotechnology, software development, and cyberspace.

This course is designed to address the professional and ethical concerns of computer science majors. It is also designed to help students integrate their orientation as scientists with their personal belief system so that they can make better informed decisions as professionals and see their lives as an integrated whole.

ENGLISH

ENGL 385-01A: Hist/Lit Mexican Revolution

Chris Tourino & Brian Larkin

Cross-listed with HIST 300. See description under HIST 300

ENTREPRENEURSHIP

The E-Scholars program (ENTR) is a three course interdisciplinary sequence open to all students regardless of major. The program focuses on social entrepreneurship, encouraging students to be creative about how they can make a difference to improve society. Students interested in the program will go through a selection process that includes an application and interview. Accepted students will become part of a cohort group. The cohort will complete the three course sequence and travel together to visit with successful entrepreneurs in the United States and abroad. ENTR 301: Creating World Class Ventures

This is the first in a three course sequence for the E-Scholars program. The course covers conceptual entrepreneurial skills needed to create a business that is globally competitive. Each student creates a feasibility plan for a potential world class venture. Students will observe first hand, the best practices of entrepreneurial organizations. Students will also be introduced to issues of organizational integrity and ethics. Permission of instructor required.

ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

ENVR 315: Sustainability Workshop

This course is restricted to participants in the Environmental Studies Learning Community. Students will meet weekly to discuss issues related to regional sustainability in addition to participating in required field trips and service learning activities outside of class. Concurrent registration in any two other courses approved for the Environmental Studies major/minor is also required. GENDER & WOMEN'S STUDIES

GWST 101: Introduction to Gender and Women's Studies

John Yoakam

This course will explore friendship through the lens of gender. Topics will include historical, philosophical, and cultural examination of same gender and other gender relationships. Instructor

GWST 290: Men's Studies Research

In addition to men's studies content and research methodology, students participate in three ongoing research projects in the SJU men's center: a small group social norms study of masculinity, a social norms spirituality project, and an international men's stories project. Additional projects may be developed. Class time arranged with those enrolled. May be repeated.

HISTORY

HIST 200: Sophomore Colloquium: Peasants, Wilderness, and "Civilization:" India in Colonial and Post-Colonial History

Purnima Dhavan

This class will focus on some of the major themes in South Asian environmental history through the colonial and post-colonial period. We will examine how the British Colonial state and the modern nation states of South Asia sought to catalogue and control the immense natural wealth of South Asia, as well as the diverse and complex human interactions with the land. The goals of this class are to help students understand how historians work. Using primary and secondary historical sources, students will learn the basic skills of historical analyses, research, and the construction of historical narratives.

HIST 300-01A: Hist/Lit Mexican Revolution

Brian Larkin & Chris Tourino

Cross-listed with ENGL 385

This course explores the Mexican Revolution through texts from the disciplines of History and Literature. Students will read five Mexican novels that narrate the Mexican Revolution, along with five texts of History on the subject. The goals of this course are three-fold. First, students will learn about what happened during the Mexican Revolution. Second, students will explore the ways in which the disciplines of History and Literature overlap. Third, and perhaps most importantly, students will learn to practice historiography and literary criticism. We will grapple with questions such as: How have the disciplines of History and Literature developed? How can one event be viewed differently over time? How does the historical setting of the historian impinge upon the history written? In what ways does narrative strategy relate to content? What perspective can we gain by reading diverse narrative efforts (historical fiction, testimonial, high modernism) at opening up the contradictions and silences of "official" versions of real historical events?

This course will enroll 20 students from History, 20 from English, and 10 more from any major/minor.

HIST 300-02A: Civil Rights

William Green

This course will examine central topics that contributed to the development of civil rights for African Americans, the interrelationship between social custom and the social contract, and tension between race, ethnicity and class.

