ABSTRACT: Collection contains records of the Institute for Ecumenical and Cultural Research, later named Collegeville Institute for Ecumenical and Cultural Research, founded in 1967 to provide a setting for theological study and interchange of ideas by resident scholars from diverse Christian traditions.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE: The records of the Institute for Ecumenical and Cultural Research include minutes, correspondence, reports, photographs, and financial records. There are documents related to donors and benefactors, and to resident scholars. A significant portion of the collection details the "Faith and Ferment" project, an interdisciplinary study of Christian culture in Minnesota in the late 1970s and early 1980s. Smaller segments of the collection are dedicated to topics including black theology, hope, constructive theology, and women in the Church.

ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY: The Institute for Ecumenical and Cultural Research was founded in 1967. The Institute offers scholars the opportunity to engage in an extended research project in Christian theology in a residential, ecumenical environment. Since 2009, the Institute also offers programs for literary writers who explore Christian themes. Fr. Kilian McDonnell, OSB was the founder and first executive director of the Institute for Ecumenical and Cultural Research. Since 1973 he has been president of the Institute. In 2006, the official name became Collegeville Institute for Ecumenical and Cultural Research. The Executive Directors have been:
