Registration Eligibility

Current and Continuing Students

Continuing students register online using Banner Web Self Service during the advance registration period. When registering for courses for the coming term, please follow the registration instructions carefully. Proper registration is the student's responsibility. If you have questions about registration, contact the Office of Student Records and Registration at 320.363.3396 or registration@csbsju.edu.

Continuing students are eligible to register only if they have:

- Met with their advisor and obtained their registration pin number
- Settled all current charges with the Student Accounts Office
- Complied with Minnesota immunization regulations
- Submitted a final High School transcript (applies to first-year students)
- Completed the mandated sexual misconduct training (applies to first semester, new students)
- Been accepted to a major by a department (applies only if a junior or senior during the next full term.)
- Applied for graduation (applies to all seniors or 4th year students)
- Have no other outstanding holds on their registration

We strongly urge you to meet with your advisor early and enter your registration on Banner Web Self Service on the date provided by your advisor. Delaying your registration will affect course selection and availability.

Students who are ineligible to register for any of these reasons may register on Banner Web Self Service after they have cleared all registration holds.

New Incoming Students

New Students will be registered by Academic Advising for their first term at CSB and SJU. Please complete the CSB and SJU Advising and Registration Form, located in the Forms Portal, (<https://apps.csbsju.edu/enrolledstudents/>) in order to provide the Academic Advising Office with accurate information to complete your initial class registration.

Registration Adjustments

Registration adjustments (Drop/Add) can be completed on Banner Web Self Service through the 5th class day of each semester. You will need your registration pin number that you received from your advisor. To drop a course after the 5th day of the semester, you must complete the appropriate online request form available at Office of Student Records and Registration Online Forms or come to the Office of Student Records and Registration at SJU (Quad 163). See also: Drop/Add Instructions (p. 18)

Listings of cancelled or closed courses will be electronically updated in the Class Schedule on Banner Web Self Service. Students should check whether a space has become available in a course that was previously closed. Full term courses may be added through the first 5 class days of the semester.

If a course is closed, check whether there are any other sections of the same course that have spaces available in them and register for an alternate section. If this option is not available to you, consider alternate courses and register accordingly. Your advisor is a good resource to help determine an appropriate alternate. In some cases, it may be appropriate for the department chair or instructor to "override" a student beyond the course limit. Override registrations are completed by the student using the appropriate the Override Request Form.

Withdrawal from the College, any student who decides to discontinue either during the semester or between semesters must complete the proper withdrawal form with the Residence Life Office at Saint Benedict's or with the Campus Life Office at Saint John's.

No official record of attendance for that term is kept if a student withdraws from school during the first 20 days of the semester. Students who withdraw from school after that date, but before the final 16 class days of the semester, receive a grade of "W" for all courses registered for that semester. Official withdrawal during the last 16 class days of any semester is not possible.

Students who have withdrawn from Saint Benedict's or Saint John's and intend to return to continue their studies may apply for readmission to the colleges. Consult the Admission Office, admissions@csbsju.edu, for further information.

Minnesota Students Eligible for The Minnesota State Grant Program

Minnesota students eligible for the Minnesota Grant Program must register for and attend a minimum of 15 credits each semester to receive a Minnesota Grant at the full-time student rate. Students who register for 12-14 credits may still receive a Minnesota Grant, but the award amount will be substantially reduced.

For all other financial aid programs, 12 credits is considered full-time.

The Office of Student Records and Registration will also utilize tools in the HIVE such as flags, to-do's, referrals, and high fives to communicate concerns regarding Graduation Requirements, the need to Apply for Graduation and other processes impacting your registration. If you see a message from The HIVE (<https://csbsju.starfishsolutions.com/starfish-ops/>) please be sure to take action as needed based on the specific flag/to-do/referral being raised.

Also, please make sure you're logged into myCSBSJU (<http://my.csbsju.edu/dashboard/>) to receive important campus information and announcements. myCSBSJU (<http://my.csbsju.edu/dashboard/>) is your one-stop-shop for all other information and services at Saint Ben's and Saint John's!

- Full semester course - use for weeks 2-4 of semester.
- Mod courses - use during the 1st third (1/3) of the course, see dates listed above
- Distinguished Thesis -
 - All College Thesis Proposal, COLG 396, perm drop request must be submitted by October 31st of the senior year
 - All College Thesis, COLG 398, perm drop request must be submitted by March 1st of the senior year

**Withdraw from a course (<https://apps.csbsju.edu/registrar/forms/withdraw/>) - Use this form to withdraw from a course with a grade of "W" noted on your transcript

- Full semester course - use after first 4 weeks of the semester
- Mod courses - use during the 2nd third of the course, see dates listed above
- Distinguished Thesis - a "W" will be entered for all requests made after the above permanent drop dates for distinguished thesis

PREPARE FOR REGISTRATION

Prior to Registration, schedule an appointment with your primary faculty advisor. The advising period typically takes place two weeks prior to the start of registration. **Consultation with your faculty advisor is required prior to registration.**

Your primary faculty advisor is listed in Banner Web Self-Service (<http://www.csbsju.edu/it-services/banner/>), on Degree Works (<https://dw.csbsju.edu/>) and on your Network in The HIVE (<https://csbsju.starfishsolutions.com/starfish-ops/>).

Plan ahead and create a schedule

Develop a class schedule that helps you progress toward your degree. Degree Works can help you determine outstanding Integrations Curriculum and major/minor requirements.

Review course offerings

- Consider balance between major/minor/Integrations Curriculum courses
- Consider balance courses that may require more/less focus
- Know what classes you NEED to take, as well as those you WANT to take
- Have a back-up plan in case your first choice courses are unavailable at your time of registration

Draft your tentative schedule(s) for review with your faculty advisor using:

- Plan Ahead feature in Banner Web Registration. Students may create up to 3 plans for Registration.
 - **NEW! If you have a plan that is Active and Preferred in Degree Works, you can use that to pull your planned classes into Web Registration.** Simply go to Web Registration, then Plan Ahead. Once in Plan Ahead, click the Create New Plan button, then go to the Tab for Degree Works Plans. You can then click View Sections to pick from available sections of the classes you have planned for the term. More information about Degree Works Plans is available here (<https://my.csbsju.edu/#SEPPlan>).
 - It is suggested that students create a DW plan before meeting with their Faculty Advisor to obtain their PIN for registration. At the advising meeting, review the DW Plan, then the Advisor can mark one Degree Works plan as Preferred and Active.
- The registration workshee (<http://www.csbsju.edu/documents/Registrar/forms/M-F%20worksheet.pdf>), as a template for making your daily schedule.

Registration PIN

Upon approval of your proposed schedule, your faculty advisor will issue your registration PIN which is required for registration in Banner. Record this registration pin for future reference. New registration pins are issued for each registration period. PINs are sent to Faculty Advisors two weeks prior to the start of registration.

If you are unsure if you have a correct/valid registration pin, you can always verify your pin by attempting to log into class registration. If you attempt to login with an invalid registration pin, you will get the following

error message "Invalid alternate pin, please try again." Follow up with your faculty advisor, department chair or Academic Advising, as needed.

Check for Registration Holds

To be cleared for registration, all students must have:

- Settled (paid) their student account with the college
- Complied with Minnesota immunization regulations
- Have an approved faculty advisor

Other processes that could add a hold to your registration include:

- 1st semester first years - students must have a final High School transcript on file
- 1st semester new students - all students must have completed the mandated sexual misconduct training
- 1st semester junior - students must be accepted or conditionally accepted to a major by the end of their 2nd year
- Seniors - Seniors who are 1 semester from completing their degree must have a degree application prior to registration for their final semester

Course Load

For undergraduate students a typical course load will be 16 credits comprised of four 4-credit courses.

Keep in mind:

- Variations may occur due to need for 1, 2, or 3 credit courses in some programs.
- **Minimum**- Enrollment in 12 credits is required to maintain full-time student ("in-residence") status and having less than 12 credits may impact your financial aid.
- **MN State Grant**- Minnesota students receiving Minnesota State Grant funds must enroll in at least 15 credits to receive the full awarded grant amount.
- **Maximum** - The enrollment maximum is 18 credits
- **Overload** - Credits in excess of 18 may only be attempted by students in good academic standing and special approval from Academic Advising. Additional Fees may apply. See Credit Overload (p. 24) for additional information

REGISTRATION PRIORITY

HOW ARE REGISTRATION TIMES DETERMINED?

Registration days are assigned to cohort groups (entry year at CSB/SJU). We then assign registration times within each cohort by credit ranges —both earned, including transfer and AP credits, and registered credits (reflected as “Credits Applied” in Degree Works).

NOTE: Students will receive a personal email notification that indicates their registration date and time.

A student’s cohort group is the group of students who began college in the same year.

TRANSFER STUDENTS:

We approximate cohort groups based on credit ranges. We then assign times within each cohort group by number of “Credits Applied”, earned and registered combined.

REGISTRATION PINS:

Pins are sent to the primary advisor for every student. These registration pins will be sent to advisors next week. Students must visit with their advisor to obtain their individually assigned pin number.

REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

SEARCH FOR COURSES

General Course Search - Web Registration

- Go to Banner Web Registration (select your school CSB (<https://registration.csbsju.edu/StudentRegistrationSsb/ssb/registration/?mepCode=B>)| SJU (<https://registration.csbsju.edu/StudentRegistrationSsb/ssb/registration/?mepCode=J>))
- Search for courses in either Plan Ahead, Browse for Classes, or Register for Classes to review classes for a particular term
- Select the term you wish to search from the drop-down menu then click continue
- Enter criteria you wish to search
- Click on Search

Note - you can utilize the Advance Search option to search for a course in a Course Number Range such as 300 to 399 to find only Upper Division Courses, to narrow your search to certain days of the week, or to find only open sections.

How to Search for Integrations Designations

There are multiple ways to identify which courses carry designations for the Intergrations Curriculum each term. You can search for courses with AR, QR, WR, BN, CI, CS, AS, AE, HE, SW, NW, TE, TI, Thematic Encounter, Thematic Focus, EX, GL, LI designations as outlined below.

Attribute Search - Banner Web Registration

- Go to Banner Web Registration (select your school CSB (<https://registration.csbsju.edu/StudentRegistrationSsb/ssb/registration/?mepCode=B>)| SJU (<https://registration.csbsju.edu/StudentRegistrationSsb/ssb/registration/?mepCode=J>))
- Search for courses in either Plan Ahead, Browse for Classes, or Register for Classes to review classes for a particular term
- Select the term you wish to search from the drop-down menu then click continue
- Use Attribute Search to look for Integrations Requirements i.e. AR, QR, WR, BN, CI, CS, AS, AE, HE, SW, NW, TE, TI, Thematic Encounter, Thematic Focus, EX, GL, LI.
 - Enter the designation you wish to search by **in the Attribute Box**, you can do this by typing the code, such as QR or HE, or you may type full words such as Focus, Systems, Quantitative, etc.
 - As you type, click on the option you wish to search when it pops up in the search window, you must click on the designation to add it to the search box.
- Click on Search
- The attribute search will return courses that have been designations in the Integrations Curriculum
 - Review the attribute column on the search results you will see which designations a course has for example, "Artistic Expression (AE)", "Thematic Focus - Truth", "CSD: Systems (CS)".

Class Search Tool

New/Improved for Spring 2026 Registration! There is a new way to search for classes! Use the Class Search (<https://catalog.csbsju.edu/course-search/>) tool to look for classes with Integrations Designations. Find the tool in the left menu of this page, look for "Search for Courses" or follow this link (<https://catalog.csbsju.edu/course-search/>). Select the appropriate term, then go to the drop down the drop down for "Course Designations" and select the designation you are looking for, refine your search to narrow down options and find classes that fit your schedule. Don't forget to reset your search if you want to clear your criteria and start over. This tool makes it easier than ever to explore course offerings and plan your semester.

- Go to Course Schedules | CSB+SJU (<https://catalog.csbsju.edu/archive/2024-2025/registration/course-schedule/>)
- Select the term you wish to look find courses in
- Open the PDF. Look for "Courses that Fulfill Intergrations Requirements" the table of contents.
- Next either navigate to the page indicated or click on menu item which should take you to the correct page.
- Scroll through the pages to review the courses offered under each designation

How to Search for Interdisciplinary Major/Minor Courses

There are multiple ways to search for classes that meet the requirements for interdisciplinary majors or minor like Ancient Mediterranean Studies, Climate Studies, Data Analysis, Data Science, Environmental Studies, Entrepreneurship, Finance, Gender Studies, Global Health, Narrative Practice, Neuroscience, Secondary Education, Teaching English as a Second Language.

Keyword Search - Banner Web Registration

- Go to Banner Web Registration (select your school CSB (<https://registration.csbsju.edu/StudentRegistrationSsb/ssb/registration/?mepCode=B>)| SJU (<https://registration.csbsju.edu/StudentRegistrationSsb/ssb/registration/?mepCode=J>))
- Search for courses in either Browse for Classes (available to faculty/staff and students), Plan Ahead, or Register for Classes to review classes for a particular term
- Select the term you wish to search from the drop-down menu then click continue
- Enter Major/Minor code **in the Keyword Search Box** i.e. GEND, CLIM, DATA, DSCI, ENTR, ENVR, FINA, GLHH, GLAC, LLAS, NARP, NEUR, SCED, TESL, or TEIL
- Click on Search
- The Key Word Search will return courses that have been identified as a course interdisciplinary program
 - Review the attribute column on the search results you will see "Environmental Studies Option", "Climate Studies Option", "Global Health Option" etc.