HIST 389-01A: Historiography and Methods

Derek Larson

This course will explore the historiography of the American West, covering such topics as the impact of U.S. expansion on the environment and native peoples of the West, the realities of violence in "frontier" towns, the political and economic relationships between Eastern cities and their Western counterparts, and the evolution of the 20th century West into an overwhelmingly urban society in the midst of a sparsely populated hinterland. Special attention will be paid to historical debates over the "meaning of the West," the introduction of race, class, gender, and environment as themes in these debates, and the varying types of evidence historians have used to interpret the region's past. Readings will include Richard White's *It's Your Misfortune and None of My Own: A New History of the American West*, Stephen Ambrose's *Undaunted Courage*, several monographic treatments of Western issues, at least one western novel, and 8-10 Western movies screened outside of class.

HIST 389-02A: Historiography and Methods (Social Science)

Annette Atkins

**This section of HIST 389 is designed for Social Science majors who are Secondary Education minors.*

This course has multiple goals. At the most basic level, it is intended walk you one more time through the sweep of American history, to increase your readiness to teach High School history. It also aims to make you more familiar with the extent to which American history is not all of the past, but is a story constructed about the past. As an intellectual construction – as a story – it gets told and retold in different ways from

different perspectives. Paying attention to how the story is told is what we call "historiography." My hope is that you will leave this course with more confidence in your ability to conduct a history class and with a more sophisticated understanding of the intellectual complexity of that task.

HONORS

HONR 220: Introduction to Human Communication

Jeanne Cook

This course provides student with a general overview of communication theory and research, particularly as it relates to their everyday interactions. Topics will include theories of meaning, languages, perception, nonverbal cues, gender, interpersonal relationships, self-disclosure, influence, group communication, organizational communication, and intercultural communication. This course fulfills the requirements of COMM 105.

HONR 240: The Development of the Christian Tradition

David Cloutier

An introduction to the tradition of thought and life called Christianity, primarily through acquiring a historically-informed familiarity with the ideas and content of Christian scripture. In surveying the scripture, particular attention is paid to the relationship of Israel to Jesus and the early Christians, the basic concepts of Christian belief, and the ethics of the Christian life. Some contemporary interpretive controversies and developments will also be studied. Students will be challenged to think critically about the Christian tradition as a whole, particularly in relationship to other religious traditions and to their own ideas about what Christianity is.

HONR 250-01A: Great Issues in Philosophy

Dennis Beach

This class is limited to incoming First-year students invited into the Honors program.

Of all the things that we can and should know, which are the most important? Should we look for such truths within ourselves or outside ourselves? And how do we know that what we are learning is true, and not just one particular spin on what's important? In one way or another, these foundational questions have both fascinated and perplexed men and women in every age. We will explore these questions through at least three key philosophical works from different ages and perspectives: Plato's dialogues from ancient Athens, especially the *Meno*; the Christian-existentialist philosopher Søren Kierkegaard's *Philosophical Fragments*; and the twentieth century Jewish thinker Martin Buber's *I and Thou*. Other short works or excerpts may be added to broaden our range of discussion.

HONR 250-02A: "An Atlas of the Difficult World": Reading Poetry, Fiction, and Personal Essays

Mara Faulkner

I borrowed the title of this literature course from a long poem by Adrienne Rich, in which she asks whether poetry can help us find our way through the dangers that mark the world of the twenty-first century. We will study this poem as well as several of Rich's essays from her collection, *Arts of the Possible*. Many other writers have asked what value imaginative literature has in "a difficult world." Does it create a bridge to cross the abyss between the personal and the public, the aesthetic and the political, the *I* and the *we*? We will read the poets, fiction writers, and essayists listed on the calendar and others of your choosing. You will add your voices to this conversation by doing many kinds of writing—a poetry anthology, a personal essay, and a critical/analytical essay. I will also give frequent short written assignments which will become the springboards into each day's discussion. I hope we will often find ourselves in deep water! There will be a written mid-term exam and an oral final exam. I will ask you to present some of your work to the class, raise questions, bring your experience of the world to bear on what we read, help each other improve as writers, and be actively engaged in all course activities.

