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### Registration Procedures

#### New incoming students

Please complete the CSB/SJU Advising and Registration Form, located in the [Forms Portal](#) , in order to provide the Academic Advising Office with accurate information to complete your initial class registration.

#### Current and continuing students

Continuing students register online using [Banner Web Self Service](#) during the advance registration period. When registering for courses for the coming term, please follow the registration instructions carefully. Proper registration is the student's responsibility. If you have questions about registration, contact the Registrar's Office at 320.363.3396 or [registrar@csbsju.edu](mailto:registrar@csbsju.edu) .

Continuing students are eligible to register only if they have:

1. Met with their advisor and obtained their registration pin number
2. Settled all current charges with the Student Accounts Office
3. Complied with Minnesota immunization regulations
4. Submitted a final High School transcript (applies to first-year students)
5. Completed the mandated sexual misconduct training (applies to first semester, new students)
6. Selected a new advisor (applies only to first-year students in their second semester)
7. Been accepted by a department (applies only if a junior or senior during the next full term.)
8. Applied for graduation (applies to all seniors or 4th year students)
9. Have no other outstanding holds on their registration

We strongly urge you to meet with your advisor early and enter your registration on Banner Web Self Service on the date provided by your advisor. **Delaying your registration will affect course selection and availability.**

Students who are ineligible to register for any of these reasons may register on Banner Web Self Service after they have cleared all registration holds.

Registration adjustments (Drop/Add) can be completed on Banner Web Self Service through the 5th class day of each semester. You will need your registration pin number that you received from your advisor. To drop a course after the 5th day of the semester, you must complete the appropriate online request form available at [Registrar's Online Forms](#) or come to the Registrar's Office at SJU (Quad 163) .

Listings of cancelled or closed courses will be electronically updated in the Class Schedule on Banner Web Self Service. Students should check whether a space has become available in a course that was previously closed. Full term courses may be added through the first 5 class days of the semester.

If a course is closed, check whether there are any other sections of the same course that have spaces available in them and register for an alternate section. If this option is not available to you, consider alternate courses and register accordingly. Your advisor is a good resource to help determine an appropriate alternate. In some cases, it may be appropriate for the department chair or instructor to “override” a student beyond the course limit. Override registrations are completed by the student using the appropriate the [Override Request Form](#) .

# Preparing For Registration

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## Prepare for Registration

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### ACADEMIC ADVISING

#### Prior to Registration

Schedule an appointment with your primary advisor well in advance of class registration - Consultation with your faculty advisor is required prior to registration.

  - Go to 'Student Records'
  - 'Student Information'
2. Plan a schedule
  - Develop a class schedule that helps you progress toward your degree. **Degree Works can assist you in determining outstanding Common Curriculum and major/minor requirements.**
  - Review course offerings
    - Consider balance between major/minor/Common Curriculum courses
    - Consider balance courses that may require more/less focus
    - Know what classes you NEED to take, as well as those you WANT to take
    - Have a back-up plan in case your first choice courses are unavailable at your time of registration

Draft your tentative schedule(s) for review with your faculty advisor using

Registration PIN - Upon approval of your proposed schedule, your faculty advisor will issue your registration PIN which is required for registration in Banner. Record this registration pin for future reference. New registration pins are issued for each registration period.

3. If you are unsure if you have a correct/valid registration pin, you can always verify your pin by attempting to log into class registration. If you attempt to login with an invalid registration pin, you will get the following error message "Invalid alternate pin, please try again."
4. Follow up with your department chair or Academic Advising, as needed.

#### Check for Registration Holds

To be cleared for registration, all students must have:

1. Settled their student account with the college
2. Complied with Minnesota immunization regulations
3. Have selected an approved faculty advisor

Other processes that could add a hold to your registration include

- 1st semester first years - students must have a final High School transcript on file
- 1st semester new students - all students must have completed the mandated sexual misconduct training
- 2nd semester sophomore - students must be accepted or conditionally accepted to a major
- Seniors - students must have completed a degree application

### Course Load

- **Typical** - A typical course load includes 16 credits comprised of four 4-credit courses.
  - Variations may occur due to need for 1, 2, or 3 credit courses in some programs.
- **Minimum** - Enrollment in 12 credits is required to maintain full-time student ("in-residence") status.
- **MN State Grant** - Minnesota students receiving Minnesota State Grant funds must enroll in at least 15 credits to receive the full awarded grant amount.
- **Maximum** - The enrollment maximum is 18 credits
- **Overload** - Credits in excess of 18 may only be attempted by students in good academic standing and special approval from Academic Advising. See [Credit Overload](#) for additional information

## ACADEMIC PROBATION

First semester students must earn a minimum 1.8 cumulative grade point average to remain in good academic standing. In subsequent semesters, all students are required to maintain a 2.0 cumulative grade point average for all CSB/SJU coursework. Students who fall below a 2.0 cumulative GPA will be placed on academic probation for the next semester. During the probationary semester, students must raise their cumulative GPA to 2.0 and may take no courses for S/U grading unless the course is offered only on an S/U basis. Students whose cumulative GPA remains below the minimum standards at the end of a Final Probationary semester are subject to dismissal.

