Title IX and Project EMBRACE

As an employee of CSB and SJU, you may have a student approach you with issues of sexual harassment, sexual assault, dating or domestic violence, and stalking. Incidents such as these often cause a student significant trauma. The impact of trauma can be experienced in many ways, including:

- · Behavior (feeling numb, distant, overwhelmed, anxious, etc.)
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It is important to know the resources available to students. As a required reporter, you must report any known incident of sexual misconduct (broad term for the misconduct listed above) to the Title IX Office. The Title IX Coordinator(s) work together to provide support, resources, and reporting options to students, staff, and faculty. To report sexual misconduct, contact the CSB Title IX Coordinator, Tamara Hennes-Vix at 320-363-5943 or the Interim SJU Title IX Coordinator, Patty Weishaar at 320-363-2113. The Title IX Coordinator(s) are available to discuss supportive resources with you or with students. If a concern is raised and the student feels most comfortable with you being present, you may accompany the student to a meeting with the Title IX Office.

Some students may not want the incident reported on campus. Providing confidential resources at the beginning of a semester can allow students a choice and voice in identifying their needs. Conversations with confidential resources are privileged, meaning that they cannot be disclosed to another without the reporter's consent, except in certain limited circumstances such as allegations involving the physical or sexual abuse of a person under 18 or an immediate and serious threat to any person or property.

Bailey Herbarium

Bailey Herbarium Goes Online: The CSB and SJU Bailey Herbarium, located in PENGL 329, is the largest private college herbarium (collection of pressed, labeled, identified plants) in Minnesota. We are working with scientists from the University of Minnesota Bell Museum to digitize our collections and make them available online. Workers at the UM have photographed all 32,000+ of our specimens and we are now working to upload them to the Bell Museum Biodiversity Atlas. To check out the specimens that have been uploaded so far, visit https://bellatlas.umn.edu/ and select Bailey Herbarium. What remains to be done is to examine the images of the remaining specimens and enter the data into a spreadsheet that can be uploaded into the Atlas. Much of this work is being done by volunteers through the Zooniverse website (Mapping Change project). Education Abroad Short-Term Programs 2024: I am writing to encourage you to consider applying to develop and direct a short-term education abroad program in spring or summer 2024. Short-term international education programs are unique opportunities for faculty to develop innovative and creative educational programs for CSB and SJU students. When to use the "+" Symbol: CSB+SJU - The plus symbol (+) is solely reserved for public relations, web buttons, social media and marketing materials. It should never be used in official communication without consultation with, and approval of, the marketing team and never be used on apparel.

When to use the "and": Use the "and" in official communication, policy documents, quantitative surveys, legal agreements and emails. Ex: College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University, Saint Ben's and Saint John's, CSB and SJU.

When to use CSBSJU: Never use CSBSJU without the "and" in between the acronyms.

When to use the slash: It is preferred that you use the "and" and not the slash. The slash is easily removed and then looks like CSBSJU, which is not to be used.

Title IX and Project EMBRACE

As an employee of CSB and SJU, you may have a student approach you with issues of sexual harassment, sexual assault, dating or domestic violence, and stalking. Incidents such as these often cause a student significant trauma. The impact of trauma can be experienced in many ways, including:

- · Behavior (feeling numb, distant, overwhelmed, anxious, etc.)
- Memory
- · Cognitive abilities (having difficulty focusing, completing tasks, etc.)
- · Physical health (stomach pain, gastrointestinal issues, headaches, etc.)

It is important to know the resources available to students. As a required reporter, you must report any known incident of sexual misconduct (broad term for the misconduct listed above) to the Title IX Office. The Title IX Coordinator(s) work together to provide support, resources, and reporting options to students, staff, and faculty. To report sexual misconduct, contact the CSB Title IX Coordinator, Tamara Hennes-Vix at 320-363-5943 or the Interim SJU Title IX Coordinator, Patty Weishaar at 320-363-2113. The Title IX Coordinator(s) are available to discuss supportive resources with you or with students. If a concern is raised and the student feels most comfortable with you being present, you may accompany the student to a meeting with the Title IX Office.