HONR 310: Great Books/Ideas

Mark Thamert

This is a year-long discussion based seminar that concentrates on some of the world's greatest works of literature, philosophy, and intellectual history. Authors may include Aristotle, Augustine, Austen, Biblical writers, Camus, Confucius, Descartes, Dickens, Dostoevsky, Eliot, Faulkner, Freud, Homer, Zora Neale Hurston, Henry James, Joyce, Kafka, Kant, Melville, Toni Morrison, Flannery O'Connor, O'Neill, Plato, Sartre, Seneca, Shakespeare, Shaw, Virginia Woolf, and others. Preference will be given to Junior honors students, but Seniors will also be considered. Registration is by permission of the instructor only. Interested student should e-mail the instructor. All students in this course purchase a per-

sonal library consisting of roughly 100 books, and students are required to read a number of novels and plays during the summer.

HONR 340: Sexuality and Renunciation in Early Christianity

Charles Bobertz

Cross-listed with HONR 350-01A

This course will investigate the theological and social construction of sexual expression and gender roles among various Christian groups from the first to the fifth century of the common era. The course will begin by critically examining some theoretical perspectives which inform cultural anthropology - especially "the social construction of reality" - in order to provide a place from which we might start our examination of human sexuality and gender roles in Christian antiquity. We will focus on the reading and interpretation of primary texts, biblical and early Christian, with a twofold objective in view: to gain a better understanding of how theological and cultural considerations informed the early Christians' understanding of sexuality and gender; to explore the implications such understanding has for modern constructions of sexuality and gender, both within the Christian churches and in the culture at large.

HONR 350-01A: Sexuality and Renunciation in Early Christianity

Charles Bobertz

Cross-listed with HONR 340-01A. See description above

HONR 350-02A: The Spiritual Traditions of Islam

Noreen Herzfeld

In Iraq Shiites and Sunnis struggle for power in the new government. In France the government debates banning head scarves in public schools. Islam is noted as the fastest growing religion in America. It is impossible to understand current events, both at home and abroad, without some understanding of this faith and the cultures in which it is practiced. However, a more fundamental reason to study another faith is that it can provide a new window onto one's own tradition, and a new appreciation for the commonality of the human condition throughout the globe.

This course focuses on Islamic spirituality. Although we will begin with a historical overview and an examination of the basic beliefs of Islam, our focus will be on how Muslims have encountered God, and how this encounter informs their daily lives. Thus we will be looking at the faith in the context of political, social, and gender issues. This course is an introduction. Thus I expect that students will end it with more questions than when they began, but with enough basic knowledge to read further and to understand current events in Europe and the Middle East from within a broader context.

HONR 370: Morality & Human Nature

Chuck Wright

Humans have wondered about the basis of human morality since the beginning of recorded history. Some have argued that human morality is innate, a kind of "moral instinct," others that it is a product of society; yet others that it is based on human rationality. Typically these three perspectives have been thought to be mutually exclusive and in competition with one another. This class will consider whether they might actually be compatible. For this purpose, we will study writings from several sources. One will be the tradition of evolutionary ethics, whose advocates suggest that human morality is at least in part the product of natural selection. Humans with a certain propensity for fair play, the argument goes, are more likely to survive and reproduce than those lacking this propensity. But evolution is also a cultural process. So we will also read the works of philosophers and social theorists who examine how moral values have evolved over time. Finally, we'll also consider basic philosophical investigations into the rational roots of morality. By integrating all three perspectives on morality, we'll be able to develop a robust understanding not only of how humans are "naturally" moral animals, but also of how it is possible for humans to behave badly as often as we do.

HONR 390: What Do We Mean By Development?

Development is a dynamic process that involves the efforts of individuals, communities, nations, international organizations, and social movements. "Development" promises generalized gains, threatens people's livelihoods, and provides powerful metaphors to justify large-scale social change. In short, where you stand on development often depends on where you sit. Development's powerful polarizing and integrative dimensions are perfect for an intense evaluation of means and ends. This course will rely heavily on primary texts to explore the meaning of "development" from a wide variety of perspectives and help us to define our own meaning of development.

No defensible dialogue on the development challenges facing the world can avoid the discussion of competing values. At its core, development

remains a question of values. Ethical concerns over preserving traditional cultures, protecting remnants of the environment, and providing a safety net for the poorest of the poor, are examples of development issues that involve a weighing of competing values. Central to the Senior Seminar program and to this course is the goal of strengthening our "ability to lead responsible lives in a contemporary world." There are no preconceived answers; everything in this course is subject to critical questioning.

The course uses a mixture of novels and social science texts to gain insight into the nature of development. By viewing development from diverse perspectives we become conscious of the fractured and limited lens through which we view the world. Authors and texts we will read include: Joseph Conrad, *Heart of Darkness*; Chinua Achebe, *Things Fall Apart* and *Anthills of the Savannah*; Paulo Freire, *Pedagogy of the Oppressed*; Aldous Huxley, *Brave New World*; and E.F. Schumacher, *Small is Beautiful*.

MANAGEMENT

MGMT 305: Marketing Research

Richard Saucier

This course introduces methods for collecting and analyzing data to solve marketing problems. Topics include research design, secondary and primary data collection, sample design and data analysis.

PREREQUISITE: MGMT 321

MGMT 389: SA Experiential Learning

Wendy Klepetar & Virginia Arthur

This course is designed for students participating in Study Abroad. Reading relevant to understanding business in the international environment will be assigned. Students will write a series of essay integrating their knowledge of theory with their personal observations and reactions. Particular emphasis will be placed on the impact of culture on business. The course will be taught by a professor at CSB/SJU using distance learning to maintain contact with students located in a variety of countries.

MATHEMATICS

MATH 340: Differential Geometry

The course is inspired by Poincare's approach to a question that appeared in Newton's Principia called the n-body problem. The 3-body problem can be summarized as: Given the present position and velocities of a group of 3 celestial bodies, predict their motions for all future time and deduce them for all past time. The usual approach to the 3-body problem is to use the differential equations of Newtonian mechanics because they provide models for physical phenomena. Poincare noticed that by introducing a concept known as differential manifolds he could simplify the problem and consider the question from a geometric, rather than a dynamical, point of view. We will introduce basic concepts of differential geometry and algebraic topology and apply them to the 3-body problem.

PREREQUISITE: MATH 239.

MODERN AND CLASSICAL LANGUAGES

FREN 354: French Cinema and Conversation

This new, two credit course will introduce students to a number of fine contemporary French films taken from a variety of genres. We will learn about the differences in styles of directing and acting as well as the particular language used in cinema analysis. Students will have ample opportunity to improve their conversational skills in French as the course emphasizes oral expression and participation along with the viewing of the films.

Students can now take a combination of 2 credit, upper division courses to complete their major or minor in French.

PREREQUISITE: FREN 311 or permission of the instructor.

SPAN 355: Cinema of the Hispanic World

Survey of Spanish, Latin American and Latino film from the 1940's to the present. Taught in Spanish, the course is interdisciplinary and cross-cultural, emphasizing the socioeconomic and political issues that gave rise to important movements in the cinema of the Hispanic world. This course will also provide students a formal introduction to the language and tools of film studies, theory and criticism.

PEACE STUDIES

PCST 368: Religion, Society and Politics

This course cross-listed with CORE 369

Recent developments in the United States and other parts of the world have led observers to look closely at religious groups' beliefs and activities concerning the state, society, and sociopolitical issues like cultural

diversity and war and peace. In this course we will examine the Judeo-Christian tradition and address such questions as: What is the relationship between religion and ethnicity and religion and nationalism? What is religious fundamentalism? How do various groups view their relationship with the state and the broader society? What kinds of social and political goals do religious groups have and how do they try to achieve them? We will try to answer these and other questions through the study of historical and sociological case studies and selected religious texts reflecting the range of belief and practice in the Judeo-Christian tradition.