## ADDING A CLASS

- **Day 1 - 5 of the semester** - no instructor consent need, register for courses using Banner Web Self-Service - <http://www.csbsju.edu/it-services/banner>

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- **After Day 5 of the semester** - instructor consent needed, registration must be made by submitting an add request form, available in the online forms:  
<http://www.csbsju.edu/registrar/current-students/student-forms> .

## AUDITING A CLASS

1. Students intending to audit a course (earn no credit) are required to complete an Audit Change of Status Form - <https://www.csbsju.edu/registrar/audit-change-of-status> during the first week of class.
2. When auditing a course, students are expected to attend all regular classes.
3. Change of Status
  - A student who begins a semester registered for credit may change to audit status any time during the first 4 weeks of the semester.
  - A student who begins a semester auditing a course may change to credit-bearing status **ONLY** during the 1st week of the semester.
4. Courses audited are **not** included in determining the total credits earned toward a major, total credits earned toward a degree, or in the calculation of the cumulative grade point average.
5. **The credit value of any audited course is calculated in the assessment of tuition.**

## CALENDAR CHANGES

The CSB/SJU calendar is subject to modification or interruption due to occurrences such as fire, flood, labor disputes, interruption of utility services, acts of God, civil disorder and war. In the event of such occurrences, the Institutions will attempt to accommodate their students. However, we do not guarantee that courses of instruction, extra curricular activities or other programs or events will be completed or rescheduled. Refunds will be made to eligible students in accordance with College or University policy.

## CANCELED OR CLOSED COURSES

The institutions reserve the right to limit the enrollment in courses due to academic or space restrictions. In addition, a course may be due to low enrollment or unavailability of an instructor.

## CO-REQUISITES (COREQ)

Co-requisites are courses that must be taken during the same semester.

## CREDITS EARNED AT OTHER COLLEGES

Students may complete out-of-residence courses and transfer them to the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University. The college at which the coursework is completed must be accredited by the appropriate regional accrediting agency at the time of enrollment. Courses to be transferred must be similar to courses offered for credit at Saint Benedict's and Saint John's. Courses to be transferred must receive a minimum grade of C. Credits received for these courses are translated into semester credits according to the appropriate translation formula. Grades earned for transferred coursework are not calculated into the student's cumulative GPA. Before credit may be transferred, the Registrar's Office must receive an official transcript directly from the college at which the courses were completed.

With advance approval, students may apply these courses towards the common curriculum and/or major requirements. Work taken to complete common curriculum requirements requires prior consultation with and approval of the Registrar's Office or the Academic Advising Office. Work taken to complete major requirements requires prior consultation and approval of the department chair. The department chair needs to approve a Major/Minor Substitution Form.

Students who intend to transfer coursework from a foreign college or university must consult the director of international studies before beginning such study. Consult the Center for Global Education for further information.

**Repeating Courses** - coursework completed through AP, IB or PSEO may not be repeated at CSB/SJU for additional credit. If you choose to enroll in the equivalent course at CSB/SJU, the AP, IB or PSEO credits will be removed from your CSB/SJU transcript.

## CREDIT OVERLOAD APPROVAL & FEES

A student is considered full-time if enrolled in 12 to 18 credits during the fall or spring semesters. If you plan to register for more than 18 credits, you are incurring an overload. Overloads may be attempted only by students in good academic standing with special approval of the Academic Advising Office.

**2022-2023 Fees:** The overload tuition fee is billed at approximately \$1,416.00 per credit over 18.

## DEGREE WORKS

Advisors will have access to Degree Works, <https://www.csbsju.edu/registrar/current-students/degreeworks>, advising aid through Banner Web Self-Service for Faculty - <http://www.csbsju.edu/it-services/banner>. Please make an appointment to meet with your advisor early to review your academic progress and select your coursework.

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Remember, all students **must** see their advisor to receive their registration PIN #.