Some students may not want the incident reported on campus. Providing confidential resources at the beginning of a semester can allow students a choice and voice in identifying their needs. Conversations with confidential resources are privileged, meaning that they cannot be disclosed to another without the reporter's consent, except in certain limited circumstances such as allegations involving the physical or sexual abuse of a person under 18 or an immediate and serious threat to any person or property.

MPCC Virtual Workshop: "Humanizing Transfer: Key Faculty Practices" - Feb 28, 2023 3:00 PM Faculty from any major are invited to join the Minnesota Private College Council for a virtual workshop on Feb 28th, from 3:00-4:30 pm. Title IX and Project EMBRACE

January was National Stalking Awareness Month and February is National Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month. Stalking is a pattern of behavior directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to feel substantial emotional distress or fear for the person's safety or the safety of others. Dating violence is defined as violence committed by a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim. Dating Violence includes, but is not limited to, sexual or physical abuse, such as physical harm, bodily injury, or criminal assault, or the threat of such abuse.

Stalking and Dating violence are against the law and both can be a violation of the <u>Title IX and Sexual Misconduct Policy of the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University</u>.

MPCC Virtual Workshop: "Humanizing Transfer: Key Faculty Practices" - Feb 28, 2023 3:00 PM Faculty from any major are invited to join the Minnesota Private College Council for a virtual workshop on Feb 28th, from 3:00-4:30 pm. Center for Teaching and Learning Spring 2023 Faculty Fellows Program

Overview

The Center for Teaching and Learning (CTL) Spring 2023 Faculty Fellows Program has two primary purposes: 1) to increase the capacity of the CTL to carry out existing and expanded activities during the CTL director's sabbatical leave, and 2) to provide Fellows with professional development and leadership opportunities at the intersection of their interests/expertise and the CTL's strategic priorities during the first year of its rollout: new faculty programing, inclusive pedagogies, and innovative faculty development opportunities to promote effective teaching practices and meaningful learning for our students.

Two CTL Fellows will be selected for Spring 2023. Depending on the individual circumstances, this assignment may result in either a 1/6 overload or could replace a previously planned assignment for the term. The Dean of the Faculty and Department Chair would be consulted to determine the structure of the assignment.

Position Responsibilities: CTL Spring 2023 Faculty Fellow responsibilities will include:

- Assuming an active leadership role in supporting one of the CTL's two strategic priorities during the first year of its rollout—namely, a) programing for new faculty or b) the Spring 2023 inclusive teaching series with CSB/SJU HHMI Inclusive Excellence Grant Team.
- Designing and facilitating a significant faculty development opportunity, such as faculty workshop or reading group series, in area of interest/expertise that seeks to promote effective teaching practices and meaningful student learning
- Working with the CTL Director to learn to conduct small group analyses (SGAs) and/or teaching observations, and conducting at least 3-5 of these consultations during the semester of the award
- Attending CTL advisory and faculty development meetings (approximately one per month) to assist with CTL planning and collaborative partnerships, such as the CSB/SJU HHMI Inclusive Excellence Grant Team, Instructional Technology, and the Interim Dean of Curriculum and Assessment
- Submitting a 1-page summary report to the CTL director no later than two months after the end date of the award.

Eligibility: In order to be eligible for a CTL Faculty Fellowship, a faculty member:

• Must have completed at least five years of full-time undergraduate teaching;

- Must have a benefits-eligible contract during the application award year; and
- Must not be on sabbatical or have a Scholarship and Creative Work Award during the Spring of 2023.

Process:

A selection committee chaired by the Director of the CTL and the CTL advisory board* will review applications and make recommendations to the Dean of Faculty, who will announce the final award winners. The selection committee will prioritize recommending Fellows with distinct yet complementary goals and areas of expertise and will attempt to spread the awards across departments.

Selection Criteria:

Evaluation of applications will be based on documented interest and previous engagement in faculty development, demonstration of effectiveness in teaching, strong collaboration and listening skills, and commitment to supporting the CTL's strategic priorities during the first year of our rollout (new faculty programing, inclusive pedagogies, and faculty development opportunities to promote effective teaching practices and meaningful learning for our students).

Applications Guidelines: CTL Faculty Fellowships are awarded on a competitive basis. To apply, please submit a complete application with the following materials by **Mon, Oct. 17**th at **3pm.**

- 1. A letter of interest (maximum 2 single-spaced pages) describing
 - a. Which of the CTL's first-year strategic priorities you would be interested in leading/supporting during the spring of 2023 (a) programing for new faculty or b) the inclusive teaching series with CSB/SJU HHMI Inclusive Excellence Grant Team) and how you see your skills and interests supporting this initiative;
 - b. An area of interest or expertise in teaching and learning on which would like to design at least one significant faculty development opportunity, such as a workshop or reading group;
 - Your experience with and commitment to faculty development at CSB/SJU (including the position responsibilities of a CTL Faculty Fellow outlined above);
 and
 - d. Your experience with and commitment to supporting diversity, equity, and inclusion in teaching and learning.


- 2. A teaching activities summary (maximum 2 single-spaced pages), including the following information:
 - a. List of courses taught at CSB/SJU within the past 5 years, indicating teaching contributions to general education (Common Curriculum and/or Integrations Curriculum), departments and programs (including interdisciplinary programs and honors), or other campus teaching initiatives (e.g., study abroad, undergraduate research, etc.)
 - b. Brief description of teaching innovations employed in courses;
 - c. Participation or leadership in professional development opportunities during the last 5 years, including diversity, equity, and inclusion training;
 - d. Pedagogical (Scholarship of Teaching and Learning--SoTL) presentations, publications, or grant activity.
- 3. Department Chair Approval Form (a Forms Manager that needs to be submitted by your Department Chair) or in the case of Chairs applying, from the Interim Dean of Curriculum and Assessment. You will receive a confirmation email when your Department Chair has submitted the form.

Directions for Submission:

- Completed applications should be submitted by Oct. 17th, 2022 at 3pm.
- The letter of interest and teaching activities summary should be submitted as a single pdf file HERE

Fall 2023 College Success Course (INTG 105) Call for Instructors

Faculty and staff interested in serving first-year students are strongly encouraged to <u>apply to teach</u> <u>INTG 105 College Success in Fall 2023</u>. The College Success course is a fundamental component of dedicated programming for incoming CSB and SJU students that we call the First-Year Experience (FYX). Through the course instructors have an opportunity to serve as an early point of connection for new students and help set them up for success at CSB and SJU.

Course Description:

The purpose of this 1-credit course is to help entering first-year students make a successful transition to CSB and SJU. The course aims to: foster a sense of belonging, promote engagement in curricular and co-curricular campus life, and facilitate skill development for academic success at CSB and SJU.

Course Format:

The course meets once per week for 55 minutes throughout fall semester. Each section of the course is assigned a peer mentor who has been competitively selected and trained to provide personalized guidance and mentorship to first-year students in the INTG 105 course.

All INTG 105 instructors are employees at CSB and SJU, either faculty or professional staff, and come from a variety of departments and programs across the campuses. Instructors receive training from the First-Year Experience (FYX) and INTG 105 course director beginning with an orientation in April and concluding with a formal course preparation workshop in August. Ongoing support during the class term is provided by the INTG 105 course director.

INTG 105 is not a lecture-based class; rather, students will reflect on information provided in the course, engage in discussions, and complete practical assignments that help prepare them for their college experience. For example, students will be asked to attend the "Involvement Fair" and the "Academic Exploration Fair" at different points during the term and then connect what was learned to their college success through written reflection and group discussions. The course is capped at 26 students per section and will be offered at various times across both campuses. See the <u>application</u> form for additional details.

Syllabus and Canvas Site

The INTG 105 syllabus, weekly lesson plans, and Canvas course are all created in advance and provided for instructors. Lessons plans have been developed in coordination with experienced INTG 105 instructors and have been adapted over time based on assessments in the course. While course content is set in advance to achieve consistency, instructors are encouraged to add their own talents and skillsets to the classroom.

The course Canvas site will contain all necessary course assignments and materials. All instructors are expected to use the course Canvas page including operation of the gradebook.

Instructor Requirements and Stipend Information:

INTG 105 Instructors must have a minimum of a master's degree to teach the course. Professional staff are encouraged to speak with their supervisor prior to applying. Faculty are advised to consult with their department or program chair. Instructors receive a 1-credit course rate stipend and for AY 2023-24, that stipend is \$1364.

Instructor Support:

The College Success Course director will provide support for instructors and peer mentors throughout the semester via check-in meetings and use of Microsoft Teams. Instructors and Peer Mentors will each have a dedicated Microsoft Teams site where updates and announcements will be posted. Each site also serves as a communication tool and forum where questions can be posted and answered.



Community as Rebellion:
A Syllabus for Surviving Academia as a Woman of Color.
By Lorgia García Peña.
Chicago, IL: Haymarket Books, 2022.

The CSB/SJU HHMI Inclusive Excellence Grant team and the Center for Teaching and Learning (CTL) are hosting a book club to read and discuss Dr. Lorgia García Peña's new book, Community as Rebellion: A Syllabus for Surviving Academia as a Woman of Color

- The book club will meet two times during the spring semester; and Dr. García Peña will join the book club virtually for their second meeting.
- The first 10 participants to sign up for the book group will receive a free copy of the book.



BOOK DESCRIPTION:

Community as Rebellion offers a meditation on creating liberatory spaces for students and faculty of color within academia. Through personal experiences and analytical reflections, García Peña invites us—in particular Black, Indigenous, Latinx, and Asian women—to engage in liberatory practices of boycott, abolition, and radical community-building to combat the academic world's tokenizing and exploitative structures.

She argues that the classroom is key to freedom-making in the university, urging teachers to consider activism and social justice as central to what she calls "teaching in freedom": a progressive form of collective learning that prioritizes the subjugated knowledge, silenced histories, and epistemologies from the Global South and Indigenous, Black, and brown communities. By teaching in and for freedom, we not only acknowledge the harm that the university has inflicted on our persons and our ways of knowing since its inception, but also create alternative ways to be, create, live, and succeed through our work.


Dorothy Day, OblSB

When Pope Francis described Catholic Worker Movement co-founder Dorothy Day as "one of four great Americans," her Wikipedia page immediately crashed as puzzled listeners sought clarification. Eligibility:

The Jennifer Galovich Award is awarded to a CSB and SJU faculty member. Nominees will have completed at least three full years of full-time teaching at CSB and SJU at the time of application.

Criteria:

Submissions, which include both the nominating letter and the materials provided by the nominee, will be reviewed based on a rubric using the criteria for service to the College [University] outlined in the Faculty Handbook (Section 2.5.4.1):

- Ongoing service on departmental [and/or School of Theology] committees, effective participation in meetings and in decision-making, curriculum development, and assessment processes of the department;
- Effective participation in faculty assemblies, on college [university] standing committees, and on other faculty committees (e.g., for planning, assessment, accreditation);
- Leadership roles in governance, faculty development, curriculum design, and/or other activities of the college [university];
- Service as chair of a department, a division, or a committee;
- Service as director of a program; leader in other faculty, professional or college [university] programs or associations; and/or
- Representation of one or both institutions to the local, regional, national, or international community.

Nomination Process:





Robert Glick is the author of the short story collection *Two Californias* (C&R Press, 2019) and an Associate Professor of English at the Rochester Institute of Technology, where he teaches creative writing, electronic literature, and the occasional course on zombies. His work has been published in *Diagram, Denver Quarterly*, and *Gettysburg Review*. More recently, excerpts from his just-completed novel, *The Asterisms*, have won competitions in *Summer Literary Seminars* and *New Ohio Review*.

SISTER MARY GRELL AND ROBERT L. SPAETH TEACHER OF DISTINCTION AWARD

Purpose:

This award, named in honor of Sister Mary Grell and Robert L. Spaeth, recognizes outstanding and innovative undergraduate teaching.

Sister Mary Grell taught biology for 30 years beginning in 1933 and was CSB president from 1963-68. She later served as superior of dependent priory of Saint Anselm's College in Manchester, N.H., before her death in 1981.

Professor Robert L. Spaeth served as dean of the college at SJU for nine years in addition to offering lengthy terms of service as professor of liberal studies and director of Freshman Symposium, before his death in 1994.

Award:

The award, featuring an honorarium and commemorative plaque, is announced and recipient honored at the Academic Affairs Awards Ceremony in May.

It has been a customary expectation for the recipient of the Sister Mary Grell and Robert L. Spaeth Awards to present an opening address at Fall Convocation.

Eligibility:

The Sister Mary Grell and Robert L. Spaeth Teacher of Distinction Award is now awarded to a faculty member with EITHER a College of St. Benedict or a St. John's University contract. Nominees will have completed at least three full years of full-time teaching at CSB | SJU at the time of application and not have received one of these awards in the last ten years.

Criteria:

The Faculty Development and Research Committee (FDRC) will review applications based on a rubric using the criteria for effective teaching outlined in the Faculty Handbook (Section 2.5.1):

- command of one's field and its ongoing development as related to curricular needs
- ability to identify course-appropriate student learning goals
- integration of effective pedagogies and course materials to promote student learning
- frequent use of student feedback to improve goals, pedagogies, and materials
- integration of college, university, and departmental goals and values into course goals and methods
- ability to help students relate one's discipline to other areas of knowledge and to the liberal arts tradition
- skill in communicating with students
- ability to provoke and broaden student interest in subject matter

- redesign of existing courses and development of new courses appropriate to the Academic Commitments to the Mission and goals of the college, university and department
- ongoing pattern of effort to improve teaching effectiveness

Nomination Process

Any member of the CSB and SJU community may submit nominations by <u>11:59 p.m. on Sunday</u>, <u>February 5, 2023</u> at the following link: https://www.csbsju.edu/forms/TSS4ANM78L

Nominators will need to attach a letter addressed to FDRC describing how the faculty member meets one or more of the criteria for effective teaching described above.

Nominees for the awards will be forwarded to FDRC, which will contact them to have materials submitted.

The **deadline for nominee materials submission is** <u>11:59 p.m. on Monday, March 13, 2023.</u>

Nominees will be notified via email and sent a separate form for submitting their application materials.

Submission of Materials and Format:

- Brief cover page with name, position, department
- Brief Curriculum Vitae (Limited to 2-4 pages, listing courses taught at CSB/SJU, and any scholarship or service directly related to teaching or pedagogy improvement).
- Philosophy of teaching statement.
- A statement summarizing the quality of teaching accomplishments and evidence of teaching excellence. Evidence may include assessment data on student learning outcomes, student course survey data and responses, or other information demonstrating outstanding teaching.
- Letters of Support from two current or past students demonstrating one or more of the criteria outlined above. Two letters only.
- Letter of Support from one faculty colleague demonstrating one or more of the criteria outlined above and with direct knowledge of the quality of the applicant's teaching.
 Preferably, the letter should come from a colleague who has recently observed one of the applicant's classes. One letter only.

^{*}We are asking nominees NOT to submit additional materials beyond these items and support letters. Any additional materials will be returned to the candidate.

Evaluation:

The FDRC will select the recipient based on information provided by the nominee, faculty colleagues, and students.

LINDA MEALEY FACULTY/STUDENT COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH AND CREATIVITY AWARD

Purpose:

The Linda Mealey Award recognizes teacher/scholars who are excellent teachers and who are especially effective in collaborating with CSB/SJU students on scholarly or creative projects.

Linda Mealey, who died in 2002, was a member of the CSB|SJU Psychology Department for nearly two decades. She was a prolific scholar and mentored scores of student researchers. During her professional career, Linda published 10 book chapters, a full-length textbook, more than 20 articles in peer-reviewed journals, more than 30 brief communications and commentaries, more than two dozen book reviews and presented more than 50 papers and posters at professional meetings and conferences.

Award:

The award, featuring an honorarium and commemorative plaque, is announced and the recipient honored at the Academic Affairs Awards Ceremony in May.

Eligibility:

Nominees will have completed at least three full years of full-time teaching at CSB/SJU at the time of application and not have received this award in the last ten years.

Criteria:

The Faculty Development and Research Committee (FDRC) will review applications based on a rubric using criteria consistent with excellence in effectively collaborating with CSB/SJU students on scholarly or creative projects as outlined below:

- collaborative work with students independent of normal classroom teaching
- active involvement with student research or independent student creative work (e.g. Senior Theses, senior recitals, artistic displays or performance and summer research programs)
- creative and effective teaching that incorporates the faculty member's scholarship or creative accomplishments
- command of one's field and its ongoing development as related to curricular needs
- ability to help students relate one's discipline to other areas of knowledge and to the liberal arts tradition
- skill in communicating with students
- ability to provoke and broaden student interest in subject matter

Nomination Process

Any member of the CSB/SJU community may submit nominations by <u>11:59 p.m. on Sunday</u>, <u>February 5, 2023</u> at the following link: https://www.csbsju.edu/forms/CJLTD11JWS

Nominators will need to attach a letter addressed to FDRC summarizing the faculty member's collaborative accomplishments.

A list of finalists will be forwarded to FDRC, who will contact colleagues to have materials submitted.

The **deadline for nominee materials submission is 11:59 p.m. on Monday, March 13, 2023.**Nominees will be notified via email and sent a separate form for submitting their application materials.

Submission of Materials and Format:

- Letters of Support from two current or past students demonstrating one or more of the criteria outlined above. Two letters only.
- Letter of Support from one faculty colleague demonstrating one or more of the criteria outlined above. Preferably, the letter should come from a colleague who has direct knowledge of the applicant's collaborative work with students and the quality of teaching incorporating scholarship or creative work. One letter only.

S. LINDA KULZER GENDER EDUCATOR AWARD

Eligibility:

The Sister Linda Kulzer Gender Educator Award will be presented to a CSB or SJU faculty member. Nominees should have completed at least three years of full-time teaching and may be either junior or senior faculty. Involvement with the Gender Studies Department is not required of nominees. Faculty who have received the Gender Educator's award during the past ten years will not be eligible (see bolded list above).

Selection process and due dates:

- **February 14, 2023**: nominations due via forms manager <u>Sister Linda Kulzer Gender</u> Education Award Nomination Form
- **February 27, 2023:** submission of CVs for all nominees, via forms manager, with faculty member's gender contributions highlighted (nominees will be contacted via email with a link to submit their CV)
- March 30, 2023: due date for faculty members who are invited by the selection committee to submit a complete application (candidates will be contacted via email with a link to submit their complete application).
- April 7, 2023: award recipient notified
- May 2022: award recipient announced

Criteria:

A candidate in this area has contributed to students' gender education through curricular leadership, courses taught, scholarship, and/or mentoring of students independent of normal classroom teaching. Overall, this person will have demonstrated leadership and fostered an atmosphere that encourages exploring gender issues from many angles.

Nominations:

Faculty and students can nominate suitable faculty individuals for the Sister Linda Kulzer Gender Educator Award. While not all candidates will be equally strong in all of the following areas, nominations should include information about the following, especially as concerns the candidate's contributions to gender education:

- the quality and scope of the candidate's teaching, providing specific details and examples where possible;
- the candidate's scholarly and/or creative achievements;
- the candidate's contributions to the larger community and students' gender education, outside of the classroom;
- the candidate's leadership in fostering gender education.

Complete applications of nominated who are selected to submit a file should include the following documents (to be submitted by the candidate via Forms Manager):

Statement explaining how the candidate sees her/his work as advancing our institutional

commitment to gender education and development;

- Curriculum vitae with service;
- Supporting documents (if applicable) at the discretion of the candidate;
- Two letters from students/alumni in a course that had significant gender content;
- One letter of support from a faculty colleague or department chair familiar with nominees' teaching.