PSYCHOLOGY

PSYC 393-01A: Psychology and the Environment

Richard Wielkiewicz

Oskamp (2000) writing in the flagship journal, *American Psychologist*, stated "[u]rgent changes to human lifestyles and cultural practices are required for the world to avoid ecological disaster, and psychologists should lead the way in helping people adopt sustainable patterns of living" (p. 496). The purpose of this senior seminar is to examine psychology's role in leading society toward a more sustainable existence. Applying a psychological perspective to environmental issues will enable course participants to take an integrative look at many aspects of human psychology including ethics, learning, the role of the media, development, social, abnormal, organizations, and health. The course will also provide an opportunity to display the critical thinking and writing skills developed during your liberal arts education here.

PSYC 393-02A: Buddhist Psychology

Linda Tennison

This course will explore the interface between Western and Buddhist psychologies by a re-examination of traditional substantive areas in psychology including (but not limited to): historical development, research methodology and ways of knowing, neuroscience, sensation and perception, consciousness, conditioning, cognition, motivation and emotion, personality, social interaction and psychopathology. Class meetings will be spent discussing assigned readings from both the psychological and the Buddhist literature. Students will select a psychological topic of interest, extensively research the topic from both perspectives, and prepare a term paper to be presented to the group. In addition, students will receive basic instruction in mindfulness meditation and will be asked to adopt a daily practice, journaling their reactions and experiences, as an experiential component of the course.

SOCIOLOGY

SOCI-337-01A: ENVIRONMENTAL SOCIOLOGY

James Makepeace

The purpose of this course is to examine the linkages between human social behavior and the natural environment. The insights, or lack thereof, of major classical thinkers about the human/environment linkage will be considered as will be pertinent applications of the human ecology, social movement, critical, systemic, and social constructionist traditions. The major premise of the course is cultural determinism--that features of human culture, such as norms and institutional arrangements, are principle determinants of the impact of humans on the natural environment and vice versa. Problematic aspects of major natural areas and processes will be considered from this culturally deterministic perspective.

STUDY ABROAD COURSE DESCRIPTIONS FOR CHILE

Chile, Fall 2004

Program Director, Gladys White

CORE 390: Globalization & Social Justice

POLS 357: International Relations between Latin America and the United States

Cross-listed with SPAN 357

This course delivers a critical perspective on historical, social, political, and economic relations between different Latin American countries and the United States. Special emphasis will be given to the analysis of the relations of Chile and the United States.

SPAN 317: Topics of Conversation and Composition on Chilean and Latin American Issues

This course is designed to increase accuracy in writing and conversation to facilitate the acquisition of language skills necessary to express oneself in various contexts. Classes revolve around frequent written

compositions, selected readings and discussions on Latin American issues. Taught by Chilean faculty.

SPAN 325: Chilean Indigenous Communities

This course offers students a critical understanding of the historical, social and cultural contributions of different ethnic groups, particularly the Mapuche group. Students analyze the impact of globalization on local cultures and the environment, and the response to globalization of indigenous communities and other affected ethnic groups.

SPAN 326: Seminar on Chilean Culture

This seminar is an interdisciplinary course covering different aspects of the Chilean culture: literature, culture, music, painting and history. The course offers a vision of problem, ideologies, social reality and the colonization process during the 16th and 17th centuries. We will discuss and analyze the implications of the social and economic conflicts in the 21st century.

SPAN 328: History of Chile

This course will provide a panoramic view of the problems, ideologies and political and economic realities Chile has faced throughout its history. It will include the study of the indigenous state in Chile prior to the arrival of the Spaniards and their current role in Chilean society. The course will end with an analysis of the political, social and economical conflicts during the XXI century.