Class Search Tool

New/Improved for Spring 2026 Registration! There is a new way to search for classes! The Class Search (<https://catalog.csbsju.edu/course-search/>) tool has replaced the previous Interdisciplinary Class Search tool. Find the tool in the left menu of this page, look for "Search for Courses" or follow this link (<https://catalog.csbsju.edu/course-search/>). Select the appropriate term, then go to the drop down for

"Interdisciplinary Program" and select your program to find course offerings for the selected term. Refine your search to narrow down options that fit additional criteria and find classes that fit your schedule. Don't forget to reset your search if you want to clear your criteria and start over. This tool makes it easier than ever to explore course offerings and plan your semester.

HOW TO LOG IN TO BANNER WEB REGISTRATION

1. Go to CSB (<https://registration.csbsju.edu/StudentRegistrationSsb/ssb/registration/?mepCode=B>)| SJU (<https://registration.csbsju.edu/StudentRegistrationSsb/ssb/registration/?mepCode=J>)
2. Click on "Register for classes"
3. Enter Network Username
4. Enter Network Password
5. Click "Login"

After logging in successfully - Add Courses:

1. Select the appropriate semester from the terms open for registration
2. Enter Registration PIN number*
3. Click "Continue"
4. Find courses via "Find Classes," "Enter CRNs," or "Plans" tab
 - If searching, click "Add" to a course to the summary panel
 - If using CRNs, enter the CRNs and click on "Add to Summary"
 - If using a plan, locate your plan and click the "Add All" button.
5. After you have found and added classes, click the "Submit" button located in the summary panel to register for classes

When adding a variable credit course and you need to adjust the credits

1. While in student registration, click on "Schedule and Options" tab
2. Locate the course with variable credit
3. Click on the number in the "Hours" column, and enter new credit hours
4. Click "Submit" button at the bottom of the page

To reMOVE a course

1. From the summary panel, select the action "Drop/Delete Course" from the dropdown menu
2. Click "Submit" to save your changes

***Please note:** You need your registration pin # to add or drop courses

- New undergraduate students cannot use Banner Self Service to make changes in their first term at CSB and SJU. New students need to work with Academic Advising to make any adjustments to their schedule.
- New graduate students should work with the program advisor in the SOT or Graduate Nursing Program to make changes to their schedule.
- Returning Students may drop and add courses in Banner Self-Service through the first 5 days of a semester.

ADDING A CLASS

- During the Registration Period through the 5th day of the semester – no instructor consent needed, register for courses using Banner Web Self-Service – <http://www.csbsju.edu/it-services/banner> (<https://www.csbsju.edu/it-services/banner/>)
- After Day 5 of the semester – instructor consent needed, registration must be made by submitting an add request form available on the Office of Student Records and Registration Online Forms (<https://my.csbsju.edu/pages/registrar-online-forms/>)page.

AUDITING A CLASS

1. Students intending to audit a course (earn no credit) are required to complete an Audit Change of Status Form (<https://forms.csbsju.edu/registrar/audit-change-of-status/>) – during the first week of class.
2. When auditing a course, students are expected to attend all regular classes.
3. Change of Status
 - A student who begins a semester registered for credit may change to audit status any time during the first 4 weeks of the semester.
 - A student who begins a semester auditing a course may change to credit-bearing status ONLY during the 1st week of the semester.
4. Courses audited are not included in determining the total credits earned toward a major, total credits earned toward a degree, or in the calculation of the cumulative grade point average.
5. The credit value of any audited course is calculated in the assessment of tuition.

DROPPING A CLASS

- During the Registration Period through the 5th day of the semester – Drop a full-term course using Banner Web Self-Service (<https://www.csbsju.edu/it-services/banner/>)
- Week 2-4 of the semester: Drop from a full-term course by submitting a course drop form, available on the Office of Student Records and Registration's Online Forms (<https://my.csbsju.edu/pages/registrar-online-forms/>)page
- Week 5 – Seventeen (17) days before the end of classes: Withdraw from the full-term course with a grade of 'W' by submitting a course withdrawal form, available on the Office of Student Records and Registration's Online Forms (<https://my.csbsju.edu/pages/registrar-online-forms/>)page
- Last sixteen (16) days of class: If you withdraw from a course in the last 16 days for the course, your instructor will assign you an 'F' at the end of the semester, if appropriate

For courses scheduled for less than a full term, withdrawal during the first third of the course will result in no record entry; during the second third, a "W" entry; during the final third, a failure if appropriate.

Students who fail to properly drop or withdraw from a course may be subject to a failing grade.