## DROPPING A CLASS

- **Day 1-5 of the semester:** Drop a full-term course using Banner Web Self-Service - <http://www.csbsju.edu/it-services/banner>
- **Week 2-4 of the semester:** Drop from a full-term course by submitting a course drop from, available on the student forms page - <https://www.csbsju.edu/registrar/current-students/student-forms>
- **Week 5 - Seventeen (17) days before the end of classes:** Withdraw from the full-term course with a grade of 'W' by submitting a course withdrawal form, available on the student forms page - <https://www.csbsju.edu/registrar/current-students/student-forms>
- **Last sixteen (16) days of class:** If you withdraw after this date, your instructor will assign you an 'F' at the end of the semester, if appropriate

For courses scheduled for less than a full term, withdrawal during the first third of the course will result in no record entry; during the second third, a "W" entry; during the final third, a failure if appropriate.

**Students who fail to properly drop or withdraw from a course may be subject to a failing grade, if appropriate.**

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 124 credit hours.
- 48 of those 124 credits must be earned at CSB/SJU for students who began Fall 2017 or later
- 40 of the total credit hours must be upper division (300 level)
- 2.0 minimum cumulative GPA (unless a specific major requires a higher average)
- 2.0 minimum GPA major and/or supporting courses (unless a specific major requires a higher average)
- Completed Common Curriculum or Integrations Curriculum requirements
- Acceptance to a major (usually at the completion of sophomore year)
- Requirements for a major (half of the courses for a major must be completed at CSB/SJU)
- 24 of your last 32 credits must be completed at CSB/SJU. Any concurrent credits taken elsewhere while enrolled at CSB/SJU would be considered part of the eight credits allowed.

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All financial, academic, student accounts & health center holds must be cleared before registering for classes.

## **INCOMPLETE GRADE POLICY**

The policy concerning the temporary grade Incomplete (I) includes the following points:

- When circumstances warrant, instructors may allow some delay in the completion of course work. Such extensions shall not extend beyond the close of the following regular (fall or spring) semester, and earlier limits may be set at the discretion of the instructor.
- The instructor must report on the official grade roster the grade “I” followed by the minimum grade the student will receive if the course work is not complete by the end of the following semester (e.g., IF, or IC, or IB). That grade will be used in the computation of grade point averages until the Incomplete is removed.
- If, by the end of the following semester, the instructor reports a single final grade to the Registrar, that grade will replace the I/GRADE, the Incomplete will be removed, and averages recomputed accordingly. Otherwise the minimum grade that was assigned with the “I” will become a permanent part of the transcript.
- Exceptions to the above may be granted only by the written permission of the Assistant Academic Dean. Such exceptions will ordinarily be granted only in cases of medical disability or problems of comparable seriousness.

Degree candidates are cautioned that failure to have all degree requirements satisfied (including removal of Incomplete grades in courses needed for graduation by March 15th) will necessarily result in postponement of their graduation.

## **MINNESOTA STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR THE MINNESOTA GRANT PROGRAM**

Minnesota students eligible for the Minnesota Grant Program must register for and attend a minimum of 15 credits each semester to receive a Minnesota Grant at the full-time student rate. Students who register for 12-14 credits may still receive a Minnesota Grant, but the award amount will be substantially reduced.

For all other financial aid programs, 12 credits is considered full-time.

## **OFFICIAL COMMUNICATIONS TO STUDENTS BY E-MAIL**

The Registrar's Office will use electronic mail as the most expeditious means of communicating with student. Ensure that junk mail filtering is not blocking messages from the Registrar's Office in order to receive important notices regarding graduation, cancellation of courses, etc.

## PERMISSION REQUIRED CLASSES

Before attempting to register for courses listed as "Permission of Instructor or Department", students must obtain written permission by completing an override request form - <https://apps.csbsju.edu/registrar/forms/override> .

## PREREQUISITES

Check the course listings section of this class schedule to find out if a class has a prerequisite. Make sure you have met all prerequisites before attempting to register for a course. If you have not taken the prerequisite, you must contact the department to seek written approval to register for the course by completing an override request form - <https://apps.csbsju.edu/registrar/forms/override> .

## PROTOCOL FOR MAKE-UP OF FINAL EXAMS

If the Provost Office determines that final exams cannot be held due to weather or any other emergency situation, then the following protocol will be followed:

- If the entire day of final exams must be canceled, then that day of exams will be held the day after the last day of the regularly scheduled final exams. The exam times will remain the same on the extra exam day.
- If classes are canceled for any part of a regular exam day then those exams will be held the day after the last day of the regular final exams. The exam(s) will begin at 8:00 am on the extra exam day.

## REPEATING A COURSE

- **Failed course** - A course which has been failed may be repeated for credit
- **Passed course** - A courses which have been passed may not be repeated for credit. Credit for a course can be earned only once. However, a course may be repeated for additional honor points. In this case, the original grade is not removed from the transcript, but the higher grade is utilized in the computation of the GPA.
- If you are registering for a course that you are repeating you **must** notify the Registrar's Office.
- **Repeating a course in which a passing grade has already been earned may have financial aid implications.** For additional information, contact a Financial Aid Office.
- Coursework completed through AP, IB or PSEO may not be repeated at CSB/SJU for

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additional credit. If you choose to enroll in the equivalent course at CSB/SJU, the AP, IB or PSEO credits will be removed from your CSB/SJU transcript.

## SEXUAL MISCONDUCT POLICY - TITLE IX

## STUDENT TEACHING

- **Tuition** - students registering for student teaching (EDUC 360, 361, 362, 363) in their 9th (or greater) semester as a full-time student at CSB/SJU will be billed at ½ the regular tuition rate for that semester
- **Fees** - student teachers will also not be charged the student activity fee, technology fee, and campus center fee for that semester
- **Financial Aid** - institutional gift aid (scholarships/grants) will not be available to these students

## STUDY ABROAD

CSB/SJU offer a number of group overseas study programs. Students who plan to enroll in one of these programs should contact the Center for Global Education, Clemens Library, A-101 at CSB.

### External programs

- Students who are considering enrolling in coursework offered abroad by another institution (Consortium/External Study Abroad) should contact the Center for Global Education or the Registrar's Office, for information on transfer of credits.
- Students who register for SA 372, Consortium/External Study Abroad, will be billed a \$300 fee.

### Seniors studying abroad

- Seniors must ordinarily be in residence for the two semesters immediately preceding commencement (graduation).
- "In residence" is defined as enrollment as a full-time student at CSB/SJU for a minimum of 12 credits per semester.
- Any student wishing to register for an External Study Abroad Consortium during one of their two last semesters of their Senior year must receive approval from the Academic Advising Office.

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Seniors **will not** be allowed to register for a year-long External Study Abroad Consortium.

## SUBSTITUTION

In exceptional circumstances and for appropriate reasons, students may petition for a substitution from specific academic regulations. Forms for requesting a substitution are available online:

Students should first consult with their academic advisor. Department chairs are the approving officials for substitutions from requirements within majors and minors. Substitutions from academic regulations beyond major and minor fields (including common curriculum requirements) require the approval of the Academic Dean or the dean's designee. Requests for these non-departmental substitutions should be directed first to the Academic Advising Office.

The guiding principle in considering requests for any substitution is fidelity to the academic standards of the colleges.

If neither of these statements is printed with a course in the class schedule, the instructor will permit eligible students to choose either option by the date the instructor specifies at the beginning of the course.
- If coursework grades average below a C under the S/U option, the grade U (unsatisfactory) will be given with no credit earned.

The request to take a course at St. Cloud State University is filed at the Registrar's Office.

3. The registrar will determine whether space is available and confirm registration.
4. Registration is limited to fall and spring semesters.

**Night classes may use their last regularly scheduled class period for their final exam or request a multi-section common exam time.**

The academic calendar concludes each semester with a one-day study and three-day test cycle. Faculty may administer final exams, final projects or presentations for their classes only during the exam period officially scheduled by the Registrar's Office. Cumulative final examinations, projects or presentations, may not be given during the regularly scheduled class days of the semester, except for night classes. If there is to be a cumulative final exam in a course, students must be given the opportunity to review all tested materials by the last scheduled class. The faculty member has the right to retain the tested materials.

Study day is meant to support student preparation for the final exam period. Faculty or departments may offer study sessions to assist students in their preparation. Please do not schedule required activities on this day (no final exams, final projects, or presentations).

Instructors of each full-term course are expected to announce at the beginning of the course whether a two-hour final examination, final project or presentation will be given. Such an exam will be administered during the three-day test cycle according to the schedule above. Note that a class is assigned a test time and day in the schedule according to the cycle and time period it meets during the semester. Night classes may use their last regularly scheduled class period for a final exam or request a multi-section common exam time.

One period has been reserved on two of the test days for the administration of a common exam for multiple-section courses who so desire. A list of such courses, and their exam times, will be announced this fall.

    - *Prerequisites: Foundational course requirements completed*
  - Remaining 2 courses: Thematic encounters or thematic focus courses