SPAN 329: Seminar on Latin American Literature

This course focuses primarily on Latin America's contemporary literatures with special attention to the cultural and sociopolitical conditions that identify the exceptional characteristic of these diverse literatures. The course will be on rotating writers and topics.

SPAN 330: Latin America Cinema & Society

This course is designed to give students an understanding of the way the art form of film helps re-define moments in the history of national, political and aesthetic consciousness. The course surveys some of the greatest Latin American films in order to comprehend the interrelationships between cultures and society, and arrive at a fuller understanding of both their global impact and their local relevance.

SPAN 357: International Relations between Latin America and the United States

Cross-listed with POLS 357

This course delivers a critical perspective on historical, social, political, and economic relations between different Latin American countries and the United States. Special emphasis will be given to the analysis of the relations of Chile and the United States.

THEATER

THEA 210: Dance Studies

This course will offer students the opportunity to develop technical skills to improve flexibility, coordination, and strength and to use those skills to increase their range of abilities in creating and performing dance. Modern dance techniques will serve as the foundation for students to build a movement vocabulary, and students will be expected to develop their own movement material in improvisation and composition exercises. Choreographic elements, form, and styles will be explored to guide students in the creative process and performance will be an on-going focus within the class. The goal is for the students to be able to clarify and fulfill all movement so they can physically express their ideas and emotions in movement which is authentic and meaningful, i.e., dance. Repeatable up to 6 credits

THEA 310: Advanced Dance Studies

Continuation of THEA 210 Dance Studies for more advanced students, taught concurrently with THEA 210. Repeatable up to 6 credits

THEOLOGY

THEO 201: Thinking Theologically

Miguel Diaz

This overview of topics within systematic theology – God, Trinity, Christ, grace, salvation, church, sacraments – has a twofold aim: (1) developing skills of theological thinking, speaking, and writing, and (2) providing a framework in which to place more specialized courses.

THEO 329: Hispanic Theology in the United States

Miguel Diaz

This course is cross-listed with CORE 346

This course introduces students to U.S. Hispanic theological perspectives. The main objective of the course is to enable the student to understand how U.S. Hispanic experiences (e.g. religious, social, cultural, gender, racial, economic, and political) mediate theological approaches to Scripture and the doctrines of Christian tradition. The course begins with a brief historical survey of the origins and ecclesial presence of U.S. Hispanic communities and proceeds systematically to explore central biblical and theological themes in the writings of contemporary U.S. Hispanic theologians.

THEO 339: Suffering & Christian Healing

Mary Forman

This course is cross-listed with CORE 346

Human suffering and Christian healing are considered in both social and personal dimensions. The ministry of the contemporary Christian church as it reclaims the ancient Christian grace of healing is explored from several perspectives: historical, literary, psychological, scientific, social and theological.

THEO 369: Islam in Relation to Judaism and Christianity

Jon Armajani

This course is cross-listed with CORE 345

Focuses on understanding Islam as a set of worldviews which has influenced the lives and institutions of Muslims and non-Muslims in many parts of the world. Themes will include the historic, political, and theological connections between Judaism, Christianity, and Islam; the course will introduce significant aspects of Jewish, Christian, and Islamic history, belief and practice, demonstrate the convergences and divergences between these traditions and explore themes related to dialogue between these religions. In terms of Islam, the course will examine the Quran and Hadith, women and gender, law, mysticism, constructions of sacred history, and the relationships between Islam and politics in the modern world.

THEO 395: Advanced Seminar in Theology

Vincent Smiles

This course presupposes a foundational knowledge of Christian Scripture and theology, and introduces students to the content and method of a specific theological sub-discipline through intensive study of a particular topic. The specific title and description will be listed in the official class schedule.

SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY

LTGY 468: Liturgical Movements

Kevin Seasoltz

Cross-listed with HHTH 468

This course will explore the liturgical movements inaugurated after the Protestant and Catholic Reformations. The foundations were laid in the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, but as organized movements they took shape in the twentieth century in various Western countries, passed through various phases, and ended in the late 1960s, following the Second Vatican Council. The course will have four foci: rites, personalities, theologies, and art and architecture. In the nineteenth century the movements circled around such key personalities as Johann Adam Möhler, Prosper Guéranger, Maurus and Placid Wolter, Wilhelm Löhe, John Keble, John Henry Newman, E. B. Pusey, Robert Wilberforce, Nikolai Fredrik Severin Grundtvig, John Mason Neale, Desiderius Lenz, and Augustus Welby Pugin. Twentieth-century leaders included Lambert Beauduin, Ildelfons Herwegen, Odo Casel, Pius Parsch, Virgil Michel, Josef Jungmann, James Crichton, Gregory Dix, Godfrey Diekmann, and H. A. Reinhold. In the twentieth century the artistic and architectural aspects of the movements were associated with Ralph Adams Cram, Marie-Alain Couturier, A. Graham Carey, Maurice Lavanoux, Eric Gill, and Joseph Richard. Ecumenical collaboration after Vatican II resulted in the *Common Lectionary* as well as in various church hymnals and official church orders. The scholarly aspects of the movements continue in the work of various learned societies, including the North American Academy of Liturgy and Societas Liturgica.

CORE CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS

The purpose of the Core Curriculum is to provide students with a foundation and the intellectual tools necessary to examine the fundamental, recurring questions about ourselves and our world. These questions challenge students to broaden their interests and explore a variety of academic areas. Striving to ask those questions well and make good moral and ethical judgments about them is at the heart of our colleges' mission.

The Core Curriculum is composed of four levels of requirements:

1. Proficiency-based requirements

Foreign language proficiency

Students demonstrate proficiency in speaking or reading a classical or modern language through satisfactory completion of the language proficiency exam or through satisfactory completion of Modern/Classical Language 211 (with any passing grade).

Mathematics Proficiency

Students demonstrate proficiency in elementary algebra and geometry through satisfactory completion of the mathematics proficiency exam or calculus readiness exam.

First Year Students beginning Fall 2001 must complete the Fine Arts Experience requirement by attending 8 designated Fine Arts Experience Events—four events per semester.

2. Cross-Disciplinary courses

First-Year Symposium (2 courses)— CORE 100 & 101, or HONR 100 & 101

Senior Seminar—CORE 390, or HONR 390 only. Education majors can complete EDUC 390 and SWRK majors can complete SWRK 390. Ordinarily completed during Senior year. Cannot be repeated for credit. Both semesters of First-Year Symposium must already be completed.

3. Disciplinary courses

Only courses which are designated within the course title by the appropriate symbol (FA, HML, MT, JC, etc) may be used to complete the following disciplinary requirements.

FA	(4 credits)	Must be from courses that are designated as fulfilling Fine Arts
HML	(2 courses)	Must be from different departments or disciplines (ex. Not two literature courses even if they are from different department)
TH	(1 course)	Must be 100 level theology course.
HMU	(1 course)	Must be from the same discipline as one HML or TH already completed. Cross listed courses only fulfill either the HMU or the JC, but not both disciplinary requirements.
JC	(1 course)	May be satisfied only after the TH and one HML course is completed. Cross listed courses only fulfill either the HMU or the JC, but not both disciplinary requirements.
MT	(1 course)	Must have satisfied the Math Proficiency before the completion of the course.
NS	(2 courses)	Must be from different departments (unless NATS, COLG, HONR or ENVR).
SSL	(1 course)	Must be 100 level.
SSU	(1 course)	Must have completed the SSL course first.

4. Flagged courses

Courses may carry 1 or more flags, in addition to meeting Core disciplinary or Major requirements. Flagged courses are specific to the instructor and term. Flagged courses are listed in the Class Schedule and updated lists are posted at the Office of the Registrar.

Most classes are scheduled to meet on either odd days (1-3-5) of the cycle, or on even days (2-4-6). As a result, your classes generally meet every other day.