INDIVIDUAL LEARNING PROJECTS (ILPs)

To register for an Individual Learning project (ILP) please complete the ILP application - <https://forms.csbsju.edu/registrar/ilp> (<https://forms.csbsju.edu/registrar/ilp/>)

- Only 4 credits of ILP per term are allowed
- First-year students are not eligible for ILPs
- You should indicate your intent for an ILP by registering on Banner Web Self Service. Use the CRN listed below or look for DNA in the course schedule.

PERMISSION REQUIRED CLASSES

Before attempting to register for courses listed as "Permission of Instructor or Department", students must obtain written permission by completing an override request form found on the Office of Student Records and Registration's Online Forms (<https://my.csbsju.edu/pages/registrar-online-forms/>)page

REPEATING COURSES

A course which has been failed may be repeated for credit. Courses which have been passed may not be repeated for credit. They may, however, be repeated for additional honor points. In the latter case, although the original grade is not removed from the transcript, it is the higher grade which is computed in the GPA. Credit for a course can be earned only once.

Coursework completed through AP, IB or PSEO may not be repeated at CSB/SJU for additional credit. If you choose to enroll in the equivalent course at CSB/SJU, the AP, IB or PSEO credits will be removed from your CSB/SJU transcript.

- **If you are registering for a course that you are repeating you must notify the Office of Student Records and Registration.**
- **Repeating a course in which a passing grade has already been earned may have financial aid implications.** For additional information, contact a Financial Aid Office. (<https://csbsju.starfishsolutions.com/starfish-ops/dl/instructor/serviceCatalog.html?bookmark=service/4202>)

SEARCH BY ATTRIBUTE/CURRICULUM DESIGNATIONS/SUBJECT/ETC

To search courses by Curriculum Designations/Attributes on Banner Web (Ways of Thinking, Themes, Engagements, etc.) using the Search tool in Banner Web Registration:

- Go to Banner Web Registration (select your school CSB (<https://registration.csbsju.edu/StudentRegistrationSsb/ssb/registration/?mepCode=B>)| SJU (<https://registration.csbsju.edu/StudentRegistrationSsb/ssb/registration/?mepCode=J>))
- Search for courses in either Plan Ahead, Register for Classes, or Browse for Classes.
 - Browse for classes is available to Faculty/Staff/Public to search course schedule.
- Select the term you wish to search from the drop-down menu then click continue
- Enter criteria you wish to search by:
 - Use Attribute Search to look for Integrations Requirements i.e. AR, QR, WR, BN, CI, CS, AS, AE, HE, SW, NW, TE, TI, Thematic Encounter, Thematic Focus, EX, GL, LI
 - Use Keyword Search to look for interdisciplinary course options i.e. CLIM, ENVR, GLHH, SCED, etc.
 - Enter a subject code to see courses offered for a specific subject area, i.e. BIOL, COMM, ENGL, SOCI, etc.
 - Use a course number to narrow your search further or to look for a specific course, for example enter BIOL in the Subject box then enter 201 in Course Number to only see results for BIOL 201.
 - Use the campus field to search for courses on a particular campus i.e. CSB, SJU, web based courses, embedded courses and full-term study abroad locations.
- Click on Search

Note - you can utilize the Advance Search option to search for a course in a Course Number Range such as 300 to 399 to find only Upper Division

Courses, to narrow your search to certain days of the week, or to find only open sections.

Faculty, Staff, or the public can use the search functions in Browse for Classes. Register for Classes is restricted to those with student status.

SUBSTITUTION

In exceptional circumstances and for appropriate reasons, students may petition for a substitution from specific academic regulations. Forms for requesting a substitution are available online:

- Major/Minor Substitution (<https://my.csbsju.edu/pages/registrar-online-forms/>)
- Students should first consult with their academic advisor. Department chairs are the approving officials for substitutions from requirements within majors and minors. Substitutions from academic regulations beyond major and minor fields (including common curriculum requirements) require the approval of the Academic Dean or the dean's designee. Requests for these non-departmental substitutions should be directed first to the Academic Advising Office.

The guiding principle in considering requests for any substitution is fidelity to the academic standards of the colleges.

TRI-COLLEGE EXCHANGE

Tri-College Exchange

Saint Benedict's, Saint John's and nearby St. Cloud State University have an agreement, since Fall 1973, designed to allow cross-registration for undergraduate courses on any of the three campuses by full-time students. Saint Benedict's and Saint John's students may register for courses offered in the St. Cloud State University course schedule provided they are registered for a minimum of 12 credits at Saint Benedict's and Saint John's. The request to take a course at St. Cloud State University is filed through the Office of Student Records and Registration. The Office of Student Records and Registration will determine whether space is available and confirm registration. Registration is limited to a maximum of one course each semester (1 class in Fall and 1 class Spring). The exchange program is not available during the summer term and is subject to change without notice or obligation.

Tuition and Fees

Students will be billed tuition and any fees (such as for laboratory or studio materials) at the rates prevailing at Saint Benedict's and Saint John's.

Transportation

Transportation to and from St. Cloud State University is the student's responsibility, for which the student must assume all obligation and risk.

Repeat Courses

It has been determined that repeating course through Tri-College Exchange of a course that was originally completed at St. Ben's and St. John's will not be allowed.

What if I enroll as a student at St. Cloud State?

Registration for Tri-College courses are on a space available basis, and a CSB or SJU student cannot reserve a space as a special student and later roll it over to the Tri-College Program. You have to decide before you register whether you want to enroll as a special student at SCSU and pay them tuition, or if you want to enroll as a Tri-College student and pay no additional tuition up to 18 credits at CSB and SJU.

Enrolling in a Tri College Exchange course:

The Tri-College application (<https://forms.csbsju.edu/registrar/tricollege/>) should be completed by the student the form can be found the Office of Student Records and Registration Online Forms page under special registration forms.

- Once the student submits the Tri-College Application, it must be approved by the student's regular academic advisor before it is submitted to the Office of Student Records and Registration.
- The Office of Student Records and Registration will determine whether space is available and confirm registration.
- Registration for Tri-College Exchange is limited to fall and spring semesters.

The exchange program is subject to change without notice or obligation. Students will be billed tuition and any fees (such as for laboratory or studio materials) at the rates prevailing at Saint Benedict's and Saint John's.

To change the credits on a variable credit course

1. While in student registration, click on "Schedule and Options" tab
2. Locate the course with variable credit
3. Click on the number in the "Hours" column, and enter new credit hours
4. Click "Submit" button at the bottom of the page

COMMON REGISTRATION CONCERNS

Your PIN # doesn't work

Solution: If you are unsure if you have a correct/valid registration pin, you can always verify your pin by attempting to log into class registration. If you attempt to login with an invalid registration PIN, you will get the following error message "Invalid alternate pin, please try again."

If you do not get this error message, re#check your PIN and carefully re#enter the PIN #. You may have to exit Self-Service completely and login again. Please note: the PIN # is not displayed (for security reasons) as you enter it on the computer.

You lost your PIN #

Solution: Contact your Faculty Advisor to get your Pin # again, or bring your Advisor's signature to the Office of Student Records and Registration. (PIN #'s cannot be obtained in the Computer Access Areas)

You entered the wrong CRN #

Solution: Search Self-Service and verify that you have the correct CRN # and try again. CRNs are unique and if you enter the wrong number you will not get the course you desire. CRNs can be found using the search feature in Self-Service Web Registration under Browse for Course and/or in Register for Classes.

You cannot add a course or make changes to your schedule

Solution: Self-Service allows you to make changes to your registration. Returning students without registration holds (<https://catalog.csbsju.edu/registration/instructions/registration/general/#guidetoregistrationholdstext>) should be able to access Self-Service and make changes. You may make changes online through Self-Service through the first week of the semester.

While using Self-Service it displays: "This session for your login has expired"

Solution: Self-Service is programmed to log off of the registration screen if you **leave the screen idle for more than 15 minutes**. If this should happen, simply sign on again.

Self-Service shows the status of a course as 'open' but it will not permit you to register for the course

Solution: You may not meet the prerequisites or restrictions for that course. Check the notes in the class schedule under that course or contact the Office of Student Records and Registration.

You cannot add a course or make changes to Plan Ahead

Solution: Returning students without registration holds (<https://catalog.csbsju.edu/pages/a-guide-to-student-holds/>) should be able to utilize the Plan Ahead Tool. If you have a registration hold, you will need to wait to make your plan in Banner Web Registration until you clear your hold.

REGISTRATION GLOSSARY

Guide to Registration Errors

At times, registration error messages may display in Banner Web Registration. Please see information in the following table for examples of registration error messages and what each error means.

Error Message	Definition
Closed Section	Enrollment is at the limit (no seats available). Register for a different section.
Corequisite (course) required.	These classes need to be taken together, ex: lecture and lab.
CRN ____ time conflict with CRN ____.	These sections have overlapping times. Look for a non-overlapping section.
Field of Study Restriction	Student is restricted from entering the course/section as they do not have the required field of study: a specific major/minor
Instructor Signature Required	Instructor permission required to join course. Instructors will notify Office of Student Records and Registration with a list of any students to add to course/section.
Living and Learning Community	Course is only available for members of a particular Living and Learning Community. Program director will notify Office of Student Records and Registration with a list of any students to add to course/section.
Prerequisite and Test Score error	Student hasn't met the necessary requirements to enroll in this course. This could be because they haven't completed a required class, or their test scores don't meet the minimum needed.
Reserve Closed	There are no seats available in a section unless student meets criteria for the remaining seats (i.e. a particular major or cohort, etc). Student should register for a different section or course. Go to https://catalog.csbsju.edu/registration/general/reserved-seats (https://catalog.csbsju.edu/registration/general/reserved-seats/) to review a detailed list of courses with reserved seats.
Special Form Required	Please complete required form, go to myCSBSJU and Office of Student Records and Registration's Online Forms.
Student attribute	Section is restricted to students with a specific attribute such as a specific cohort group

Time Ticket Error

Student's registration time is not open yet

Contact the Office of Student Records and Registration if you are getting an error message and you do not believe you should be receiving the error message or if you have questions.

If you cannot register for a different section or course and cannot resolve the error message, the Override Request (<https://apps.csbsju.edu/registrar/forms/override/>) form can be used to request access. Overrides are reviewed (and either approved or denied) by academic departments. Filling out an override request does not guarantee you enrollment in a course.

CREDIT OVERLOAD APPROVAL & FEES

A student is considered full-time if enrolled in 12 to 18 credits during the fall or spring semesters. If you plan to register for more than 18 credits, you are incurring an overload. Overloads may be attempted only by students in good academic standing with special approval of the Academic Advising Office.

2025-2026 Fees: The overload tuition fee will be billed at approximately \$1,568.00 per credit over 18 credits. GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The number of credits required for graduation is 124 with a grade point average of 2.00 in the major and minor fields and overall. Of these, at least 40 credits must be earned in upper-division courses. HOLDS

Holds are placed on students records and will prevent registration until the student must take proper action and work with appropriate departments to clear their holds. When holds are placed on a student's registration record, the student is contacted by email with information detailing why hold was placed and how to resolve their hold. All financial, academic, student accounts & health center (p. 23) holds (<https://my.csbsju.edu/pages/a-guide-to-student-holds/>) must be cleared before registering for classes. INCOMPLETE GRADE POLICY

When instructors determine that circumstances warrant, they may allow some delay in the completion of coursework. Such extensions may not extend beyond the last day of finals (close) of the following regular fall or spring semester. Earlier limits may be set at the discretion of the instructor.

Degree candidates are cautioned that failure to have all degree requirements satisfied (including removal of incomplete grades in courses needed for graduation) by the dates set by the Office of Student Records and Registration will necessarily postpone their graduation.

RESERVED SEATS

Some classes have a certain number of seats reserved for a group of student from a particular cohort or major, etc. Students may encounter a Reserve Closed (p. 23) error during registration. Detailed information is available for registering for courses with reserved seats (<https://catalog.csbsju.edu/registration/general/reserved-seats/>).

STUDENT TEACHING

- Tuition – students registering for student teaching (EDUC 360, 361, 362, 363) in their 9th (or greater) semester as a full-time student at CSB/SJU will be billed at ½ the regular tuition rate for that semester
- Fees – student teachers will also not be charged the student activity fee, technology fee, and campus center fee for that semester
- Financial Aid – institutional gift aid (scholarships/grants) will not be available to these students

STUDY ABROAD

CSB/SJU offer a number of group overseas study programs. Students who plan to enroll in one of these programs should contact the Center for Global Education, Clemens Library, A-101 at CSB.

External programs

- Students who are considering enrolling in coursework offered abroad by another institution (Consortium/ External Study Abroad) should contact the Center for Global Education or the Office of Student Records and Registration, for information on transfer of credits.
- Students who register for SA 372, Consortium/External Study Abroad, will be billed a \$300 fee.

Seniors studying abroad

- Seniors must ordinarily be in residence for the two semesters immediately preceding commencement (graduation).
- "In residence" is defined as enrollment as a full-time student at CSB/SJU for a minimum of 12 credits per semester.
- Any student wishing to register for an External Study Abroad Consortium during one of their two last semesters of their Senior year must receive approval from the Academic Advising Office.
- Seniors will **not** be allowed to register for a year-long External Study Abroad Consortium.

Through the Integrations Curriculum you will fulfill your general education requirements building on the skills and experiences you bring with you to CSB/SJU while exposing you to new topics, new perspectives and career possibilities you may not even know exist. You'll have a top-tier academic experience and be prepared for a rapidly changing world.

Foundational Courses

- College Success (INTG 105 College Success): Must be completed in the first year.
- Learning Foundations (INTG 100 Learning Foundations): Must be completed in the first year.
- Transfer Seminar (INTG 205 Transfer Seminar): 2 credits (required for transfer students, completed in their first semester at CSB and SJU)
- Cultural and Social Difference: Identity (CI designated course). Must be completed in the first year, can be taught in any department, and can count towards majors. May be 100 or 200 level.
- Theological Explorations (THEO 100 Theological Explorations) Course must be completed in the first 4 semesters.

Foundational Courses will not carry engagements, Quantitative Reasoning (QR,) or Ways of Thinking.

Ways of Thinking - Courses

Students will take 5 different Way of Thinking courses (4 credits in each Way of Thinking). Students cannot count more than 2 different Ways of Thinking in any 1 department. One course may carry 2 Ways of Thinking if the course is co-taught by 2 different instructors who applied for the course to carry 2 Ways of Thinking. These courses may be completed as part of a major or minor and you may complete up to two different Ways of Thinking within the same department. These courses may be completed as part of a major or minor.

- Abstract Structures (AS designation)
- Artistic Expression (AE designation)
- Human Experience (HE designation)
- Natural World (NW designation)
- Social World (SW designation)

Themes: 3 courses in either Justice, Movement, or Truth

Student must complete at least 3 different courses with the same theme (justice, movement, or truth) and only need to complete one theme. Students must complete themed courses in no fewer than two separate departments and courses may or may not have an associated way of thinking. Students must complete at least one thematic focus course with any combination of two other themed courses. (i.e., two Thematic Encounter at any level, one Thematic Encounter and one Thematic Focus, or two more Thematic Focus courses.) Students should complete

Learning Foundations and Cultural & Social Difference: Identity courses before taking a Thematic Focus course.

- Themed courses are either thematic *encounter* or thematic *focus* courses.
 - Thematic encounter courses have at least 25% of the course content and assignments dedicated to the theme.
 - Thematic focus courses have at least 50% of the course content and assignments focused on the theme.
- Thematic encounter and focus courses may be major or minor courses.
- To complete the themed course requirement: students will successfully complete 3 courses in the same theme, in at least 2 different departments, at least 1 of which is a thematic focus course.

Upper Level Coursework

- Theological Integrations (TI designation)
 - Course may carry engagements. Prerequisite: Theological Explorations
- Cultural and Social Difference: Systems (CS Designated Course)
 - Course may carry engagements. Prerequisite: Cultural and Social Difference: Identity
- Learning Integrations (INTG 300 Learning Integrations)
 - To be completed in one of the students last two semesters
 - Prerequisites:
 - Senior standing and a member of either the junior or senior cohort
 - Completion of THEO 100 Theological Explorations, CSD:I, INTG 100 Learning Foundations/INTG 205 Transfer Seminar
 - Completion of the themed course requirement
 - Theological Integration (TI) is a pre or co-requisite for enrollment in Learning Integrations
 - A Writing Designated course (WR) is a pre or co-requisite for enrollment in Learning Integrations

Global Language Proficiency

According to the goals of Integrations Curriculum, as globally engaged citizens, all students are required to demonstrate proficiency in a world language.

FINAL EXAMS

The academic calendar concludes each semester with a one-day study and three-day test cycle. Faculty may administer final exams, final projects or presentations for their classes only during the exam period officially scheduled by the Office of Student Records and Registration. Cumulative final examinations, projects or presentations, may not be given during regularly scheduled class days of the semester, except for night classes. If there is to be a cumulative final exam in a course, students must be given the opportunity to review all tested materials by the last scheduled class. The faculty member has the right to retain the tested materials.

Study day supports student preparation for the final exam period. Faculty or departments may offer study sessions to assist students in their preparation. Please do not schedule required activities on this day (no final exams, final projects or presentations).

Instructors of full-term courses are expected to announce at the beginning of the course whether a two-hour final examination, final project or presentation will be given. Such an exam will be administered during the three-day test cycle according to the schedule below. Classes are assigned a test time and day in the schedule according to the cycle and time period it meets during the semester. Night classes may use their last regularly scheduled class period for a final exam.

One period has been reserved on two test days for the administration of a common exam for multiple-section courses who so desire. A list of such courses, and their exam times, will be announced.

PROTOCOL FOR MAKE-UP OF FINAL EXAMS

If the Provost Office determines that final exams cannot be held due to weather or any other emergency situation, then the following protocol will be followed:

- If the entire day of final exams must be canceled, then that day of exams will be held the day after the last day of the regularly scheduled final exams. The exam times will remain the same on the extra exam day.
- If classes are canceled for any part of a regular exam day then those exams will be held the day after the last day of the regular final exams. The exam(s) will begin at 8:00 am on the extra exam day.
