The registration fee includes programming, materials, handouts, refreshments during breaks and evening socials. The registration cost is \$255, or \$210/person when 5 or more are registered together. Single day registration is \$100/person/day.

LODGING AND MEALS

Participants stay in air-conditioned campus dormitories that are nonsmoking and furnished with bed linens and towels. Most do not have private baths. 
