**Function/Description of the Position**: Outdoor U is committed to promote the understanding, use and enjoyment of the natural world by all CSB|SJU students, especially those from historically underrepresented and marginalized communities. Multiple Inclusion Assistants will work as a team with Outdoor U full-time and student staff to advance our mission to provide environmental education and outdoor recreation opportunities campus-wide, including working to build relationships and reduce barriers to access and participation. This position will also participate in the continuing education of Outdoor U staff regarding the history of racism, access, and inclusion in the outdoors. Guiding principles will be taken from the <u>CSB|SJU Inclusion Visioning Statement</u>, <u>Outdoor U statement on environmental and racial justice</u>, and new strategic planning goals Outdoor U is developing with <u>Equity in Environmental Education</u>.

## **Duties & Responsibilities:**

- Build and maintain relationships campus-wide with the intent to broaden access to Outdoor U services and programs to underrepresented and marginalized students
- Create, organize, and execute campus wide events and activities with a focus on inclusion and equity in the outdoors (ex. <u>Earth Week</u> in 2021)
- Identify barriers students have which prevent access to the outdoors; suggest and implement ways to reduce those barriers
- Attend and help to plan staff meetings and trainings, including the Outdoor U Student Leadership Team
- Promote and raise the profile of our <u>Nature's Narratives</u> project
- Other duties as needed.

## Minimum Qualifications to perform the duties of the position:

- Commitment to having cultural agility possessing the skills, knowledge, and abilities necessary to provide leadership in a diverse community
- Enthusiasm for the outdoors and excitement to share it with others
- Demonstrated ability to create connections and relationships with individuals and campus groups
- Strong written and verbal communication skills needed.
- Must be reliable, trustworthy, and able to work independently as well as with others.
- A criminal background check is required for this position and the offer of employment will be contingent upon receipt of a successful background check.
